## A RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE ONGOING AND PROPOSED RECLAMATION PROJECTS IN MANILA BAY AND THEIR LATENT EFFECTS IN THE ENVIRONMENT, AND ON THE EVALUATION PROCESS RECLAMATION CONDUCTED BY THE **PHILIPPINE** AUTHORITY IN THE APPROVAL OF THE RECLAMATION **PROJECTS** 

WHEREAS, the prime duty of the Government is to serve and protect the people<sup>1</sup>. In addition, the State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature<sup>2</sup>;

WHEREAS, pursuant to this duty, any project which may introduce damage to a balanced and healthful ecology must be thoroughly reviewed;

WHEREAS, there are a total number of twenty-two (22) approved reclamation projects nationwide with thirteen (13) of them in Manila Bay<sup>3</sup>;

WHEREAS, the United States Embassy in the Philippines raised concerns that some of those involved in the reclamation projects have ties to a firm, which was cited by the World Bank and the Asian Development Bank for engaging in fraudulent business practices.<sup>4</sup>;

WHEREAS, while land reclamation may provide prospective economic benefits, it also poses environmental concerns, such as the change of coastal processes and the potential implications on water quality and marine species;

WHEREAS, fishers' and scientists' groups allege that the Philippine Reclamation Authority should not downplay the impacts of reclamation projects on coastal ecosystems and communities, stressing that the environmental and socio-economic costs of dump-and-fill activities are significant. "The issue is not only about the total size of the entire reclamation projects in Manila Bay, but the ongoing and long-term impacts to the livelihood of fisherfolk, marine biodiversity, and local fisheries production," quoting PAMALAKAYA vice chairperson Ronnel Arambulo<sup>5</sup>;

WHEREAS, it is provided under Executive Order No. 74, s. 2019 that no reclamation project shall be approved by the Philippine Reclamation Authority without the required Area Clearance and Environmental Compliance Certificate to be issued by the DENR. Moreover, Philippine Reclamation Authority shall evaluate all proposals for reclamation projects based on their cumulative impacts rather than on a specific project basis;

WHEREAS, on 07 August 2023, President Ferdinand Marcos, Jr. said that all of the reclamation projects have been suspended and under review, except for one which pushed through because it has already been reviewed<sup>6</sup>;

WHEREAS, although these reclamation projects have been suspended pending review, much environmental damage has been done with the completion of these projects remaining contingent on the results of the review ordered by the President.

WHEREAS, in order to avert the approval of the administration and operation of reclamation projects which are non-compliant with the environmental standards, there is a necessity to call for the review of the evaluation process conducted by the Philippine Reclamation Authority as well as the entire approval process for reclamation projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as it is hereby resolved, to direct the appropriate Senate Committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the ongoing and proposed reclamation projects in Manila Bay and their latent effects on the environment, and on the evaluation process conducted by the Philippine Reclamation Authority and/or other government agencies in the approval of the reclamation projects.
