# AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 2 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10868, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE CENTENARIANS ACT OF 2016 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

The country owes a big part of its development to its elderly population, the Senior Citizens, who, during their youth and even thereafter, have made meaningful contributions to our nation. As one of the vulnerable sectors of society, Article XIII, Sec. 11 of the 1987 Constitution guarantees preferential treatment to them, affording "priority for the needs of the underprivileged sick, elderly, disabled, women, and children. The State shall endeavor to provide free medical care to paupers".

At present, we are confronted with an undeniable reality that the country is moving towards an aging population with a declining life expectancy and shorter life span for our citizens. According to the World Health Organization's statistics published in 2018, the average person residing in the Philippines has a lifespan of 69.3 years. This average shows that we are three years shorter than the global average of age 72. More dramatic is the shorter lifespan for Filipino men which is 66.2 years compared to the worldwide average of 69.2 years. Women residing in the Philippines typically outlive men with an average age of 72.6 while the global benchmark is 74.2 years for females. As such, it is already a blessing if our countrymen manage to survive to become octogenarians, much less centenarians.

## AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 2 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10868, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE CENTENARIANS ACT OF 2016 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled.

- SECTION 1. Sec. 2 of Republic Act No. 10868, otherwise known as Centenarians Act of 2016, is hereby amended to read, as follows:
- "Sec. 2. Letter of Felicitation and Cash Gift. All Filipinos who reach the age of
  EIGHTY (80) YEARS OLD, NINETY (90) YEARS OLD, AND one hundred
  (100) years old, whether residing in the Philippines or abroad, shall be honoured
  with:
- [ (a) A Letter of Felicitation from the President of the Philippines congratulating the celebrant for his or her longevity; and ]
- [b] (a) A [Centenarian] CASH Gift in the amount of TEN THOUSAND

  PESOS (\*\*10,000.00\*) UPON REACHING THE AGE OF EIGHTY (80)

  YEARS OLD, THIRTY THOUSAND PESOS (\*\*30,000.00\*) UPON

  REACHING THE AGE OF NINETY (90) YEARS OLD, and [one hundred]

  SIXTY thousand pesos (\*\*60,000.00\*) UPON REACHING THE AGE OF ONE

  HUNDRED (100) YEARS OLD.

1	PROVIDED, THAT ALL QUALIFIED FILIPINOS WHO HAVE
2	REACHED THE AGE OF EIGHTY (80) YEARS OLD AND NINETY (90)
3	YEARS OLD PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVITY OF THIS ACT SHALL
4	RECEIVE THE TOTAL CASH GIFT/S CORRESPONDING THERETO; AND

- B) A LETTER OF FELICITATION FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES CONGRATULATING THE CELEBRANT UPON REACHING THE AGE OF ONE HUNDRED (100) YEARS OLD FOR HIS OR HER LONGEVITY.
- 9 Sec. 2. Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules and 10 regulations and other issuances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of 11 this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
- Sec. 3. *Effectivity Clause*. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
