AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE OFFICE OF FLOOD RESEARCH AND POLICY TO PLAN, COORDINATE, CONDUCT, AND SHARE RESEARCH ON FLOODING, FLOOD PREVENTION, AND OTHER FLOOD-RELATED ISSUES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article II, Section 15 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides:

"The State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them."

Article II, Section 16 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides:

"The State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature."

The Philippines is a tropical country that faces an average of 20 typhoons per year. The strong winds and heavy rainfalls brought about by these typhoons have brought destruction to our countrymen. Countless lives have been lost, damage to properties have accumulated, and in addition flash floods have hit major roads making them impassable that cause worsening traffic.

The proposed bill seeks the establishment of a centralized effort to further study the effects of flooding and how to prepare and respond to catastrophes.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "National Flood

Research and Education Act."

Sec. 2. Office of Flood Research and Policy. – There is hereby established within the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) an Office of Flood Research and Policy (OFRP), which shall be headed by a Director.

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- Sec. 3. Duties. The Director of the OFRP shall:
- (A) Make recommendations and identify best practices for predicting, preventing, and minimizing flooding and its effects, in accordance with Section 4;
 - (B) Submit to Congress an annual report, in accordance with Section 6; and
 - (C) Establish and maintain a page on the public NDRRMC website, in accordance with Section 6.

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- Sec. 4. Best Practices. The Director, in consultation with the NDRRMC, taking into consideration the regional differences in hydrology, weather, geography, economy, and population density across the country, shall develop recommendations and identify best practices for predicting, preventing, and minimizing flooding and its effects, including:

 (A) Risk-assessment tools, methods, and models;

 (B) Strategies and techniques for monitoring and predicting flooding;
 - (C) Strategies and techniques for flood management and prevention;
 - (D) Adoption and use of relevant technologies;
 - (E) National, regional, and local flood policies; and
 - (F) Coordination and cooperation among government agencies and local governments regarding flood-related efforts.

Sec. 5. Grants to Institutions of Higher Education. – The OFRP may extend research grants to institutions of higher education to conduct research on flooding, flood prevention, and other flood related issues. The OFRP shall ensure that the said grants are used for their designated purpose.

Sec. 6. *Report.* – The Director shall submit to Congress an annual report on the activities of the OFRP.

The OFRP shall establish and maintain a page within the public NDRRMC website in which it shall publish the recommendations and best practices described in Section 4 and the annual report as provided in this section. The OFRP shall also provide the local government units (LGUs) versions of the report which particularly applies to them.

Sec. 7. *Appropriations.* – To carry out the provisions of this Act, such amount is as necessary is hereby authorized to be appropriated from the National Treasury.

Sec. 8. Separability Clause. – If any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Sec. 9. Repealing Clause. – All laws, decrees, orders, rules, and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

Sec. 10. *Effectivity Clause*. – This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) days following its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
