

CODE OF 1997, AS AMENDED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**


**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Article XIII, Section 1 of the 1987 Constitution provides that, "*The Congress shall give highest priority to the enactment of measures that protect and enhance the right of all the people to human dignity, reduce social, economic, and political inequalities, and remove cultural inequities by equitably diffusing wealth and political power for the common good.*"

In 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared a global health emergency and an outbreak of the novel coronavirus (nCoV), later on named as Corona virus 2019 (COVID-19), which was first reported in Wuhan, China on 31 December 2019. After careful assessment by the WHO, COVID-19 was declared a pandemic on 11 March 2020. "*Pandemic*" is known as the worldwide spread of disease while, an "*epidemic*" is the occurrence in a community or region of cases of an illness, specific health-related behavior, or other health-related events clearly in excess of normal expectancy.

The COVID-19 pandemic has already caused over 218,000 cases worldwide and 9,177 deaths. In the Philippines, as of 20 March 2020, there are 230 cases and 18 deaths. In the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic and the declaration of an "*Enhanced Community Quarantine*" by President Rodrigo Duterte, the Filipinos way of life are severely hampered since majority of business operations are suspended, including jobs, and many are on a "*No Work, No Pay*" policy.

In order to address the needs of the Filipinos, especially the underprivileged and those in the vulnerable sector, this bill seeks to provide unconditional cash transfer to households gravely affected by the effects of epidemic or pandemic crisis thereby providing financial, health, and food assistance for a period of three (3) consecutive years from its occurrence. Thus, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

**AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 288 OF THE NATIONAL INTERNAL REVENUE  
CODE OF 1997, AS AMENDED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in  
Congress assembled:*

1 SECTION 1. *Short Title.* – This Act shall be known as the “*Financial, Health, and*  
2 *Food Assistance in Times of Epidemic and Pandemic Crisis Act.*”

3 Sec. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* – It is hereby declared the policy of the State to  
4 give highest priority to the enactment of measures that protect and enhance the right  
5 of all the people to human dignity, reduce social, economic, and political inequalities  
6 by equitably diffusing wealth and political power for the common good. In this end,  
7 unconditional cash transfers shall be provided to households gravely affected by  
8 epidemic and pandemic crisis to provide financial, health, and food assistance thereby,  
9 aiding the people in times of dire need.

10 Sec. 3. Sec. 288 of the National Internal Revenue Code (NIRC) of 1997, as  
11 amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

12 "Sec. 288. Disposition of Incremental Revenue – x x x

18 "(F) Incremental Revenues from the Tax Reform for Acceleration and Inclusion  
19 (TRAIN). - For five (5) years from the effectivity of this Act, the yearly

4 "(c) A social welfare and benefits program where qualified beneficiaries shall  
5 be provided with a social benefits card to avail of the following social benefits:

6 "(i) Unconditional cash transfer to households in the first to seventh income  
7 deciles of the National Household Targeting System for Poverty Reduction  
8 (NHTS-PR), Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program, and the social pension  
9 program for a period of three (3) years from the effectivity of this Act:  
10 Provided, That the unconditional cash transfer shall be Two hundred pesos  
11 (₱200.00) per month for the first year and Three hundred pesos (₱300.00)  
12 per month for the second year and third-year, to be implemented by the  
13 Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD);

14 **(ii) UNCONDITIONAL CASH TRANSFER TO HOUSEHOLDS GRAVELY**  
15 **AFFECTED BY THE EFFECTS OF EPIDEMIC OR PANDEMIC CRISIS TO**  
16 **PROVIDE FINANCIAL, HEALTH, AND FOOD ASSISTANCE TO**  
17 **FILIPINOS ESPECIALLY THE UNDERPRIVILEGED AND VULNERABLE**  
18 **SECTORS, FOR A PERIOD OF THREE (3) CONSECUTIVE YEARS FROM**  
19 **ITS OCCURRENCE: PROVIDED, THAT THE UNCONDITIONAL CASH**  
20 **TRANSFER SHALL BE THREE HUNDRED PESOS (₱300.00) OR IN**  
21 **KIND PER MONTH WHICH SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED BY THE DSWD**  
22 **AND SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS ACT**  
23 **(GAA): PROVIDED, FURTHER THAT SUCH HOUSEHOLDS SHALL BE**  
24 **DETERMINED IN ACCORDANCE TO THE QUALIFICATIONS WHICH**  
25 **SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT, IN**  
26 **CONSULTATION WITH THE DSWD;**

28 Sec. 4. Section 288 of the NIRC of 1997, as amended, shall be renumbered  
29 accordingly.

30 *Sec. 5. Implementing Rules and Regulations.* - The concerned departments and  
31 agencies shall issue the implementing rules and regulations for this Act within sixty  
32 (60) days after the approval of this Act.

1            *Sec. 5. Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations or  
2 other issuances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby  
3 repealed or modified accordingly.

4            *Sec. 6. Separability Clause.* – If any portion or provision of this Act is declared  
5 unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provision not affected thereby shall  
6 remain in force and effect.

7            *Sec. 7. Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) days following  
8 the completion of its publication either in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of  
9 general circulation in the Philippines.
