## AN ACT CREATING THE NATIONAL ROAD SAFETY UNIT (NRSU) UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The Philippine Road Safety Action Plan (PRSAP) is part of our government's efforts to address road safety issues that continue to be a major concern in the country. The PRSAP has five (5) pillars, which altogether seek to achieve a safer road environment. These 5 pillars are: (1) improve road safety management, (2) safer road, (3) safer vehicles, (4) safer road users, and (5) improve trauma care and rehabilitation. Moreover, the PRSAP is anchored on the idea that road safety is a shared responsibility.

This bill seeks to create the National Road Safety Unit (NRSU) as an attached agency to the Department of Transportation to ensure the implementation of the PRSAP. This is an attempt to address the need for a more focused, mandated and adequately-managed road safety unit. This unit will be dedicated for the effective implementation of the PRSAP.

In the past, an Inter-agency Road Safety Committee has been created to promote road safety, to coordinate the review and enforcement of various measures on road safety and to formulate polices, programs and plans to further improve road safety. This bill is a bid to re-institutionalize a dedicated office for the purpose of ensuring that road safety issues are addressed.

For the attainment of our vision towards zero traffic deaths, immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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# AN ACT CREATING THE NATIONAL ROAD SAFETY UNIT (NRSU) UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "National Road Safety Unit Act of 2019."

Sec. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* – It is the duty of the State to promulgate policies that will ensure a safe, viable and dependable road safety system in the country in order to protect the welfare of the general public.

Sec. 3. Creation of the National Road Safety Unit (NRSU) – The National Road Safety Unit (NRSU) is hereby created to oversee the planning, development, and implementation of the Philippine Road Safety Action Plan (Plan) and all other existing road safety plans and programs. This Unit shall be an attached agency of the Department of Transportation.

The NRSU shall be the national focal point for road safety and shall be responsible for the coordination and execution of all functions related to plan formulation, strategy-making, policy-setting, project development, promotion and communications, and impact assessment of the activities included in various road safety initiatives.

6	a) Organize and document the undertakings of the NRSU; and
7	b) Coordinate with all stakeholders working on road safety initiatives.

9	a) Perform such necessary activities to facilitate and ensure the
10	successful implementation of road safety projects.
11	Sec. 5. Organization of the NRSU. – The NRSU shall be organized and staffed
12	in such a way that its functions and responsibilities are fulfilled and effectively carried
13	out.
14	The NRSU's organizational structure and staffing plan, including qualification
15	standards and terms of employment, shall be prepared by the DoTr Undersecretary
16	for Road and approved by the Secretary, subject to existing rules and regulations.
17	Sec. 6. Funding. – The amount necessary for the initial operational
18	requirements of the NRSU shall be sourced as follows: (1) Road Safety Fund, (2)
19	General Appropriations Act, and (3) such other external sources subject to the existing
20	accounting and auditing laws, and other applicable rules and regulations.
21	Sec. 7. Separability Clause. If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid or
22	unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall
23	remain valid and subsisting.
24	Sec. 8. Repealing Clause. – All laws, presidential decrees or issuances,
25	executive orders, letter of instructions, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary
26	to, or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or
27	amended accordingly.
28	Sec. 9. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
