

# INTRODUCED BY SENATOR VICENTE C. SOTTO III

### AN ACT

INCREASING THE SOCIAL PENSION OF INDIGENT SENIOR CITIZENS AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7432 ENTITLED, 'AN ACT TO MAXIMIZE THE CONTRIBUTION OF SENIOR CITIZENS TO NATION BUILDING, GRANT BENEFITS AND SPECIAL PRIVILEGES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES,' AS AMENDED

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

It is the responsibility of the Government to ensure that the needs of its citizens, most especially the vulnerable sector, is being met to afford them a decent quality of life.

In 2019, there are 3,796,791 indigent senior citizens all over the country. These are 3,796,791 individuals who are struggling to meet with their needs for basic commodities and healthcare due to lack of permanent source of income since they can no longer work fully and seek gainful employment.


The numerous benefits and privileges for senior citizens at present in the country can only be availed consistently from merchants in malls and big service providers, which our indigent senior citizens cannot afford to go to due to higher prices of goods in these establishments. These discounts are mostly not available in the neighborhood stores and in their local wet markets. Thus, the rising cost of living and the added financial burden brought about by the present pandemic has taken a toll on our indigent senior citizens.

To address their pressing needs, this bill seeks to provide an additional financial assistance to indigent senior citizens. This is in the form of a monthly stipend amounting to an additional Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) from the current social pension, for a total of One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00). This will aid our indigent senior citizens defray the cost of daily subsistence and other medical needs.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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## INTRODUCED BY SENATOR VICENTE C. SOTTO III

#### AN ACT

INCREASING THE SOCIAL PENSION OF INDIGENT SENIOR CITIZENS AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7432 ENTITLED, 'AN ACT TO MAXIMIZE THE CONTRIBUTION OF SENIOR CITIZENS TO NATION BUILDING, GRANT BENEFITS AND SPECIAL PRIVILEGES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES,' AS AMENDED

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- **SECTION 1.** Section 2 of Republic Act No. 7432 as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- "SEC. 2. Definition of terms. For purposes of this Act, these terms are defined as follows:

- 19 **SEC. 4.** Appropriations. The amount necessary for the initial implementation
- of this Act shall be charged against the current appropriations of the DSWD.
- 21 Thereafter such amount necessary for the continued implementation of this Act
- 22 shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
- 23 SEC. 5. Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, orders, issuances, and rules
- 24 and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are
- 25 hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
- 26 SEC. 6. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Act shall be held
- 27 unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions not otherwise affected shall
- 28 remain in full force and effect.
- 29 SEC. 7. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
- 30 publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
