EXPLANATORY NOTE

Republic Act No. 8178, otherwise known as the Agricultural Tarification Act, was signed into law on March 28, 1996. This is to cushion the effect of the lifting of quantitative restrictions on affected sub-sectors of Agriculture. Section 28 of said law created the Agricultural Competitiveness Enhancement Fund (ACEF) with a lifespan of nine years from the proceeds of the importation of the minimum access volumes (MAVs).

The nine-year period will expire on December 31, 2007 and thus there is a need to extend the lifespan of the ACEF to enable the government to provide the fisheries and agriculture sector the opportunity to strengthen their development activities and enhance their competitiveness. The availability of the ACEF will give an opportunity to farmers, fisherfolk and all agricultural workers to secure other sources of funds for their competitive enhancement activities.

Due to the foregoing, early passage of this measure is requested.

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AN ACT

EXTENDING THE UTILIZATION PERIOD OF THE AGRICULTURAL COMPETITIVENESS ENHANCEMENT FUND, AMENDING FOR THIS PURPOSE SECTION 8 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8178, ENTITLED "AN ACT REPLACING QUANTITATIVE IMPORT RESTRICTIONS ON AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS, EXCEPT RICE, WITH TARIFFS, CREATING THE AGRICULTURAL COMPETITIVENESS FUND" AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Section 8 of Republic Act Number 8178, entitled "An Act Replacing Quantitative Import Restrictions on Agricultural Products, Except Rice, with 2 Tariffs, Creating the Agricultural Competitiveness Enhancement Fund, and for Other 3 4 Purposes" is hereby amended to read as follows: "SEC. 8 Agricultural Competitiveness Enhancement Fund - To 5 implement the policy enunciated in this Act, there is hereby created the 6 Agricultural Competitiveness Enhancement Fund, hereinafter referred to as 7 the Fund. THE FUND SHALL CONSIST 8 OF ALL DUTIES 9 COLLECTED FROM The proceeds of the importation of AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS UNDER THE minimum access volume 10 (MAV) MECHANISM. [shall accrue to the General Fund and shall be 11 deposited in the national Treasury.] THEREAFTER, THE LAND BANK 12 OF THE PHILIPPINES SHALL BE THE SOLE DEPOSITORY OF ACEF 13

1 FUNDS.

The FUND [entire proceeds] shall CONTINUE TO be set aside [and earmarked by Congress] AS FOLLOWS: [for irrigation, farm to market roads, post-harvest equipment and facilities, credit, research and development, other marketing infrastructure, provision of market information, retraining, extension services, and other forms of assistance and support to the agricultural sector.]

A) TWO HUNDRED MILLION PESOS (P200,000.000.00) IN A
SPECIAL FUND DEPOSITED WITH THE LAND BANK OF THE
PHILIPPINES FOR THE YOUNG FARMERS PROGRAM. SAID PROGRAM
SHALL BE ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE –
NATIONAL AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES COUNCIL (DA-NAFC).

B) ONE BILLION PESOS (P1,000,000,000.00) IN A NON-12 DIRECTED TRUST FUND DEPOSITED WITH AND MANAGED BY THE 13 14 LAND BANK OF THE PHILIPPINES. THE INCOME FROM FUND INVESTMENTS SHALL BE USED TO FUND SCHOLARSHIPS FOR NEEDY 15 BUT DESERVING STUDENTS ENROLLED AT MEMBER INSTITUTIONS 16 17 OF THE ASSOCIATIONS OF COLLEGES OF AGRICULTURE IN THE PHILIPPINES (ACAP). THE GRANTS SHALL NOT EXCEED FIFTEEN 18 THOUSAND PESOS (P15,000.00) PER SCHOLAR PER YEAR INCLUDING 19 A ONE-TIME THESIS GRANT OF FIFTEEN THOUSAND PESOS 20 (P15,000.00) PER SCHOLAR WHO ARE SENIORS. 21

THE RULING BODY OF ACAP SHALL DETERMINE THE AMOUNT
OF SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS ALLOCATED TO EACH MEMBER
INSTITUTION.

C) ONE BILLION PESOS (P1,000,000,000.00) IN A FUND
 DEPOSITED WITH AND MANAGED BY THE LAND BANK OF THE

INSTITUTIONS ACCREDITED BY THE PEOPLE'S CREDIT AND FINANCE
 CORPORATION WHICH FINANCE INSTITUTIONS SHALL ON-LEND TO
 SMALL FARMERS AND FISHERFOLK: *PROVIDED*, THAT NO SINGLE
 LOAN OR SERIES OF LOANS TO A SINGLE BORROWER SHALL BE
 MORE THAN ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (P150,000.00).

THE COMMISSION ON AUDIT SHALL IMMEDIATELY CONDUCT AN

10 THEREAFTER, THE COMMISSION ON AUDIT SHALL CONDUCT AN 11 ANNUAL AUDIT OF THE VARIOUS FUNDS UNDER THE ACEF INCLUDING 12 THE GRANTS GIVEN AND REPORT ITS FINDINGS TO THE SUPERVISORY 13 COUNCIL, THE COCAFM, COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS OF THE HOUSE 14 OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND THE COMMITTEE ON FINANCE OF THE 15 SENATE.

16 SEC. 3. *Fund Management and Sustainability.* For the purpose of fund 17 management and sustainability, the Fund shall be DEPOSITED TO THE LAND BANK 18 OF THE PHILIPPINES, to which collections from repayments from loan beneficiaries 19 including interests, if any, shall be credited. THE SUPERVISORY COUNCIL AND 20 LAND BANK OF THE PHILIPPINES are hereby mandated to draw up a plan and such 21 other mechanisms for fund utilization and sustainability.

22 SEC. 4. *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. –The SUPERVISORY COUNCIL 23 shall promulgate within a period of ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, the 24 implementing rules and regulations, for the effective implementation of this Act.

SEC. 5. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, executive issuances, rules and
 regulations inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

- 1 SEC. 6. *Separability Clause.* The provision of this Act are hereby declared to be 2 separable, and in the event one or more of such provision are held unconstitutional, the 3 validity of the other provision shall not be affected thereby.
- 4 SEC. 7. Effectivity. . This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days from the date of
- 5 its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two newspapers of general circulation,
- 6 whichever comes earlier.
