AN ACT EXPANDING THE COVERAGE OF FREE SCHOOL MEALS PROGRAM
AND MANDATING THE PROCUREMENT FROM SMALL SCALE FARMERS IN
THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NATIONAL FEEDING PROGRAM
AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT 11037 OTHERWISE
KNOWN AS THE "MASUSTANSYANG PAGKAIN PARA SA BATANG PILIPINO
ACT"

Explanatory Note

Republic Act 11037, also known as the Masustansyang Pagkain para sa Batang Pilipino Act, was signed into law for the purpose of establishing a National Feeding Program for Undernourished Children in Public Day Care, Kindergarten and Elementary Schools to Combat Hunger and Undernutrition in our country. However, Reports indicate that the majority of Filipino children still go to school on an empty stomach. It is the policy of the state to promote children's rights to survival and development. It is imperative that we recognize the link between a healthy diet and the growth of the body and mind. The State shall encourage school children from Kindergarten to Grade 12, particularly those from low-income families, to have access to affordable and wholesome food. Improving the health condition of the children will not only improve their learning capacity but also improve their academic performance.

The purpose of this bill is to implement affordable health and nutrition programs by ensuring that proper, age-appropriate, and affordable health and nutrition programs are accessible to school children throughout their childhood years. This bill also seeks to help our agricultural industry by mandating that 30% or more of the supplies needed to implement the national feeding program shall be procured from small-scale farmers.

In view of the foregoing, the early passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

PROGRAM AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT 11037
OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "MASUSTANSYANG PAGKAIN PARA SA
BATANG PILIPINO ACT"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Definition of Small-scale farmers –
- 2 Small-scale farmers in the Philippines shall refer to individual or collective farm
- 3 operators who engage in agricultural and fishery activities, with total land and/or water
- area of operation, including leased areas, not exceeding five (5) hectares.

Section 4 of the same act shall be read as follows:

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SEC. 7.Repealing Clause.

SEC. 4. National Feeding Program. - The National Feeding Program, hereinafter referred to as the Program, is hereby established to address undernutrition among Filipino children. The Program shall have the following components and coverage:

(b) School-Based Feeding Program. - The DepEd shall implement a schoolbased feeding program for undernourished public school children from kindergarten to (grade six (6)) GRADE TWELVE (12);:

SEC. 4. Section 8 of RA 11037 is hereby amended as Section 11, and all succeeding

sections of the same act are hereby renumbered accordingly.

SEC.5. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - Within ninety (90) days from the approval of this Act, the Secretary of Education, in consultation with the DA, DAR DSWD , the National Nutrition Council (NNC), the Food and Nutrition Research Institute (FNRI), the Department of Health (DOH), the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and such other relevant government agencies, nongovernment organizations, and development partners, shall promulgate their respective rules and regulations for the efficient and effective of this act. The implementing rules and regulations issued pursuant to this section shall take effect thirty (30) days after publication in two (2) national newspapers of general circulation.

SEC.6. Separability Clause.- If any provision of this Act is held invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions not so declared shall remain in force and effect.

- 3 **SEC.8.** Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication
