AN ACT DECLARING THE PROVINCE OF SOUTHERN LEYTE A TOURISM ZONE, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Province of Southern Leyte is home to beautiful tourist destinations, such as Taglinao Falls, Bird Sanctuary and Mangrove Site, Crater Lake, Fatima Hills, and Guinsaugon Lake. The historical Limasawa, where the first Christian Mass was held and is considered the birthplace of Christianity in the Philippines, is located in Southern Leyte.

Southern Leyte is famous for its world-class dive sites, caves, extreme adventure sites, waterfalls, safari, river trekking, crater lake trekking, fish feeding, and resort islands.¹

To further boost the tourism in Southern Leyte, the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) has been upgrading the road networks leading to five tourism sites in Leyte which are targeted to be completed within the year.²

This measure proposes to establish the Province of Southern Leyte as a Tourism Zone and to prioritize further development of the province for tourism. This will increase the number of tourists visiting the province, provide livelihood to its inhabitants, and usher sustainable and responsible tourism in the region.

AN ACT

DECLARING THE PROVINCE OF SOUTHERN LEYTE A TOURISM ZONE, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 Section 1. The Province of Southern Leyte is hereby declared a tourism zone. As such, 2 its development shall be prioritized by the Department of Tourism and the Department of 3 Public Works and Highways, subject to the rules and regulations governing the development 4 of tourism zones.

Section 2. Within one (1) year after the approval of this Act, the Department of Tourism, 5 in coordination with the Tourism Infrastructure and Enterprise Zone Authority and other 6 concerned agencies of the government, shall prepare a tourism development plan providing 7 8 for the development, maintenance, improvement, and restoration of tourism sites, where 9 appropriate, in conformity with set standards, including the construction of hotels, resorts, 10 restaurants, recreational facilities, and other appropriate facilities and infrastructure: *Provided*, That said development plan shall ensure the preservation of the ecological balance and natural 11 12 beauty of the area.

Section 3. The Department of Tourism shall take immediate steps to implement the development plan and incorporate the same in its tourism development program for the ensuing calendar year.

Section 4. Upon the promulgation of this Act, the Department of Public Works and Highways, in coordination with the Department of Tourism, shall implement the construction and improvement of roads and other infrastructure necessary in the development of the

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Province of Southern Leyte and incorporate the same in the Department's infrastructure
program.

3 Section 5. The Secretaries of the Department of Tourism and the Department of Public 4 Works and Highways shall include in their respective Department's program the 5 implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General 6 Appropriations Act, and shall augment such allocation with internally generated funds of the 7 Department of Tourism.

8 Section 6. Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Department of 9 Tourism shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the proper implementation 10 of this Act.

Section 7. All laws, rules, regulations, executive orders, proclamations, presidential decrees, and other issuances inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act are hereby deemed repealed or amended accordingly.

14 Section 8. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its complete publication 15 in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
