RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE AGRICULTURAL COMPETITIVENESS ENHANCEMENT FUND- SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM CREATED THROUGH REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8178, AND FURTHER THE **AGRICULTURAL** 10848 OR REPUBLIC ACT **EXTENDED** BY TARIFFICATION ACT WITH THE END VIEW OF DETERMINING THE EFFICIENCY OF THE LEAD IMPLEMENTING AGENCY AS WELL AS IN DETERMINING WHETHER THE FUND IS UTILIZED FOR THE INTENDED **PURPOSES SET BY THE LAW.**

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 1084, or the Agricultural Tariffication Act was 1 enacted and approved by the President of the Philippines on 23 May 2016 to make 2 the country's agricultural sector viable, efficient, and globally competitive; 3

WHEREAS, the Agricultural Tariffication Act, in order to help the agricultural sector compete globally, provides necessary support services such as, funding for a comprehensive and attractive grant-in-aid program for agriculture, forestry, fisheries, and veterinary medicine education;

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Agricultural Tariffication Act earmarks ten (10%) of the Agricultural Competitiveness Enhancement Fund to be used to support a maximum of ten (10) scholars per campus taking agriculture, forestry, fisheries, and veterinary medicine education;

WHEREAS, since 2018 many student beneficiaries have complained that they have yet to receive the benefit under the Agricultural Competitiveness Enhancement Fund, in particular, the subsidies to cover the tuition, stipend, and book allowances;

WHEREAS, since 2018 several letters have been sent to the Department of Agriculture through former Secretary Emmanuel Piñol and then Undersecretary Ranibai D. Dilangalen, Usec. for Special Concerns, and again in 2019, to Secretary William Dar, requesting for update, but to this date, no formal reply have been received;

WHEREAS, the complaints from student beneficiaries not receiving the benefits under the Agricultural Competitiveness Enhancement Fund are not isolated, since the complainants come from different state universities, Sultan Kudarat State University in Sultan Kudarat Province, Western Mindanao State University in Zamboanga City, and Cagayan State University- Appari Campus, to name a few;

WHEREAS, the lead implementing agency have been remised in performing its duties considering that so much time has elapsed in order for them to act on their obligation to the student beneficiaries in particular, and the agricultural sector in general;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved by the Senate to direct the appropriate Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the implementation of the Agricultural Competitiveness Enhancement Fund- Scholarship Program, with the end view of determining the efficiency of the lead implementing agency in the implementation as well as in determining whether the fund was utilized for the intended purposes set by the law.
