

RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEES, TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE EFFECTS OF NOVEL CORONAVIRUS ACUTE RESPIRATORY DISEASE (2019-nCoV ARD) INTERNATIONAL HEALTH EMERGENCY ON THE PHILIPPINE TOURISM SECTOR, WITH THE END IN VIEW OF RECOMMENDING A TOURISM MITIGATION AND RESPONSE PLAN ADDRESSING THE EFFECTS OF HEALTH EMERGENCIES, CALAMITIES AND CATASTROPHES

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the novel coronavirus acute respiratory disease (2019-nCoV ARD) health event as a public health emergency of international concern¹;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Government, upon the recommendation of the Department of Health (DOH), has issued a temporary travel ban covering all travellers coming from Hubei Province of China. The DOH will also be recommending the expansion of the travel ban coverage to more Chinese provinces as new information on the increasing number of cases per region arises²;

WHEREAS, the country's tourism sector is regarded as likely to be affected by the 2019-nCoV ARD international health emergency³;

WHEREAS, according to Socioeconomic Planning Secretary Ernesto M. Pernia, there would likely be a "short-term effect" on tourism even as there were already "a lot of measures being done to minimize" infections among Filipinos⁴;

WHEREAS, in 2018, the contribution of tourism industries to the Philippine economy was estimated at $12.7\%^5$;

WHEREAS, in a statement released by the United Nations World Tourism Organization (UNWTO), they said that during times of crisis, tourism has to live up to its responsibility as an integral part of wider society. The sector must put people and their wellbeing first⁶;

WHEREAS, the UNWTO also stated that tourism is vulnerable to the effects of public health emergencies and is already being affected by this outbreak. However, it is too early to fully estimate the impacts this outbreak will have⁷;

WHEREAS, it is high time that the Philippines have a long-term and short-term tourism mitigation and response plan addressing the effects of health emergencies, calamities, and catastrophes, such as the 2019-nCoV ARD international public health emergency;

BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to direct the appropriate Senate Committees, to conduct an inquiry in aid of legislation, on the effects of the novel coronavirus acute respiratory disease (2019-nCoV ARD) international health emergency on the Philippine tourism sector of the country, with the end in view of recommending a tourism mitigation and response plan addressing the effects of health emergencies, calamities, and catastrophes.
