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

RESOLUTION

CALLING FOR STRICTER IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10611, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE FOOD SAFETY ACT OF 2013, TO ENSURE THAT HUMAN HEALTH IS PROTECTED AND MARKET ACCESS OF LOCALLY PRODUCED FOODS AND FOOD PRODUCTS IS FACILITATED

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10611, otherwise known as the Food Safety Act of 2013 was enacted in 23 August 2013 to promote the right of the people to health and keep its populace from threat of trade malpractices and substandard and hazardous products;

WHEREAS, the Food Safety Act primarily aims to strengthen the food safety regulatory system in the country by protecting the public from food-borne and water-borne illnesses and unsanitary, unwholesome, misbranded, or adulterated foods;

WHEREAS, African swine fever (ASF) is a highly contagious viral disease that affects pigs, warthogs, and boars. It causes pigs to have high fever and lose their appetite. It also causes hemorrhages in the skin and internal organs;

WHEREAS, in early September of 2019, the Department of Agriculture confirmed that ASF is present in several areas in the country and has caused hog deaths;

WHEREAS, the disease threatens the P260-billion swine industry in the Philippines and this industry provides livelihood for millions of Filipino families, as small backyard raisers comprise roughly two-thirds or 65% of the industry;

WHEREAS, adequate safety nets and protocol are in place by virtue of RA 10611 to effectively prevent the proliferation of infected meat and meat products;

WHEREAS, it is imperative that implementation of standards set by RA 10611 is ensured so that infection will be prevented and possible propagation of the disease be halted at once;

WHEREAS, the local swine industry is at risk of perish if inappropriate response to the crisis is not ended: Now, Therefore be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, as it is hereby resolved to call for stricter implantation of the provisions of Republic Act No 10611, otherwise known as the Food Safety Act of 2013, to ensure that human health is protected and market access of locally-produced foods and food products is facilitated.
