

## AN ACT INSTITUTIONALIZING THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL GAMES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Article 14, Section 19 of the Philippine Constitution mandates the State to promote physical education and encourage sports programs, league competitions, and amateur sports, including training for international competitions, to foster self-discipline, teamwork, and excellence for the development of a healthy and alert citizenry. In view of this mandate, the State shall also develop programs and trainings that will encourage its citizens to participate in sports and other physical fitness programs.

Philippine sports apprehend the need for a sporting culture that fosters healthy and disciplined Filipino athletes to be at par with the world's best. However, beyond the country's goal for gold and glory, the perennial lack of funding in the training of our athletes and the lack of a pool of adequately trained athletes are evident and impede the growth of supposed potential athletes.

In light of these recurring problems, this proposed bill seeks to provide a structure for a truly integrated and comprehensive national sports program, linking grassroots sports promotion to elite sports development and encourage all local government officials

to promote the development of sports in the countryside covering all barangays, towns, municipalities, cities and provinces. Moreover, this bill encourages and assists various National Sports Associations in promoting their respective sports at the grassroots level providing the necessary linkages with local government units.

Through the proposed Philippine National Games, this bill will address other Olympic and Asian Games sports, which have proven to give our country more medals in international competitions, that are not regularly included in Palarong Pambansa or any other sports programs in the country. It is also designed to scout for potential athletes in various sports.

In addition, this bill hopes to institutionalize a truly comprehensive national grassroots sports program, that will harness the vast potential of the citizenry in discovering and developing champion athletes who could excel in international sports competition, thus giving our country pride and international goodwill and addressing the long-standing problems of Philippine sports in general.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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
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## AN ACT INSTITUTIONALIZING THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL GAMES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Philippine National Games Act."
  - **SEC. 2.** *Declaration of Policies.* Article IV, Section 19 (1) of the 1987 Constitution provides that the State shall promote physical education and encourage sports programs, league competitions, and amateur sports, including training for international sports competitions, to foster self-discipline, teamwork, and excellence for the development of a healthy and alert citizenry.

Pursuant thereto, it is incumbent upon the State to institutionalize a genuine comprehensive national grassroots sports program which serves as the country's premier national sports competition and venue for the nationwide talent search for identifying and developing outstanding athletes who have the potential to excel in various sports, and place the country at the forefront of international sports competitions.

- **SEC. 3.** *Objectives.* The objectives of the Philippine National Games (PNG) are as follows:
  - (a) To provide a framework and structure for a truly integrated and

- n) To exercise such other functions as may be necessary for the effective 4 implementation of this Act. 5
- SEC. 8. Secretary General. The Chairman of the Philippine Sports Commission 6 shall serve as the Secretary General of the PNG. 7
- The Secretary General shall recommend to the Board the composition of the PNG Secretariat and all the activities undertaken by the latter, including the utilization of funds for the preparations, organization and conduct of the PNG. The Secretariat, which shall come from the existing personnel of the PSC, the DILG, and the POC shall directly manage the conduct of the PNG. 12
- SEC 9. Roles of Concerned Agencies.- The following government agencies, 13 instrumentalities and entities shall be tasked to perform the following roles and 14 responsibilities: 15
- (1) Philippine Sports Commission. 16

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- a) To carry out overall management, coordination and implementation of the PNG; 17
- b) To provide manpower, technical resources and sports facilities; and 18
- c) To perform other duties and responsibilities as may be assigned by the Board. 19
- (2) Department of the Interior and Local Government. 20
- a) To mandate all LGUs to coordinate, cooperate and support the plans, programs 21 and activities of the PNG; 22
- b) To direct the Philippine National Police to prepare and implement a comprehensive 23 security plan for the LGU venues where the PNG shall be held; 24
- c) To perform such other duties and responsibilities as may be assigned by the Board. 25

1 (3) Department of Education.

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- a) To align the *Palarong Pambansa* calendar of activities, programs and policies to the conduct of the PNG;
  - b) To allow the use of school buildings and classrooms as billeting centers;
- c) To allow DepEd teachers, who are licensed or accredited technical officials of the national sports associations, to officiate in the games; and
  - d) To perform other duties and responsibilities as may be assigned by the Board.
- 9 (4) Commission on Higher Education.
- 10 a) To promote the program and activities of the PNG to all higher educational institutions;
- 12 b) To recommend to the state universities and colleges the use of their school buildings and classrooms as billeting centers;
  - c) To issue memorandum orders on the alignment of tertiary sports events and calendar of activities to the PNG; and;
  - d) To perform other duties and responsibilities as may be assigned by the Board.
- 17 (5) Local Government Units.
- a) To organize within their jurisdiction a multi-sectoral group to serve as their Local Sports Council (LSC) which shall have the authority to accredit and to allow athletes to participate in the Games;
  - b) To recruit, train, select and develop athletes who will compete in the PNG, and organize local competitions within their respective jurisdictions; and
  - c) To perform such other duties and responsibilities as may be assigned by the Board.
- 25 (6) Philippine Olympic Committee.
- a) To supervise all participating National Sports Associations involved in the PNG; and
- 28 b) To perform such other duties and responsibilities as may be assigned by the Board.

15	SEC. 10. The Local Sports Councils (LSC) The LSCs organized by their
16	respective LGUs shall be headed by the provincial governor or the city mayor. For
17	purposes of this Act, the LSC shall have the following duties and responsibilities:
18 19	(a) To encourage, promote and organize local sports competitions within their respective jurisdictions;
20	(b) To recruit, train, and select athletes for participation in the PNG;
21	(C) To develop and maintain a pool of local athletes and provide them with
22	the necessary assistance;
23	(d) To enter athletes in the PNG and its corresponding regional and cluster
24	qualifying competitions;
25	(e) To be responsible for the entire delegation entered in the PNG, and ensure
26	the compliance of their athletes with the eligibility rules of the PNG;
27	(f) To enter an athlete in any sports event subject to PNG rules, provided said athlete

1 2	(g) To give athletes the authority to represent their respective LSC in the PNG and corresponding regional and cluster qualifying competitions; and
3	(h)To carry only the name of the LSC that it represents;
4 5	<b>SEC. 11.</b> <i>Participation Rules.</i> – To participate in the PNG, all athletes shall be governed and must comply the following rules:
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6	(a) Eligibility
7 8	<ol> <li>All Filipinos by birth, including those residing outside of the Philippines but are of Filipino ancestry, shall be eligible to participate in the PNG;</li> </ol>
9 10	2) The qualifying age for different events shall be determined by the NSAs based on their international federations' rules and regulations; and
11	3) Compliance with other eligibility rules and regulations that may be
12	prescribed by the PNG, LSC and concerned NSA.
13	(b) Representation
14	1) Athletes shall, at all times, represent only the LSC that entered its name
15	in the PNG or in any regional or cluster qualifying competitions;
16	2) No athlete shall likewise be allowed to carry, represent or promote any
 17	public or private organization, enterprise or sponsor in the PNG.
18	SEC. 12. Appropriations. – In order to provide the necessary funds required fo
19	the proper implementation of this program, the following funding shall be made available
20	(a) For the preparations, organization and operations of the biennial
21	PNG, including the organization of the different regional and cluster qualifying
22	competitions, the amount of One Hundred Eighty million peso
23	(Php180,000,000.00) annually shall be appropriated by the National Treasury
24	and will form part of the General Appropriations Fund of the PSC. This Fund
25	shall include the cost of staging the PNG particularly the expenses covering the
26	operations of the sports competitions, including the expenses for competition
27	officials and personnel, meal allowances, logistics for the accommodation of a
28	participating athletes and team officials, purchase of necessary competition

1	equipment, rental of venues for competition, opening ceremonies, incentives
2	and rewards for athletes and LSCs; and
3	(b) For the preparation, training and participation of the athletes in the PNG, the
4	LGUs shall be authorized to appropriate at least one percent (1%) of their
5	annual "Internal Revenue Allotment" (IRA) and if the need arises charge the
6	amounts necessary to their "Special Activity Fund" or their "Special Education
7	Fund" as may be allowed by existing laws. For this purpose, all LGUs shall also
8 9	be allocated annually an additional IRA equivalent to one percent (1% ) thereof.
LO	SEC. 13. Implementing Rules and Regulations. — The PSC, in coordination
<b>1</b>	with the DILG, DepEd, CHED, POC, and NSAs, shall promulgate the rules and regulations
<b>L</b> 2	to implement the provisions of this Act within sixty (60) days after its effectivity.
13	SEC. 14. Separability Clause If any part or provision of this Act is held invalid
14	or unconstitutional, the other provisions not affected shall remain in full force and effect.
15	SEC. 15. Repealing Clause All laws, executive orders, issuances, decrees,
16	rules and regulations inconsistent with or contrary to the provisions of this Act are deemed
17	amended, modified or repealed accordingly.
18	SEC. 16. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
19	publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
