RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHING THE SENATE INSTITUTE ON LEGISLATIVE STUDIES AND TRAINING CENTER TO BE KNOWN AS THE SENATE INSTITUTE FOR THE CONTINUING EDUCATION, STUDIES, RESEARCH AND TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR THE MEMBERS OF THE SENATE, ITS OFFICERS AND STAFF, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Senate of the Philippines to establish, implement, maintain, and support an integrated system of continuing education, studies, research and training programs that would enhance the institution's individual and collective standards, which are critical in fulfilling the inherent functions the Senate is constitutionally mandated to perform;

WHEREAS, it has been a compelling vision of the Senate to set in 7 motion efforts toward the establishment of a legislative institute that 8 would provide continuing research, studies and training support to the 9 members of the Senate in their duties on lawmaking, contemporary 10 governance, and other functions, and adequately prepare the staff and 11 personnel of the Senate in delivering efficient and effective services that 12 would bring the Senate closer to the people by imparting to them the 13 intricacies and dynamics of lawmaking and the role of the Senate in 14 nation-building; 15

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WHEREAS, to realize this, the Senate Institute is hereby
 established as the Senate's training arm on legislation, governance,
 research, and inter-parliamentary relations;

4 WHEREAS, the objectives of the Senate Institute shall be as 5 follows:

(a) To strengthen the Senate as a premier legislative institution that
promotes good governance, encourages policy research and informationsharing, and advocates transparency;

(b) To advance the work of legislators and the role of Congress
vis-à-vis the expectations of the people, enhance public knowledge, and
encourage active public participation in legislation and governance;

(c) To develop expertise on research and legislative policy studies
and enhance the capability of those who are engaged in legislative work,
as well as those who are interested in it;

(d) To serve as a linkage to other government agencies, local
governments, professional circles, student and youth organizations,
academe and training centers, and other local and foreign legislative
assemblies, on matters relating to its functions;

(e) To offer quality-oriented capacity building for the Senate, its staff and other local government leaders who desire to avail of the training programs which will aid them in the analysis of the principles and techniques of legislative drafting in relation to local and national legislation; and

(f) To provide a venue for young Filipinos to learn more of the
 workings of a representative democracy and inspire them to pursue
 careers in legislation and policy advocacies;

WHEREAS, the Senate Institute shall avail of the services and expertise of former and incumbent members of Congress, Senate officers and staff who are knowledgeable and/or experts in legislation and policymaking considering their extensive works, studies and

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trainings, as well as guest lecturers and experts from the country andabroad;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved by the Senate of the Philippines, to establish the Senate Institute on Legislative Studies and Training Center to be known as the Senate Institute for the continuing education, studies, research and training programs for the members of the Senate, its officers and staff;

RESOLVED, FURTHER, That the Senate Secretary, assisted by a Board of Advisers to be chosen by the members of the Senate, shall exercise administrative control and supervision in the formulation and implementation of continuing education, studies, research, and training programs, and provide direction on the Senate Institute's curriculum and operation;

RESOLVED, FURTHERMORE, That a secretariat of the Senate Institute shall be composed of a Director General and such other personnel as may be necessary to be appointed by the Senate President. *Provided*, That the Senate President shall designate an interim secretariat from among the officers and staff of the Senate, who shall serve for a period of not more than one (1) year from the adoption of this resolution;

RESOLVED, FINALLY, That the initial funding for the first year of program implementation shall be set aside by the Senate President chargeable against existing savings; and funds for the continuing implementation of the program shall be included in the appropriations of the Senate of the Philippines in the General Appropriations Act.
