**AN ACT MANDATING ALL BARANGAYS TO CREATE A
REGISTRY OF SKILLED WORKERS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**


EXPLANATORY NOTE

Registries are developed at the community, state, regional, national, and even at international level as they provide an effective and efficient method for handling multiple types of data. In most cases, registries serve as a quick reference in identifying currently available human resources within a specific area.

This bill seeks the creation of the Barangay Skilled Workers Registry, which shall serve as a repository of information voluntarily declared by the skilled workers for every barangay. The registry shall contain relevant details such as names, addresses, contact information, professional certifications such as TESDA National Certificate/s, among others.

The registry shall be made readily available to provide information to the different household and/or non-household consumers within the barangay in need of the services of skilled workers.

In our hope to maximize opportunities for both skilled workers and members of the community, the passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in
Congress Assembled:*

SECTION 1. *Short Title.* – This Act shall be known as “The Barangay Skilled
Workers Registry Act.”

SECTION 2. *Definition of Terms.* – As used in this Act:

- (a) *Barangay* refers to the smallest political unit into which cities and municipalities
in the Philippines are divided in accordance with the provisions of the Local
Government Code of the Philippines.
- (b) *Skilled workers* shall refer to persons who regularly perform jobs that cater to
household needs which usually involve the use of physical strength or skills such
as plumbers, carpenters and electricians. The skilled workers referred hereto
shall in no case be limited to holders of national certificates issued by the
Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA).
- (c) *Barangay Skilled Workers Registry* refers to the database of a particular
barangay containing the names of all skilled workers residing therein who
voluntarily registered and declared their qualifications and skills.

SEC. 3. *The Barangay Skilled Workers Registry* – Every barangay shall create and
make public a registry that will serve as a database for all skilled workers who voluntarily
register in order to offer their services in the locality. The skilled workers must be residents
of the barangay where they seek to be registered.

It shall be the responsibility of each barangay to disseminate information as to the
mechanics, requirements and qualifications needed for registration.

SEC. 4. *Contents of the Registry.* – The Barangay Skilled Workers registry shall
contain the following details:

- (a) Name of the skilled worker;
- (b) Address;
- (c) Contact Details;
- (d) Nature of the services offered;
- (e) Proof of qualifications (i.e. TESDA National Certificate (NC), Certificate of Competency (COC), or any other certificate of training or seminars attended);
- (f) Photocopy of Philippine Identification Card (Philippine ID) pursuant to Republic Act No. 11055. If the registration is made during the pendency of the implementation of Republic Act No. 1105, the applicant shall submit photocopies of two (2) government issued identification cards. This is without prejudice to the submission of the said copy of the Philippine ID immediately upon availability
- (g) NBI Clearance; and
- (h) Any other details which the barangay deems necessary.

SEC. 5. Access to the Registry. – The barangay shall make the registry available to the public by posting a copy at the barangay’s bulletin board or at a conspicuous place within the barangay hall. It may also be simultaneously accessed by the public online should the barangay have its own website.

Any person may obtain or request a copy of the registry in whole or in part by submitting a request in the form prescribed by the barangay. The barangay officer or employee having custody over the registry shall act on the request immediately upon receipt of the same.

SEC. 6. Prohibition on Collection of Registration Fees. – The inclusion of a skilled worker’s name and corresponding details in the registry shall be free of charge. However, the constituents who request for a copy of the database may be charged a reasonable fee to cover the actual cost of printing or reproducing the details subject of the request.

SEC. 7. Annual Updating of the Registry. - The barangay shall update the registry of skilled workers at the beginning of every year. This is without prejudice to the right of the skilled workers to request the barangay to immediately include and reflect any significant change/s in any of the information mentioned under Section 4 of this Act.

SEC. 8. Separability Clause. – If any provision of this Act or any part thereof be declared unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the other provisions of this Act.

SEC. 9. Repealing Clause. – All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SEC. 10. Effectivity. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
