

AN ACT DECLARING THE KAPARKAN FALLS IN BARANGAY
CAGANAYAN, MUNICIPALITY OF TINEG, PROVINCE OF ABRA AN
ECOTOURISM SITE, ESTABLISHING THE KAPARKAN FALLS
DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article II, Section 16 of the Philippine Constitution mandates that "the State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature."

Kaparkan Falls is also known as "Mulawin Falls." It is located in Sitio Kaparkan, Barangay Caganayan, Tineg in the Province of Abra. It is approximately 500 metres long and 60 metres wide, and goes straight to the Tineg River. Kaparkan Falls is unlike any other falls found in the Philippines. The water flowing into a terrain resembling the Rice Terraces of the Cordilleras gives it a very unusual yet majestic form. It is one of the many natural wonders that Abra has to offer to both local and international tourists. The soothing cool waters entice visitors who have traveled a long distance to see the magnificent wonder that has been featured in numerous television programs and on social media.

This bill therefor seeks to declare Kaparkan Falls in the Municipality of Tineg, Province of Abra, as an ecotourism site. This is also in accordance with the fifth item in President Rodrigo Roa Duterte's 10-point socioeconomic agenda for the country, which aims to promote rural and value chain development toward increasing agricultural and rural enterprise productivity and rural tourism.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate passage of this measure earnestly sought.

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
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AN ACT DECLARING THE KAPARKAN FALLS IN BARANGAY CAGANAYAN, MUNICIPALITY OF TINEG, PROVINCE OF ABRA AN ECOTOURISM SITE, ESTABLISHING THE KAPARKAN FALLS DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Kaparkan Falls Ecotourism Act".
 - **SEC. 2.** *Declaration of Policy.* Section 16, Article II of the Constitution declares that the State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature.
 - Towards this end, it shall be the policy of the State to promote an ecologically stistainable and culturally-sensitive tourism industry as a tool for socio-economic development in the country, where its participants receive benefit equitably from the development of the sector.
 - **SEC. 3.** Kaparkan Falls Ecotourism Site. Kaparkan Falls in Barangay Caganayan in the Municipality of Tineg, Province of Abra is hereby declared an ecotourism site. As such, its development shall be prioritized by the Department of Tourism (DOT) and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), and shall be subject to the rules and regulations governing the development of ecotourism sites.
- SEC. 4. *Technical Description.* The technical description of the area encompassing the Kaparkan Falls and which is being declared an ecotourism site is as follows:

Parcel I pertains to the area beginning at a point marked "1" on the Land Classification Map, with *Latitude 17°43 '20.045", Longitude 120°49'23.406"* situated in Barangay Caganayan, Municipality of Tineg, Province of Abra,

Containing an area of seventeen (17) hectares, more or less.

SEC. 5. Kaparkan Falls Development Council. - A multi-sectoral council shall be created to be known as the "Kaparkan Falls Development Council," herein referred to as the Council. It shall be composed of the following members:

- a. Representative from the Office of the Mayor of the Municipality of Tineg, as Chairperson,
- b. Head of the Tineg Municipal Tourism Office;
- c. Head of the Tineg Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office;
- d. A representative from the DOT;
- e. A representative from the DENR;
 - f. Two (2) representatives from the indigenous peoples sector in the Municipality of Tineg; and
 - g. Two (2) representatives from the private sector in the Province of Abra.

The term of office of the members of the Council shall be coterminous with the incumbent Municipal Mayor of Tineg.

The Provincial Government of Abra shall provide a secretariat for the Council including the funding necessary to cover expenses for the performance of its official functions and activities.

- **SEC. 6.** Functions and Responsibilities of the Council. The Council shall have the following functions:
 - a. Formulation and implementation of the Kaparkan Falls Development Plan, in consultation with the local residents, businesses and other stakeholders;
 - b. Assessment and evaluation of the potential impact of the development to the environmental safety and well-being of the site, communities and enterprises;
 - c. Provision of technical and financial assistance to the communities within the site;
 - d. Formulation of rules and regulations in relation to the maintenance and security of the ecotourism site; and e. Performance of other functions as may be necessary to carry out the objectives of this Act.

- **SEC. 7.** Annual Reports. Within sixty (60) days after each fiscal year, the DOT and the DENR shall submit a report to both Houses of Congress with respect to the operation of the ecotourism site. The report shall provide information on the total amount expended during the fiscal year to carry out and achieve the purpose of this Act.
- **SEC. 8.** Appropriations. The Secretaries of the DOT and the DENR shall include in their respective Department's program the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act and from internally generated funds of the DOT.
- **SEC. 9.** *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* Within sixty (60) days after the effectivity of this Act, the DOT, DENR, and the Tourism Infrastructure and Enterprise Zone Authority, in coordination with the Municipality of Tineg, shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the proper implementation of this Act. The DOT and the DENR shall be jointly tasked to coordinate and monitor the proper implementation of this Act.
- **SEC. 10.** Separability Clause. If any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions not affected by such declaration shall remain in full force and effect.
- **SEC. 11.** Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, ordinances, executive orders, issuances or parts thereof, inconsistent with any provision of this Act are hereby deemed amended, repealed or modified accordingly. Sec. 12. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
- **SEC. 12.** Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation in the Philippines.
