AN ACT ESTABLISHING TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (TESDA) TRAINING AND ASSESSMENT CENTERS IN THE MUNICIPALITIES OF MAGDIWANG IN SIBUYAN ISLAND, AND ODIONGAN IN TABLAS ISLAND, PROVINCE OF ROMBLON, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as
 the "Magdiwang and Odiongan, Romblon TESDA Training and
 Assessment Centers Act".

SEC. 2. Establishment. - There are hereby established 4 5 Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) Training and Assessment Centers in the municipalities of 6 Magdiwang in Sibuyan Island and Odiongan in Tablas Island, 7 Province of Romblon, under the supervision of the TESDA. 8 The Centers shall be known individually as the Magdiwang, 9 Sibuyan Island Training and Assessment Center, and the 10 Odiongan, Tablas Island Training and Assessment Center. 11

1 They shall be established in highly accessible location in the 2 municipalities of Magdiwang and Odiongan, Province of Romblon, 3 pursuant to the purposes of this Act and to the mutual agreement 4 between the TESDA and the concerned local government units 5 (LGUs).

SEC. 3. General Mandate. - The Magdiwang, Sibuyan Island 6 and Odiongan, Tablas Island, Romblon Training and Assessment 7 8 Centers, hereinafter referred to as the Centers, shall primarily 9 provide technical-vocational education and training (TVET) 10 programs to students and local residents from low-income families and out-of-school youths, including persons with disabilities and 11 indigenous peoples, in the island municipalities of Magdiwang 12 and Odiongan and the adjacent island localities in Sibuyan 13 and Tablas Islands and the other islet-municipalities of the 14 Province of Romblon, to help them become productive, self-reliant 15 16 and globally competitive labor assets.

17 The Centers shall offer training programs on relevant 18 skills trade competencies, craftsmanship, and entrepreneurship 19 activities needed to deliver the effective employment interventions 20 that will hasten the development of the host areas and the 21 adjacent island localities in the Province of Romblon into human 22 resource and productivity hubs.

The Centers shall each serve as TESDA-accredited Assessment Center for acquired competencies in TVET programs in the Province of Romblon. They shall, respectively, provide teachers' training and curriculum design assistance to the secondary schools offering the technical-vocational livelihood

(TVL) track under the K to 12 Program in coordination with
 the Department of Education (DepEd) and the TESDA.

3 SEC. 4. Training Programs. - The Centers shall offer short-term certificate courses and modular trainings in preferred 4 5 technical-vocational skills and trades specialization. To this end, 6 the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), Department 7 of Trade and Industry (DTI), Department of Science and Technology (DOST), Department of Agriculture (DA), Department 8 9 of the Interior and Local Government (DILG). National Economic 10 and Development Authority (NEDA), business-industry partners. 11 and other relevant agencies and instrumentalities, both local 12 and international, shall provide the necessary assistance to enable 13 the Centers to develop skilled manpower to achieve a robust and 14 inclusive economy in the host areas and adjacent localities.

15 The Centers may establish research and technology 16 hubs, technology development farms, satellite or extension training centers, and promote mobile training programs to 17 18 strengthen linkages among the industry partners, the academe, 19 and the Centers geared towards the acquisition of practical 20 livelihood. employable skills. gainful employment, and 21 entrepreneurship in priority areas in the municipalities of 22 Magdiwang and Odiongan, and the adjacent island and islet 23 localities in Sibuyan and Tablas Islands of the Province of 24 Romblon.

The Centers shall offer the following TVET programs
with competencies assessment leading to National Certification
Levels I-III:

1 (a) Skills training in industrial technology and hard 2 trades such as metal and steelwork, machine fabrication and 3 operation, heavy equipment operation, automotive mechanic, 4 refrigeration and air conditioning, electronics, and operation of 5 power tools and equipment for both medium skills grade and 6 industrial purposes;

7 (b) Agriculture and aquaculture-related trainings and skills 8 development in such areas as farming technology, fishing operations technology, backyard farming and home-based 9 aquaculture and propagation innovations, mechanized farm, 10 11 fishing tools and equipment operation, agribusiness, agri-aqua 12 trade technology and innovations, and relevant farmers 13 and fisherfolk's trainings for increased productivity and 14 entrepreneurship:

15 (c) Livelihood skills development courses for preferred 16 skills employment and small-scale entrepreneurship, including 17 practical skills education in arts and crafts, workmanship 18 and design, high-speed sewing, dressmaking and tailoring, 19 horticulture, livestock raising and breeding, food processing 20 technology, home technology, culinary arts and commercial 21 cooking, cosmetology, and health and wellness training;

22 (d) Basic business literacy training in financial 23 management, marketing, practical accountancy, bookkeeping, 24 office procedures, business processes and application procedures, 25 including registration, licensing, documentation, business patent 26 and intellectual property regulation, business financing and 27 investment opportunities sourcing, import-export accreditation,

online home-based business operation, and use of social media
 business marketing;

3 (e) Technical-vocational occupation and trades skills such 4 as carpentry, masonry, plumbing, welding, practical electricity 5 and installation, automotive servicing, electronics servicing, 6 personal computer (PC) servicing, and such other relevant 7 practical skills courses;

8 (f) Computer literacy and information technology
9 (IT)-related skills, digital technology, web design, animation,
10 photoshop/online photography, computer design and advertising;

(g) Social communication skills and language proficiency
courses in English and other languages for business process
outsourcing (call center) employment and overseas job placement;

(h) Seminars on personality development, career counseling,job placement, and work ethic and values; and

(i) Other preferred skills and trades training that may be
needed by the people of the municipalities of Magdiwang and
Odiongan, and the adjacent island and islet localities in
Sibuyan and Tablas Islands of the Province of Romblon
to enhance their capacities for practical livelihood, gainful
employment, and entrepreneurial activities.

22 SEC. 5. Compliance with TESDA Requirements. – The 23 provisions of this Act notwithstanding, the Centers shall 24 become operational only upon the determination and certification 25 by the TESDA, through the issuance of a formal recommendation 26 and certificate of compliance, that the Centers have individually 27 and satisfactorily complied with the minimum requirements for

quality standards prescribed by the TESDA governing the following 1 2 competency assessment:

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(a) Standard procedures and guidelines (SPGs) for the establishment and operation of a Center:

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(b) Operational sustainability of the Centers, in terms of 6 licensed faculty-trainers and personnel, equipment, training 7 and laboratory facilities, instructional materials, and other standard requirements of a Center: 8

9 (c) Sustainable funding source and allocation of the 10 budgetary requirement;

11 (d) Assurance that the training programs offered are fully aligned with the minimum standards of competency-based quality 12 13 technical-vocational skills technology and the needs of the host 14 areas and adjacent communities served in the context of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Integration and 15 the Philippine Qualifications Framework (PQF) for TVET; and 16

17 (e) Compliance with such other TESDA conditionalities and 18 standards, as may be necessary and applicable in establishing 19 a Center.

Administration. - The Centers shall each be 20 SEC. 6. 21 headed by a Technical-Vocational Administrator, under the supervision of the TESDA, who shall render full-time service 22 23 and be responsible for the Centers' respective administration 24 and operation.

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The Technical-Vocational Administrator shall be appointed by the TESDA Director General in accordance with the rules 26

and regulations of the Civil Service Commission and the
 qualification requirements for such office.

The Technical-Vocational Administrator shall enter into agreements with locally based private and public counterpart agencies or instrumentalities and persons, subject to the approval of the TESDA Director General, for such assistance as may be necessary to effectively implement this Act.

8 SEC. 7. Appropriations. - The Director General of the 9 TESDA shall include in the Authority's program the operation 10 of the Centers, the funding of which shall be included in the 11 annual General Appropriations Act.

12 The LGUs concerned, in consultation with the TESDA, 13 shall set aside from any available local revenue an amount 14 deemed appropriate as annual counterpart fund to support the 15 operation of the Centers herein established.

16 SEC. 8. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - Within 17 ninety (90) days after the approval of this Act, the TESDA shall, 18 in coordination with the DOLE, DTI, DOST, DA, Department 19 of Budget and Management, DILG, NEDA, concerned LGUs, 20 and such other relevant agencies and industry-business partners 21 of the host localities, prepare and issue the necessary rules 22 and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.

SEC. 9. Separability Clause. - If, for any reason, any
 section or provision of this Act shall be deemed unconstitutional
 or invalid, the other sections or provisions hereof shall not be
 affected and shall remain in force and in effect.

SEC. 10. Repealing Clause. - All laws, executive orders,
 decrees, instructions, rules and regulations contrary to or
 inconsistent with any provision of this Act are hereby repealed or
 amended accordingly.

5 SEC. 11. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) 6 days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper 7 of general circulation.
