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

RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE GOVERNMENT'S POLICY REQUIRING RETURNING OFWS TO UNDERGO MANDATORY QUARANTINE AND TEST FOR COVID-19 WITH THE END IN VIEW OF PROVIDING IMMEDIATE ASSISTANCE TO RETURNING OFWS AND ADOPTING STRATEGIES TO COPE WITH THE MASS REPATRIATION OF OFWS

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11469 or the Bayanihan to Heal as One Act was enacted to ensure the government's swift response to mitigate the adverse effects of the Coronavirus disease (COVID-19), including the immediate mobilization of assistance to sectors affected by the imposition of community quarantine;

WHEREAS, pursuant to guidelines issued by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF) and Department Memorandum No. 2020-0200 issued by the Department of Health (DOH) dated May 01, 2020¹, all returning Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) are required to undergo 14-day mandatory quarantine and COVID-19 testing procedures upon arrival in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, based on existing guidelines, the cost of quarantine accommodations shall be shouldered by: (1) the Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA) for land-based OFWs and (2) the local manning agency and/or Maritime Industry Authority for sea-based OFWs²;

WHEREAS, at present, the cost of COVID-19 test is covered by the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth);

WHEREAS, according to a news report, OFWs were being charged P3,000 for a COVID-19 test with the amount deducted from their PhilHealth accounts³;

WHEREAS, it was reported that a number of OFWs have gone to social media to complain that they have been stuck in quarantine facilities for months because of the delayed release of tests results and clearances⁴;

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WHEREAS, according to Presidential Peace Adviser and National Task Force COVID-19 Chief Implementer, Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr., more than 27,000 repatriated OFWs are undergoing quarantine in various facilities in Metro Manila and the expected arrival of some 42,000 more returning OFWs could overwhelm the country's quarantine facilities⁵;

WHEREAS, the Philippine News Agency has reported that, as of May 14, 2020, there were 32,264 repatriates from 362 vessels, 22,903 or 71 percent of whom have completed their respective quarantine. Of the 8,130 land-based repatriates, 7,446 or 92 percent are still in quarantine⁶;

WHEREAS, it was reported that the government expects 44,000 OFWs to come home this June, while 150,000 to 500,000 overseas workers are estimated to return to the Philippines for the rest of the year⁷;

WHEREAS, in a study conducted on the possible economic impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic to OFWs, about 300,000 to 400,000 OFWs will be affected by lay-offs and salary cuts worldwide⁸;

WHEREAS, there is a need for the government to review its existing policy on mandatory quarantine and testing of returning OFWs for COVID-19 to: (1) expedite the processing and release of COVID-19 test results of returning OFWs so they can go home to their families as soon as possible, (2) free up quarantine facilities for the next batch of OFWs expected to arrive in the coming months and (3) adopt strategies to cope with the mass repatriation of OFWs including the determination of necessary costs to cover quarantine and COVID-19 tests of returning OFWs;

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Senate to look into this matter to ensure the swift delivery of aid and services to OFWs in times of global crisis, such as the current COVID-19 pandemic;
