RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON SOCIAL JUSTICE, WELFARE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, INTO THE REPORTED LAPSES IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11310, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "PANTAWID PAMILYANG PILIPINO PROGRAM (4PS) ACT"

- WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11310, otherwise known as the "Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) Act," was enacted into law on April 17, 2019;

 WHEREAS, the law provides for the institutionalization, expansion and rationalization of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program, hereinafter referred to as "the Program," which started as an initiative of the national government through the
- 6 Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD);

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- WHEREAS, it also expressly mandates the upliftment of the poorest of the poor
 from the clutches of poverty through programs that would improve the delivery of
 basic services, particularly education, health and nutrition, early childhood care and
 development and empowerment of women;
- 11 WHEREAS, the abovementioned mandate is also in line with the established 12 practice of using the State as an active agent in the creation of economic opportunities 13 that encourage freedom of initiative and self-reliance;
 - WHEREAS, Section 14 of the law designated the DSWD as the lead agency responsible for the central planning and coordination for as well as implementation and monitoring of the Program;
- 17 WHEREAS, information recently gathered from some beneficiaries indicate 18 that there were possible lapses in the implementation of the Program, including but

not limited to, delayed monthly financial benefits as well as reduction in the amounts
received in many areas covered by the Program nationwide;

WHEREAS, such lapses, if true, should be viewed with grave concern since these could result in noncompliance by some household-beneficiaries with the conditions for entitlement as provided for in Sections 11 and 12, respectively, of the Program;

WHEREAS, in addition to the aforementioned lapses, some sectors/stakeholders reported numerous instances wherein the lead agency failed to provide pertinent data in a timely manner as required under Section 20 (Program Transparency) of the law;

WHEREAS, it had even been recently reported that the 4Ps Act was being used for politicking when fake news peddlers claimed that it would be discontinued had certain incumbents not been re-elected into office in the coming May 2022 elections – necessitating this representation to issue a statement assuaging the 4Ps beneficiaries that the program will continue regardless of the results of the elections;¹

WHEREAS, the DSWD urged the public, especially its beneficiaries, to report candidates who are using the agency's programs, projects and services, like the 4Ps, in advancing their political agenda;²

WHEREAS, among those which can be reported by the public are putting names of politicians in relief items; repacking of relief goods and distribution of such as their own supplies; and/or claims that any DSWD goods or programs are provided due to their influence;³

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that the Senate look into the reported lapses in the implementation of the 4Ps Act to prevent the same from occurring again, as well as explore possible revisions to the law that would improve implementation of the Program;

WHEREAS, it is also in the interest of the public to be further educated on the 4Ps Act through an intensive information campaign by the DSWD and other concerned agencies in order to allay public fears, dispel false rumors, and ensure that this landmark legislation is rendered immune from the proliferation of fake news;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to direct the Senate Committee on Social Justice, Welfare and Rural Development to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, into the reported lapses in the implementation of Republic Act No. 11310, otherwise known as the "Pantawid Pamilyang pilipino Program (4Ps) Act".
