ESTABLISHING A NATIONAL ECONOMIC DECENTRALIZATION PLAN TO FACILITATE FURTHER GROWTH IN ALL REGIONS OF THE PHILIPPINES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article XII Section 1 of the Constitution states that, "The goals of the national economy are a more equitable distribution of opportunities, income, and wealth; a sustained increase in the amount of goods and services produced by the nation for the benefit of the people; and an expanding productivity as the key to raising the quality of life for all, especially the underprivileged." Further, it provides, "In the pursuit of these goals, all sectors of the economy and all regions of the country shall be given optimum opportunity to develop."

It is therefore imperative upon the national government to set up and maintain an economic infrastructure that will guarantee the development not only of its capital city and its neighboring provinces, but *all* of the regions, including the remote communities and the countryside.

Unfortunately, certain indicators show that economic activities are heavily concentrated in the National Capital Region (NCR). In fact, a lion's share (36%) of the national Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for 2018 comes from NCR. Meanwhile, Region IVA (CALABARZON) and Region III (Central Luzon) contribute 17% and 9.8%, respectively to the GDP.¹ Together, the three regions alone contribute to more

than 60% of the country's GDP. Moreover, 20.36% of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) are located in the NCR. The capital region, together with CALABARZON, Central Luzon, Central Visayas, and Western Visayas, (i.e. five regions out of seventeen) accounts for 60% of the total number of MSMEs in the country in 2018. ⁱⁱ

On a related note, NCR, Region III, and Region IVA reported the lowest poverty incidence rates among population for 2018.ⁱⁱⁱ

This proposed measure seeks to assist the poorer regions in attaining inclusive and sustained economic growth through a National Economic Decentralization Plan which will explore and implement strategies geared towards industrial relocation and creation of new urban centers. Also, the bill seeks to bring outside Metro Manila quality health care and learning facilities through the creation of specialty hospitals similar to the Philippine Heart Center, Lung Center of the Philippines, and the like across the country, and the establishment of Regional Centers of Excellence for education and skills development.

In this light, the immediate approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT

ESTABLISHING A NATIONAL ECONOMIC DECENTRALIZATION PLAN TO FACILITATE FURTHER GROWTH IN ALL REGIONS OF THE PHILIPPINES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representative of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "The Progressibong
 Pilipinas Para sa Lahat ng Pilipino Act".

Sec. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* – It is a policy of the State to ensure the equitable distribution of wealth and opportunity to each Filipino through good governance in conjunction with consistent national policies, coordinated regional strategies and a clear blueprint towards a progressive Philippines for every Filipino.

Sec. 3. *Philippine Decentralization Committee.* – There is hereby created a
Philippine Decentralization Committee (PDC) to be chaired by the Executive
Secretary with the following members:

10 (a) Secretary of the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH);

11 (b) Secretary of the Department of Finance (DOF);

12 (c) Secretary of the Department of Budget and Management (DBM);

- 13 (d) Secretary of the Department of Transportation (DOTr);
- (e) Director General of the National Economic and Development Authority
 (NEDA);
- 16 (f) Representative from the League of Governors;

1 (g) Representative from the League of Cities; and

(h) Experts from the private sector and the academe in the following, but not
 limited to, fields of expertise: urban planning and management, supply
 chain management, and agri-business, and industrial growth.

Sec. 4. *Philippine Decentralization Plan (PDP).* – The PDC shall formulate a 5year midterm, and a 10-year long-term plan within the One Hundred Eighty (180)
days from the effectivity of this Act, containing the following:

8 (a) Comprehensive studies focusing on the challenges and opportunities for
 9 regional economic development;

(b) Proposals on infrastructure and human capital investments in order to
 create economic opportunities across the regions based on their
 geography, natural resources, human resources, economic profile,
 technology, culture and traditions, among others;

(c) Assessment of possible relocation sites for industries and enterprises
 outside Metro Manila and provision of incentives and benefits therefor.

Philippine Healthcare Development Program. - There is hereby Sec. 5. 16 established a Philippine Healthcare Development Program, which provides for an 17 integrated and comprehensive approach to health development by ensuring 18 adequate health facilities to support the improvement and sustainability of the 19 healthcare system with the goal of providing effective and affordable services for the 20 entire Philippine population and improving health outcomes. The program shall also 21 provide for the establishment of specialty hospitals within Northern and Southern 22 Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao similar to those currently existing in Metro Manila such 23 as the Philippine Heart Center, Lung Center of the Philippines, National Kidney and 24 Transplant Institute, and Philippine Orthopedic Center. 25

Sec. 6. *Regional Centers for Excellence Development Program.* – There is hereby established Regional Centers for Excellence Development Program, which provides assured funding in the amount of 100 Billion Philippine Pesos (Php 100 Billion) for the establishment and development of Regional Centers for Excellence outside of Metro Manila focusing on education and skills development to be determined by the Secretary of the Department of Education (DepEd), the

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Chairperson of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), and the Director
 General of the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA).

3 Sec. 7. *Decentralization of Procurement Procedures for Major Projects.* For 4 major projects located in areas outside Metro Manila, bidding and procurement 5 mechanisms must be established to allow the aforementioned procedures to take 6 place in the region/s involved.

Sec. 8. *Provision of Tax Incentives for Industries Located Outside NCR.* With
 purposes of attracting investments and dispersing industries to all regions outside
 NCR, the DOF shall be responsible for providing appropriate incentives to locators
 and investors who situate or relocate their businesses or enterprises outside Metro
 Manila.

Sec. 9. *Appropriation and Period of Implementation.* The PDP under this Act shall be implemented over a period of ten (10) years. Within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, and every year thereafter, the President, upon the recommendation of the PDC, shall prepare the list of specific priority programs, projects and activities that need to be funded for the year, and submit the same to Congress for its consideration and approval in a joint resolution of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

The annual appropriations for the PDP shall be included in the National 19 Expenditure Program which reflects the amounts necessary to support the funding 20 requirements for all programs, activities and projects approved by Congress under 21 the preceding paragraph. The funds to be appropriated by Congress under this Act 22 shall be treated as a distinct and separate budget item from the regular 23 appropriation of the implementing agencies and shall be administered by the heads 24 thereof. For the next five (5) years there shall be a periodic review of funding 25 requirements to determine the need for adjustments as necessary. 26

The PDC shall have an initial funding of 100 Million Philippine pesos (Php 100 Million) to conduct a comprehensive study referred to in Section 4 of this Act.

Sec. 10. *Annual Reports.* The PDC shall coordinate with the relevant national government agencies and local government units and prepare a consolidated progress report of the implementation of all priority programs, projects and activities funded under this Act.

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1 Within the first quarter of the succeeding year, the PDC shall submit an 2 annual report to the Office of the President, the Senate, and the House of 3 Representatives. Such report shall be made available to the public for scrutiny, 4 copying, and reproduction, and shall also be uploaded in the PDC's website.

Sec. 11. Congressional Oversight Committee. There is hereby created a 5 Congressional Oversight Committee to monitor and oversee the implementation of 6 the provisions of this Act. The Committee shall be composed of six (6) members 7 from the Senate and six (6) members from the House of Representatives with the 8 Chairpersons of the Committee on Economic Affairs of the Senate and the House of 9 Representatives as joint Chairpersons of this Committee. The five (5) other members 10 from each Chamber are to be designated by the Senate President and the Speaker 11 of the House of Representatives, respectively. The minority shall be entitled to pro 12 rata representation but shall have at least (2) representatives from each Chamber. 13

Sec. 12. *Separability Clause.* – If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision or part not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

Sec. 13. *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule, or regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

21 Sec. 14. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 22 publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
