“AN ACT
DECLARING A PARCEL OF LAND LOCATED IN THE CITY OF
MASBATE AND THE MUNICIPALITY OF MOBO, IN THE
PROVINCE OF MASBATE, A PROTECTED AREA WITH THE
CATEGORY OF NATURAL BIOTIC AREA UNDER THE NATIONAL
INTEGRATED PROTECTED AREAS SYSTEM (NIPAS), TO BE
REFERRED TO AS THE TUGBO NATURAL BIOTIC AREA,
PROVIDING FOR ITS MANAGEMENT, AND APPROPRIATING
FUNDS THEREFOR”

*Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the
Philippines in Congress assembled:*

ARTICLE I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

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3 **SECTION 1. *Short Title.*** – This Act shall be known as the “Tugbo Natural
4 Biotic Area Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. *Declaration of Policy.*** – Cognizant of the profound impact of
6 human activities on all components of the natural environment, it is hereby
7 declared the policy of the State to secure for the Filipino people of present and
8 future generations, the perpetual existence of all native plants and animals
9 through the declaration of protected areas under the National Integrated
10 Protected Areas System (NIPAS) within the classification of national park as
11 provided for in the Constitution.

12 In recognition of the richness of the biological resources, both flora and
13 fauna, that are native and distinct to the Tugbo Watershed Forest Reserve, as well

1 as their aesthetic and ecological importance, a parcel of land located in the City of
2 Masbate and the Municipality of Mobo, in the Province of Masbate, is hereby
3 declared a protected area with the category of natural biotic area, and shall
4 hereinafter be referred to as the Tugbo Natural Biotic Area (TNBA). As such, the
5 State shall ensure the conservation, protection, management and rehabilitation of
6 the area. It is likewise recognized that effective administration of this area is
7 possible only through cooperation among national government, local government
8 units (LGUs), concerned nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), private entities
9 and local communities. The use and enjoyment of this area must be consistent
10 with the principles of biological diversity and sustainable development.

11 Towards this end, the State shall ensure the full implementation of this Act,
12 the mobilization of resources for the institutional mechanisms herein established,
13 and the full scientific and technical support needed for the conservation of
14 biodiversity and the integrity of the ecosystems, culture and indigenous practices.

15 **SEC. 3. *Definition of Terms.*** – As used in this Act:

- 16 a. *Buffer zones* refer to identified areas outside the boundaries of and
17 immediately adjacent to designated protected areas that need special
18 development control in order to avoid or minimize harm to the protected
19 area;
- 20 b. *Conservation* refers to any act or acts of preservation and sustainable
21 utilization of wildlife or maintenance, restoration and enhancement of
22 habitats;
- 23 c. *Indigenous cultural communities (ICCs)/Indigenous peoples (IPs)* refer to
24 groups of people sharing common bonds of language, customs, traditions,
25 and other distinctive cultural traits, and who have, since time immemorial
26 occupied, possessed and utilized a territory;
- 27 d. *National park* refers to land of the public domain classified as such in the
28 Constitution which include all areas under the NIPAS, primarily
29 designated for the conservation of native plants and animals, their
30 associated habitats and cultural diversity;

1 e. *Natural biotic area* refers to an area set aside to allow the way of life of
2 societies living in harmony with the environment to adapt to modern
3 technology at their pace;

4 f. *Protected area* refers to an identified portion of land and water set aside by
5 reason of its unique physical and biological significance, managed to
6 enhance biological diversity and protected against destructive human
7 exploitation; and

8 g. *Tenured migrants* refer to protected area occupants who have been actually,
9 continuously and presently occupying a portion of the protected area for five
10 (5) years before the proclamation or law establishing the same as a
11 protected area, and are solely dependent therein for subsistence.

12 **SEC. 4. Classification as a National Park.** – The TNBA is comprised of
13 a parcel of land of the public domain located in the City of Masbate and
14 Municipality of Mobo, in the Province of Masbate. All lands of the public domain
15 within the coverage and scope of the TNBA shall fall under the classification of
16 national park as provided for in Article XII, Section 3 of the Constitution.

17 **SEC. 5. Scope and Coverage.** – The boundaries of the TNBA are more
18 particularly described as the area beginning at a point marked “1” on plan, which
19 is N 51° 03’ 09” E, 2,824.619 meters from PRS92 “MST-3103” with geographic
20 coordinates of 12° 17’ 37.39667” Latitude and 123° 35’ 33.97029” Longitude located
21 at *Barangay Sinalongan, City of Masbate, Province of Masbate,*

1 Department of Agriculture (DA), National Economic and Development
2 Authority (NEDA), Department of Science and Technology (DOST),
3 Philippine National Police (PNP), and Department of National Defense
4 (DND);

- 5 h. Three (3) representatives from either NGOs, or people's organizations
6 (POs) based in the Province of Masbate, duly accredited both by the
7 DENR and the provincial government. The NGOs or POs represented
8 should have been in existence for at least five (5) years and must have a
9 record of accomplishments in the field of protected area management;
- 10 i. At least one (1) but not more than three (3) representatives from all the
11 ICCs/IPs present in the area and recognized by the National
12 Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP);
- 13 j. One (1) representative from an academic institution, preferably from a
14 university or college in the Province of Masbate, with proven track
15 record in or related to protected area management; and
- 16 k. One (1) representative from the private sector, preferably a resident of
17 the Province of Masbate, who is distinguished in a profession or field of
18 interest relevant to the protected area management.

19 The terms of office of members of the PAMB, as well as the grounds for their
20 removal shall be in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act No. 7586,
21 otherwise known as the "National Integrated Protected Areas System Act of 1992",
22 as amended by Republic Act No. 11038, otherwise known as the "Expanded
23 National Integrated Protected Areas System Act of 2018".

24 **SEC. 8. *Functions of the PAMB.*** – The PAMB shall have the following
25 powers and functions:

- 26 a. Oversee the management of the protected area;
- 27 b. Approve policies, plans and programs, proposals, agreements, and other
28 related documents for the management of the protected areas;
- 29 c. Approve the management plan of the protected area and ensure its
30 harmonization with and integration into the Ancestral Domain Sustainable
31 Development and Protection Plan, land use plan and other development
32 plans, public or private, and their implementation;

- 1 d. Adopt a manual of operations to include rules of procedures in the conduct
- 2 of business, and the creation of committees and their respective terms of
- 3 reference;
- 4 e. Recommend the deputation of appropriate agencies and individuals for the
- 5 enforcement of the laws, rules and regulations governing the management
- 6 of the protected area;
- 7 f. Allocate financial resources for the implementation of the management plan
- 8 and manage the Protected Area Retention Income Account and other funds
- 9 in accordance with government accounting, budgeting, and auditing rules
- 10 and regulations;
- 11 g. Set fees and charges in accordance with existing guidelines;
- 12 h. Issue rules and regulations for the resolution of conflicts through
- 13 appropriate and effective means;
- 14 i. Recommend appropriate policy changes to the DENR and other government
- 15 authorities with respect to the management of the TNBA;
- 16 j. Monitor and assess the performance of the Protected Area Superintendent
- 17 (PASu) and other protected area personnel and compliance of partners with
- 18 the terms and conditions of any undertaking, contract or agreement relative
- 19 to any project or activity within the TNBA;
- 20 k. Recommend from among a shortlist of qualified candidates, the designation
- 21 or appointment of the PASu; and
- 22 l. Assess the effectiveness of the management of the protected area: *Provided,*
- 23 That the members of the PAMB representing the LGUs and national
- 24 agencies shall inform their respective constituents, offices or sectors, of
- 25 PAMB-approved or other relevant policies, rules, regulations, programs,
- 26 and projects and shall ensure that the provisions of this Act and the rules
- 27 and regulations issued to implement it are complied with and used as
- 28 reference and framework in their respective plans, policies, programs, and
- 29 projects. Failure to comply with the foregoing shall be the basis for
- 30 disciplinary action against such member according to administrative rules
- 31 and regulations and such penalties as the PAMB may provide: *Provided,*
- 32 *further,* That the DENR, through the Regional Director, shall ensure that

1 the PAMB acts within the scope of its powers and functions. In case of
2 conflict between the resolutions issued by the PAMB and the existing
3 administrative orders of national application, the latter shall prevail.

4 **SEC. 9. *The Protected Area Management Office (PAMO).*** — There is
5 hereby established a Protected Area Management Office (PAMO) to be headed by
6 a Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) who shall supervise the day to day
7 management, protection, and administration of the TNBA. The PASu shall hold
8 a permanent plantilla position and shall be appointed by the DENR Secretary. A
9 sufficient number of support staff with permanent plantilla positions shall
10 likewise be appointed by the DENR Secretary to assist the PASu in the
11 management of the protected area.

12 The PASu shall be primarily accountable to the PAMB and the DENR for
13 the management and operations of the TNBA. Pursuant thereto, the PASu shall
14 have the following duties and responsibilities:

- 15 a. Prepare the management plan, in consultation with the stakeholders,
16 including the annual work and financial plan and ensure its
17 implementation;
- 18 b. Ensure the integration of the protected area management plans, programs,
19 projects, and policies with relevant national and LGUs' plans and programs;
- 20 c. Provide secretariat services to the PAMB and its committees and ensure the
21 availability of relevant and timely information for decision-making;
- 22 d. Formulate and recommend to the PAMB proposed policies, rules,
23 regulations, and programs;
- 24 e. Establish, operate, and maintain a database management system which
25 shall be an important basis for decision-making;
- 26 f. Enforce the laws, rules and regulations relevant to the protected area,
27 commence and institute administrative and legal actions in collaboration
28 with other government agencies or organizations, and assist in the
29 prosecution of offenses committed in violation of the provisions this Act;
- 30 g. Monitor, evaluate, and report the implementation of management activities
31 of the protected area;

- 1 h. Request for and receive any technical assistance, support or advice from any
2 agency or instrumentality of the government as well as academic
3 institutions, NGOs, and the private sector, as may be necessary for the
4 effective management, protection and administration of the protected area;
- 5 i. Issue permits and clearances for activities that implement the management
6 plan and other permitted activities in accordance with terms, conditions,
7 and criteria established by the PAMB: *Provided*, That all permits for
8 extraction of natural resources, including collection of wildlife, and its by-
9 products or derivatives for research purposes, shall continue to be issued by
10 relevant authorities, subject to prior clearance from the PAMB, through the
11 PASu, in accordance with the specific acts to be covered;
- 12 j. Collect and receive pertinent fees, charges, donations, and other income for
13 the protected area: *Provided*, That such fees, charges, donations, and other
14 income collected and received shall be reported regularly to the PAMB and
15 the DENR in accordance with existing guidelines;
- 16 k. Prepare and recommend to the PAMB, approval of the annual work and
17 financial plans of the protected area based on the management plan; and
- 18 l. Perform such other functions as the PAMB and the DENR may assign.

19 The PAMO may be augmented by the deputized local environment and
20 natural resources officers upon the recommendation of the PAMB and approval of
21 the DENR.

22 ARTICLE III

23 PROCEEDS AND FEES

24 SEC. 10. *The Tugbo Natural Biotic Area Fund.* – There is hereby
25 established a trust fund to be known as the Tugbo Natural Biotic Area Fund for
26 purposes of financing projects of the TNBA and the NIPAS. All income generated
27 from the operation of the system or the management of wild flora and fauna in the
28 TNBA shall accrue to the fund. The income shall be derived from fees from
29 permitted sale and export of flora and fauna and other resources from the TNBA
30 proceeds from lease of multiple-use areas, contributions from industries and
31 facilities directly benefiting from the TNBA, and such other fees and income
32 derived from the operation of the TNBA.

1 The PAMB shall retain seventy-five percent (75%) of all revenues raised
2 through the above means, which shall be deposited in the Protected Area-Retained
3 Income Account (PA-RIA) in any authorized government depository bank within
4 the locality: *Provided*, That disbursements out of such deposits shall be used solely
5 for the protection, maintenance, administration, and management of the protected
6 area and implementation of duly approved projects of the PAMB. The remaining
7 twenty-five percent (25%) of revenues shall be deposited as a special account in
8 the general fund in the National Treasury for purposes of financing the projects of
9 the NIPAS.

10 The fund may be augmented by grants, donations, endowment from various
11 sources, domestic or foreign: *Provided*, That the fund shall be deposited in full as
12 a special account in the National Treasury and disbursements therefrom shall be
13 made solely for the protection, maintenance, administration and management of
14 the NIPAS and duly approved projects endorsed by the PAMB in accordance with
15 existing accounting, budgeting, and auditing rules and regulations: *Provided*,
16 *further*, That the fund shall not be used to cover personal services expenditures.

17 The LGUs shall continue to impose and collect all other fees not enumerated
18 herein which they have traditionally collected, such as business permits, property
19 tax and rentals of LGUs' facilities.

20 ARTICLE IV

21 TRANSITORY AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

22 **SEC. 11. *Appropriations.*** – The Secretary of the DENR shall immediately
23 include in the Department's program the implementation of this Act, the funding
24 of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

25 **SEC. 12. *Suppletory Application of the NIPAS Law.*** – The provisions
26 of Republic Act No. 7586, as amended by Republic Act No. 11038, shall have
27 suppletory application to this Act.

28 **SEC. 13. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.*** – Within ninety (90)
29 days from the effectivity of this Act, the Secretary of the DENR shall, in
30 consultation with the local governments of the City of Masbate and Municipality
31 of Mobo, the provincial government of Masbate, and concerned national
32 government agencies, issue the corresponding rules and regulations for the

1 effective implementation of this Act.

2 **SEC. 14. *Separability Clause.*** – If any section or provision of this Act is
3 held unconstitutional or invalid, the remaining sections or provisions with the
4 provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

5 **SEC. 15. *Repealing Clause.*** – All laws, decrees, letters of instruction,
6 executive orders, rules and regulations and other issuances or parts thereof
7 inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

8 **SEC. 16. *Effectivity.*** – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
9 publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
