## AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE NATIONAL POLICE CLEARANCE SYSTEM, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

CRIME PREVENTION and police services should always be responsive to the needs of the society. Old methods should be replaced and upgraded to ensure efficiency and effectiveness.

At present, our local police databases are not integrated. A person's police clearance varies across different police stations covering their respective jurisdiction. He may have a police clearance without annotation from one locality but might appear to be one of the persons alleged to have committed a crime in another. Clearly, a police clearance which is usually required by employers can easily be manipulated. A suspect or a criminal has the liberty to obtain a police clearance from a locality within which he knows he has a clean record. This should not be allowed.

To address this issue, there is a need to use information and communications technology to modernize the law enforcement tools of the Philippine National Police.


By maximizing the available technology, we can provide a more effective and efficient service to the public.

With the aid of modern technology, the proposed bill seeks to establish and institutionalize a National Police Clearance System (NPCS). The NPCS will consolidate and connect information into a centralized police clearance database. It is geared towards a centralized crime-related record checking nationwide which will result to a standardized and streamlined police clearance application, convenient online application portal and an integrated PNP's crime-related database.

In view of the foregoing, I earnestly seek the passage of this bill.

# Introduced by SENATOR RONALD "BATO" DELA ROSA

### AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE NATIONAL POLICE CLEARANCE SYSTEM, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in
 Congress assembled.

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4 SECTION 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "National Police 5 Clearance System Act".

6 Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is hereby declared the policy of the State to 7 ensure public safety thru a highly efficient, effective, competent and modernized 8 police force and the use of information and communications technology. Furthermore, 9 the State shall improve efficiency in the delivery of service by reducing bureaucratic 10 red tape and preventing corruption while ensuring the protection of the fundamental 11 human right of privacy.

Sec. 3. National Police Clearance System. – The National Police Clearance System (NPCS) is hereby established. The Philippine National Police shall be the primary government agency responsible for the implementation of the NPCS.

Pursuant to this mandate, the PNP shall formulate and adopt policies for the effective operationalization of the NPCS including but not limited to maintenance of a national record of all reported crime incidents, warrants of arrest, pictures and personal details of arrested and wanted persons, fingerprints and ballistic examination records and other relevant information.

Sec. 4. Processing of Information. – The processing of information under the 1 NPCS shall be subject to Section 11, 12 and 13 of Republic Act No. 10173, otherwise 2 known as the "Data Privacy Act of 2012". 3

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Sec. 5. Issuance of National Police Clearance. – Any person may request for the issuance of their National Police Clearance from the PNP. In line with this, the PNP 5 may determine, fix and collect reasonable amounts to be charged as fees for the 6 issuance of the police clearance: Provided, That no fees and other charges shall be 7 collected from first time jobseekers when obtaining such police clearance as mandated 8 by Republic Act No. 11261, otherwise known as the "First Time Jobseekers Assistance" 9 Act." 10

Sec. 6. Confidentiality. – The Philippine National Police shall ensure at all times 11 the confidentiality of any personal information that comes to its possession or 12 obtained as a requirement for the issuance of a Police Clearance under the preceding 13 14 section.

Sec. 7. Penal Provision. – (a) Any person, who breach the confidentiality of 15 information contained in the NPCS, whether by carelessness, improper behavior, 16 behavior with malicious intent, and use of confidential information for profit, shall be 17 penalized by imprisonment of three (3) months but not to exceed one (1) year and a 18 fine of not less than Fifty Thousand Pesos (P50,000.00) but not more than One 19 Hundred Thousand Pesos (P100,000.00), subject to the degree of breach of 20 21 information;

(b) The unauthorized processing of National Police Clearance without the 22 23 consent of the subject individual shall be penalized by imprisonment of three (3) 24 months but not to exceed one (1) year and a fine of not less than Fifty Thousand Pesos (P50,000.00) but not more than One Hundred Thousand Pesos (P100,000.00). 25

Sec. 8. Appropriation. – The amount necessary for the effective 26 implementation of the provisions of this Act shall be taken from the current year's 27 appropriation of the PNP. Thereafter, such sum as may be needed for the continued 28 29 implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act. Sec. 9. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – Within sixty (60) days from 30

the effectivity of this Act, the PNP shall promulgate the rules and regulations 31 necessary for the for the effective implementation of this Act. **32**<sup>°</sup>

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Sec. 10. Separability Clause. – If any portion or provision of this Act is declared
 unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provisions not affected thereby shall
 remain in force and effect.

Sec. 11. Repealing Clause. – All laws, decrees, orders, regulations and policies
3 inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed and/or amended 4
accordingly.

Sec. 12. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 6
complete publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
