AN ACT

AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8972 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR BENEFITS AND PRIVILEGES TO SOLO PARENTS AND THEIR CHILDREN, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	Section 1. Section 1 of Republic Act No. 8972 otherwise known as "An Act
2	Providing for Benefits and Privileges to Solo Parents and Their Children, Appropriating
3	Funds Therefor and for Other Purposes" is amended to read as follows:
4	"Section 1. Title. – This Act shall be known as the "EXPANDED
5	Solo Parents Welfare Act of [2000] 2020 ."
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7	Sec. 2. Section 2 of Republic Act No. 8972 is amended to read as follows:
8	"Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy It is the policy of the State to
9	promote the family as the foundation of the nation, strengthen its
10	solidarity and ensure its total development. IT IS ALSO THE
11	OBLIGATION OF THE STATE TO ADHERE TO INTERNATIONAL
12	AGREEMENTS AND NATIONAL LAWS ON FAMILIES. Towards this

end, it shall develop a comprehensive [program of] PACKAGE OF 1 2 SOCIAL PROTECTION services for solo parents and their children to be carried out by the Department of Social Welfare and Development 3 (DSWD), the Department of Health (DOH), THE DEPARTMENT OF 4 5 JUSTICE (DOJ), the Department of Education F, Culture and Sports (DECS)] (DEPED), the Department of the Interior and Local Government 6 (DILG), the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), the Technical 7 Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), the National 8 Housing Authority (NHA), the Department of Labor and Employment 9 10 (DOLE), THE DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY (DTI), THE BUREAU OF INTERNAL REVENUE (BIR), THE CIVIL SERVICE 11 12 COMMISSION (CSC), THE NATIONAL **ECONOMIC** AND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY 13 (NEDA), THE PHILIPPINE COMMISSION ON WOMEN (PCW), THE PHILIPPINE HEALTH 14 15 INSURANCE CORPORATION (PHILHEALTH), THE UNION OF LOCAL AUTHORITIES OF THE PHILIPPINES (ULAP), and other 16 17 [related] CONCERNED government [and nongovernment] agencies [.] AND CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANIZATIONS WITH RECOGNIZED 18 CREDENTIALS IN PROVIDING SERVICES AND ADVOCACY FOR 19 20 **SOLO PARENTS."**

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Sec. 3. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 8972 is amended to read as follows:

23 "Sec. 3. *Definition of Terms.* – Whenever used in this Act, the
24 following terms shall mean as follows:

(a) "Solo parent" - any individual who falls under any of the following
categories:

(1) A [woman] FEMALE who gives birth as a result of rape and other
 crimes against [chastity] PERSONS even without A final conviction of the
 offender: *Provided,* That the mother [keeps and raises the child] HAS
 THE CUSTODY OF THE CHILD OR CHILDREN AND BEARS THE

1 SOLE PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY: (2) Parent left solo [of] OR alone with the responsibility of parenthood 2 3 due to [death of spouse] THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES: i. DEATH OF THE SPOUSE; 4 ii. F(3) Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of 5 6 parenthood while the [s]Spouse is detained or is serving sentence for a 7 criminal conviction [for at least one (1) year]; 8 iii. {(4) Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of 9 parenthood due to] [p]Physical and/or mental incapacity of spouse as 10 certified by a public **OR PRIVATE** medical practitioner: iv. {(5) Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of 11 parenthood due to [1] Legal separation or *de facto* separation from 12 spouse [for at least one (1) year, as long as he/she is entrusted with the 13 custody of the children]; 14 v. [(6) Parent-left-solo or alone-with the responsibility of 15 parenthood due to] [d]Declaration of nullity or annulment of marriage as 16 decreed by [a] THE court RECOGNIZED BY LAW [or by a church as 17 long as he/she is entrusted with the custody of the children]; OR 18 vi. [(7) Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of 19 parenthood due to] [a]Abandonment of spouse for at least [one (1) year] 20 SIX (6) MONTHS. 21 22 (3) [(8)] Unmarried mother/father who has [preferred to keep and rear] ACTUAL CUSTODY, SUPPORT, CARE AND EXERCISING SOLE 23 PARENTAL AUTHORITY OVER [her/his] HIS OR HER child[/children] 24 25 **OR CHILDREN** instead of having others care for them or give them up to 26 a welfare institution: (4) SPOUSE OF AN OVERSEAS FILIPINO WORKER (OFW); 27 28 PROVIDED, THAT THE SAID OFW BELONGS TO THE LOW/SEMI-SKILLED WORKER CATEGORY AND IS AWAY FROM THE 29 PHILIPPINES FOR AN UNBROKEN PERIOD OF TWELVE (12) 30

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1 MONTHS;

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(5) [(9)] Any other person who [solely provides parental care and
support to a child or children] BEARS SOLE PARENTAL
RESPONSIBILITY OVER A CHILD OR CHILDREN, INCLUDING A
FOSTER PARENT DULY-RECOGNIZED BY THE DSWD, A LEGAL
GUARDIAN APPOINTED BY THE COURT OR A LEGAL SINGLE
ADOPTIVE PARENT; OR

(6) [(10)] Any family member who [assumes the] BEARS SOLE 8 **PARENTAL** responsibility [of head of family] as a result of the death, 9 abandonment, disappearance or prolonged absence of the parent[s]/S. 10 [or solo parent.] IN CASES OF GRANDPARENTS WHO ARE SENIOR 11 CITIZENS WHO HAVE THE SOLE PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY 12 PHYSICALLY MENTALLY OVER THEIR MINOR OR OR 13 INCAPACITATED CHILDREN OR GRANDCHILDREN, THEY SHALL 14 BE ENTITLED TO THE BENEFITS OF THIS ACT IN ADDITION TO 15 THE BENEFITS GRANTED TO THEM BY REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9257 16 OR THE "EXPANDED SENIOR CITIZENS ACT OF 2003"; 17

A change in the status or circumstance of the parent, **QUALIFIED FAMILY MEMBER OR GUARDIAN** claiming benefits under this Act, such that he/she is no longer left alone with the responsibility of parenthood, shall terminate his/her eligibility for these benefits.

THE ABSENCE OF A VALID AND LEGAL MARRIAGE BETWEEN THE 22 MOTHER AND FATHER OF A CHILD OR DEPENDENT DOES NOT 23 AUTOMATICALLY ENTITLE EITHER INDIVIDUAL TO BENEFITS 24 UNDER THIS ACT IF THE FACTUAL CIRCUMSTANCES 25 DEMONSTRATE PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITIES ARE 26 THAT 27 SHARED.

(b) "Children OR DEPENDENTS" - FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ACT,
refer to those living with and dependent upon the solo parent for support
who are unmarried, unemployed and not more than [eighteen (18)]

1 **TWENTY-TWO (22)** years of age, or even over [eighteen (18)] 2 **TWENTY-TWO (22)** years but are incapable of self-support because of 3 mental and/or physical defect/disability.

4 (c) "Parental responsibility" - with respect to their minor children shall
5 refer to the rights and duties of the parents as defined in Article 220 of
6 Executive Order No. 209, as amended, otherwise known as the "Family
7 Code of the Philippines."

(d) "Parental leave" - shall mean leave benefits granted to a solo parent to
 enable him/her to perform parental duties and responsibilities where
 physical presence is required. ALL SOLO PARENTS WORKING IN THE
 GOVERNMENT OR PRIVATE SECTOR SHALL BE QUALIFIED TO A
 SEVEN-DAY PARENTAL LEAVE WITH PAY.

- (e) "Flexible work schedule" is the right granted to a solo parent
 employee to vary his/her arrival and departure time without affecting the
 core work hours as defined by the employer.
- (F) BASIC NECESSITIES REFER TO RICE, CORN, BREAD, FRESH, 16 DRIED AND CANNED FISH AND OTHER MARINE PRODUCTS, 17 FRESH PORK, BEEF AND POULTRY, MEAT, FRESH EGGS, FRESH 18 19 AND PROCESSED MILK, FRESH VEGETABLES, ROOT CROPS, COFFEE, SUGAR, COOKING OIL, SALT, LAUNDRY 20 SOAP, DETERGENTS, SANITARY NAPKINS, DIAPERS, DRUGS 21 CLASSIFIED AS ESSENTIAL BY THE DOH, AND 22 **OTHER** COMMODITIES AS MAYBE CLASSIFIED BY THE DTI AND THE 23 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (DA) ACCORDING TO REPUBLIC 24 ACT NO. 7581 OR THE "PRICE ACT." 25
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27 Sec. 4. Section 4 of Republic Act No. 8972 is amended to read as follows:

28 "Sec. 4. *Criteria for [Support] ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL* 29 *ASSISTANCE*. – Any solo parent whose income in the place of [domicile]
 30 **RESIDENCE** falls below the poverty threshold as set by the [National

Economic and Development Authority (NEDA)] 1 PHILIPPINE 2 STATISTICS AUTHORITY (PSA) and subject to the assessment of the **DSWD** worker] LOCAL SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT 3 4 OFFICER in the area WHERE THE SOLO PARENT RESIDES shall be eligible for ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL assistance RESERVED FOR THE 5 POOR AND INDIGENT SOLO PARENTS AS DETERMINED BY THE 6 7 PROPER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES: Provided, Induced, Induced, Induced, Induced, Induced, Induced and America Ame solo parent whose income is above the poverty threshold shall enjoy the 8 9 benefits mentioned in Sections 6, 7 and 8 of this Act.] THAT ANY SOLO 10 PARENT, REGARDLESS OF THE INCOME BRACKET OR FINANCIAL **STATUS** SHALL 11 **ENJOY** THE BENEFITS UNDER THE **COMPREHENSIVE PACKAGE OF SOCIAL PROTECTION SERVICES,** 12 SUCH AS, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, LIVELIHOOD OPPORTUNITIES, 13 LEGAL ADVICE AND ASSISTANCE, COUNSELLING SERVICES, 14 PARENT EFFECTIVENESS SERVICES, CRITICAL 15 INCIDENCE 16 STRESS DEBRIEFING AND OTHER SOCIAL PROJECTS **MENTIONED IN SECTION 5 OF THIS ACT."** 17

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Sec. 5. Section 5 of Republic Act No. 8972 is amended to read as follows:

20 "Sec. 5. Comprehensive Package of Social IDevelopment and 21 Welfare] PROTECTION Services. - A comprehensive package of social 22 [development and welfare] **PROTECTION** services for solo parents and 23 their families [will] SHALL be developed by the DSWD, DOH, [DECS] DEPED, CHED, TESDA, DOLE, NHA [and] DOJ, DTI, BIR, CSC, NEDA, 24 25 PCW, PHILHEALTH, ULAP, DILG, [in coordination with local 26 government units and a nongovernmental organization with proven track 27 record in providing services for solo parents.] AND OTHER 28 CONCERNED GOVERNMENT AGENCIES AND CIVIL SOCIETY 29 ORGANIZATION WITH RECOGNIZED CREDENTIALS IN **PROVIDING SERVICES TO SOLO PARENTS.** 30

The DSWD shall coordinate with concerned agencies the implementation of the comprehensive package of social [development and welfare] **PROTECTION** services for solo parents and their families. The package will initially include:

(a) Livelihood development services which include trainings on livelihood
skills, basic business management, value orientation and the provision of
seed capital or job placement[-];

8 (b) Counseling services which include individual, peer-group or family
 9 counseling. This will focus on the resolution of personal relationship and
 10 role conflicts[-];

(c) Parent effectiveness services which include the provision and
 expansion of knowledge and skills for the solo parent on early childhood
 development, behavior management, health care, rights and duties of
 parents and children[-];

(d) Critical incidence stress debriefing which include preventive stress
 management strategy designed to assist solo parents in coping with crisis
 situations and cases of abuse[-];

(e) Special projects for individuals in need of protection which include
 temporary shelter, counseling, legal assistance, medical care, self-concept
 or ego-building, crisis management and spiritual enrichment[-]; AND

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(F) LEGAL ADVICE AND ASSISTANCE."

23 Sec. 6. Section 7 of Republic Act No. 8972 is amended to read as follows:

24 "Sec. 7. Work Discrimination. - No employer shall discriminate 25 against any solo parent employee with respect to terms and conditions of 26 employment on account of his/her status. EMPLOYERS MAY ENTER 27 INTO AGREEMENTS WITH THEIR **EMPLOYEES** FOR 28 TELECOMMUTING PROGRAM, AS PROVIDED IN REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11165, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE 'TELECOMMUTING ACT', 29

PROVIDED THAT SOLO PARENTS SHALL BE GIVEN PRIORITY BY THEIR EMPLOYER."

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Sec. 7. A new section 8 is hereby inserted to read as follows:

5 "SEC. 8. ACCESS TO CHILD CARE. _ NATIONAL **GOVERNMENT AGENCIES WITH MORE THAN THREE HUNDRED** 6 7 (300) EMPLOYEES, INCLUDING GOVERNMENT-OWNED AND 8 CONTROLLED CORPORATIONS (GOCCS), PRIVATE AND 9 EMPLOYERS WITH TWO HUNDRED (200) OR MORE EMPLOYEES, SHALL ESTABLISH DAY CARE CENTERS TO ACCOMMODATE THE 10 CHILDREN OF THEIR EMPLOYEES AGED FIVE (5) YEARS AND 11 BELOW, WHICH SHALL BE AVAILABLE FOR FREE TO ITS 12 EMPLOYEES, WITH PRIORITY FOR THOSE WHO ARE SOLO 13 PARENTS AS DEFINED UNDER THIS ACT. THESE SERVICES SHALL 14 BE PROVIDED WITHIN THE WORKPLACE, AS 15 MUCH AS POSSIBLE, OR IN A NEARBY ACCESSIBLE LOCATION." 16

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Sec. 8. Section 8 of Republic Act No. 8972 is hereby amended to read as follows: 18 "Sec. [8] 9. Parental Leave. – In addition to leave privileges under existing laws, parental leave of not more than seven (7) working days every year shall be granted to any solo parent employee who has rendered service of at least [one (1) year] SIX (6) MONTHS. THIS 22 BENEFIT MAY BE AVAILED IN BOTH THE GOVERNMENT OR 23 24 PRIVATE SECTOR, REGARDLESS OF EMPLOYMENT STATUS."

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26 Sec. 9. Section 9 of Republic Act No. 8972 is hereby amended to read as follows: "Sec. [9] 10. Educational Benefits. – The [DECS] DEPED, CHED 27 and TESDA shall provide the following benefits and privileges: 28 29 (1) Scholarship **AND**/ **OR GRANTS** [programs] for qualified solo parents and their children in institutions of basic, [tertiary and technical/skills 30

1	education] HIGHER AND TECHNICAL/ VOCATIONAL EDUCATION
2	AND TRAINING; and
3	(2) Nonformal education programs appropriate for solo parents and their
4	children.
5	The [DECS] DEPED, CHED and TESDA shall promulgate rules and
6	regulations for the proper implementation of this program."
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8	Sec. 10. Section 10 of Republic Act No. 8972 is hereby amended to read as
9	follows:
10	"Sec. [10] 11 . <i>Housing Benefits.</i> – Solo parents shall be given
11	PREFERENCE AND allocation in housing projects and shall be provided
12	with liberal terms of payment on said government low-cost housing
13	projects in accordance with housing law provisions prioritizing applicants
14	below the poverty line as declared by the [NEDA] PSA."
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16	Sec. 11. Sections 11 and 12 of Republic Act No. 8972 are hereby renumbered as
17	Sections 12 and 13, respectively.
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19	Sec. 12. A new section 14 is hereby inserted to read as follows:
20	"SEC. 14. SOLO PARENT IDENTIFICATION CARD (SPIC). ~
21	THE LOCAL SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT OFFICE
22	(LSWDO) SHALL ISSUE THE SOLO PARENT IDENTIFICATION
23	CARD UPON THE PRESENTATION OF THE APPLICANT OF THE
24	FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS:
25	A. BARANGAY CERTIFICATION THAT THE SOLO PARENT IS A
26	RESIDENT OF THE BARANGAY FOR THE LAST SIX (6) MONTHS

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THE SPIC SHALL BE ISSUED WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS FROM APPLICATION THEREOF AND SHALL BE VALID FOR ONE (1) YEAR UPON ISSUANCE, SUBJECT TO RENEWAL."

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Sec. 13. A new Section 15 is hereby inserted to read as follows:

11 "SEC. 15. ADDITIONAL BENEFITS. - A SOLO PARENT SHALL
 12 BE ENTITLED TO THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL BENEFITS:

A) TWENTY PERCENT (20%) DISCOUNT FROM ALL PURCHASES
OF INFANT FORMULA, FOOD, FOOD SUPPLEMENTS AND
SANITARY DIAPERS FOR PURCHASES MADE FROM CHILD'S
BIRTH UNTIL THREE (3) YEARS OF AGE: *PROVIDED*, THAT THE
DISCOUNT ON INFANT FORMULA CAN ONLY BE AVAILED OF
WHEN THE SOLO PARENT IS NOT THE MOTHER;

C) TWENTY PERCENT (20%) DISCOUNT FROM ALL PURCHASES
OF MEDICINES, VACCINES AND OTHER MEDICAL SUPPLEMENTS,
SUPPLIES, ACCESSORIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE CHILD, AS
PRESCRIBED BY A LICENSED MEDICAL PRACTITIONER, FOR
PURCHASES MADE FROM THE CHILD'S BIRTH UNTIL TWENTY
TWO (22) YEARS OF AGE;

25D) TWENTY PERCENT (20%) DISCOUNT FROM ALL PURCHASES26OF THE CHILD'S BASIC NECESSITIES;

E) TWENTY PERCENT (20%) DISCOUNT FROM TUITION FEES
 PER CHILD FROM KINDERGARTEN TO COLLEGE LEVEL IN BOTH
 PRIVATE AND PUBLIC COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES AND
 SCHOOLS, ON TOP OF ANY SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS IF ANY;

F) TWENTY PERCENT (20%) DISCOUNT FROM HOSPITAL BILL OF
 THE SOLO PARENT'S CHILD IF ADMITTED FOR MEDICAL CARE
 AND ATTENTION, BOTH IN PRIVATE AND PUBLIC HOSPITALS;

4G) TAX AMNESTY AND/OR REDUCTION OF REAL ESTATE OR5INHERITANCE TAXES OF SOLO PARENTS;

H) TWENTY PERCENT (20%) DISCOUNT ON CONSULTATION AND
LABORATORY DIAGNOSTIC FEES AND PURCHASE OF MEDICINES
FOR SOLO PARENTS AND THEIR CHILDREN;

9 I) BASIC PERSONAL EXEMPTION FROM INDIVIDUAL INCOME
10 TAX IN THE AMOUNT OF FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (P50,000.00)
11 IN ADDITION TO THE EXISTING EXEMPTION THAT THE SOLO
12 PARENT MAY CLAIM FOR THEIR CHILDREN;

13 J) TWENTY PERCENT (20%) DISCOUNT FROM ALL PRIVATE AND PUBLIC RECREATIONAL FACILITIES: PROVIDED, THAT THE 14 DISCOUNT CAN ONLY BE AVAILED WHEN THE SOLO PARENT AND 15 CHILDREN ARE TOGETHER. COMPANIES AND BUSINESS 16 ESTABLISHMENTS, WHERE THE SAID DISCOUNTS WERE 17 18 AVAILED, SHALL BE ENTITILED TO CLAIM SAID DISCOUNTS AS PART OF THEIR BUSINESS EXPENSE: PROVIDED, THAT THEY 19 MAINTAIN A DETAILED AND SEPARATE RECORDS OF THE 20 **DISCOUNTED PURCHASES."** 21

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23 Sec. 14. A new Section 16 is hereby inserted to read as follows:

24 "SEC. 16. CREATION OF THE SOLO PARENTS INTER25 AGENCY REVIEW COMMITTEE. – THE SOLO PARENTS INTER26 AGENCY REVIEW COMMITTEE IS HEREBY CREATED TO
27 COORDINATE AND MONITOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS
28 ACT. THE COMMITTEE SHALL BE COMPRISED OF THE
29 FOLLOWING AGENCIES:

30 A) DSWD, AS CHAIR;

1	B) DILG, AS CO-CHAIR;
2	C) DOH;
3	D) DOJ;
4	E) DEPED;
5	F) CHED;
6	G) TESDA;

- 15THE COMMITTEE SHALL SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE16CONGRESS ON THE STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS ACT,17FOLLOWING ITS EFFECTIVITY."
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Sec. 15. A new Section 17 is hereby inserted to read as follows:

20 "SEC. 17. SOLO PARENTS AFFAIRS OFFICE. – A SOLO
21 PARENT AFFAIRS OFFICE SHALL BE ESTABLISHED IN EVERY
22 LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT. IN LINE WITH THIS REQUIREMENT,
23 A SOLO PARENTS HELP DESK SHALL BE PLACED IN EVERY
24 BARANGAY FOR THE IMMEDIATE ASSISTANCE TO SOLO
25 PARENTS AND THEIR CHILDREN."

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Sec. 16. A new Section 18 is hereby inserted to read as follows:

28 "SEC. 18. NATIONAL SOLO PARENTS DAY AND WEEK. – TO
 29 COMMEMORATE THE ROLE AND SIGNIFICANCE OF EVERY SOLO
 30 PARENT IN THE PHILIPPINES, THE THIRD WEEK AND THIRD

SATURDAY OF APRIL OF EVERY YEAR ARE HEREBY DECLARED AS SOLO PARENTS WEEK AND NATIONAL SOLO PARENTS DAY, RESPECTIVELY."

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Sec. 17. A new Section 19 is hereby inserted to read as follows:

6 "SEC. 19. PENALTIES. – ANY PERSON, CORPORATION,
7 ENTITY OR AGENCY WHICH REFUSES OR FAILS TO PROVIDE THE
8 BENEFITS GRANTED TO SOLO PARENTS IN VIOLATION OF THIS
9 ACT, OR DISCRIMINATES AGAINST SOLO PARENTS IN
10 EMPLOYMENT HIRING, SHALL SUFFER THE FOLLOWING
11 PENALTIES:

1) FOR THE FIRST VIOLATION - A FINE OF NOT LESS THAN TEN
 THOUSAND PESOS (P10,000.00) BUT NOT MORE THAN FIFTY
