## SENATE Proposed Senate Resolution No. <u>740</u>

## Introduced by Senator Aquilino "Koko" Pimentel III

## A RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE

ELECTION RESULTS WHICH ALLEGEDLY CAME FROM ONLY ONE PRIVATE INTERNET PROTOCOL ADDDRESS

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State to ensure free, orderly, honest, peaceful, credible and informed elections, plebiscites, referenda, recall and other similar electoral exercises by improving on the election process and adopting systems, which shall involve the use of an automated election system that will ensure the secrecy and sanctity of the ballot and all election, consolidation and transmission documents in order that the process shall be transparent and credible and that the results shall be fast, accurate and reflective of the genuine will of the people<sup>1</sup>;

WHEREAS, it is the mandate and authority of the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) to prescribe the adoption and use of the most suitable technology of demonstrated capability taking into account the situation prevailing in the area and the funds available for the purpose<sup>2</sup>;

WHEREAS, pursuant to this mandate, COMELEC awarded to the joint venture of Smartmatic USA Corp. and local partner SMMT-

TMI 2016 (Smartmatic Philippines) the P402.7-million contract to provide the elections software to be used in the 2022 national and local elections<sup>3</sup>;

WHEREAS, since the Philippines shifted to automated polls in 2010, Smartmatic has secured the most number of COMELEC contracts. While the firm claims it is 100% privately owned and has no political ties, Smartmatic's credibility was adversely affected following reports of alleged poll irregularities in past Philippine elections. These included a delayed transmission of election results to the transparency server, known as the seven-hour glitch, in 2019<sup>4</sup>;

WHEREAS, former Secretary of Information and Communications Technology, Officer-in-Charge, Eliseo Rio Jr. and his team of computer forensic examiners allege that election rigging has taken place in the 2022 national and local elections. Rio and his team discovered that allegedly 98.8 percent of Metro Manila precinct results were received from only one private IP (internet protocol) address, 192.168.0.2, that allegedly 95.5 percent of Cavite results came from the same 192.168.0.2, and that allegedly 81 percent of Batangas results still came from 192.168.0.2, among other alleged anomalies<sup>5</sup>;

WHEREAS, Rio and his team have observed that transmission logs have shown that most election returns received by the Transparency Server in the first hour of counting did not pass the networks of the telcos, but were preloaded by a secret man-in-the-middle gateway, a gatekeeper, with private IP address 192.168.0.2<sup>6</sup>;

WHEREAS, the alleged incidents have led Rio and his team to believe that whoever manipulated the Transparency Server results

already knew the outcome of the 2022 Election even before votes were counted. Rio has presented his findings to the Global Transparency and Transformation Advocates Network on July 23, 2023<sup>7</sup>;

WHEREAS, leaving these questions unresolved amounts to sanctioning electoral fraud, permitting misuse of public money, and accepting the failure of the democratic process;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as it is hereby resolved, to direct the appropriate Senate Committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the election results which allegedly came from only one private internet protocol address.
