AN ACT DECLARING THE PROVINCE OF SOUTHERN LEYTE, A TOURISM ZONE AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Province of Southern Leyte, located in the Eastern Visayas region, boasts a rich natural landscape, pristine beaches, diverse marine life, and cultural heritage. Recognizing its tourism potential and the significant role of the tourism industry in economic growth, this proposal aims to declare the Province of Southern Leyte as a tourism zone to attract more investments and promote sustainable development.

The tourism zone declaration will encourage responsible and sustainable tourism practices. With increased attention to the region, there will be greater awareness and appreciation of Southern Leyte's unique cultural heritage and pristine natural resources. This, in turn, will foster local pride and stimulate efforts to preserve and protect these valuable assets for future generations.

This tourism zone declaration will also encourage the national government to prioritize and allocate funds for infrastructure development projects in the province. Upgrading and expanding existing transportation networks and infrastructure will facilitate better accessibility to tourist destinations. It will also directly contribute to enhancing the visitor experience and increasing Southern Leyte's attractiveness as a

tourism destination, while also improving the overall quality of life for the local population.

In view of the foregoing, approval of this bill is earnestly sought.



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AN ACT DECLARING THE PROVINCE OF SOUTHERN LEYTE, A TOURISM ZONE AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. The Province of Southern Leyte is hereby declared a tourism zone. As such, its development shall be prioritized by the Department of Tourism (DOT) and the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), and shall be subject to the rules and regulations governing the development of tourism zones.

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Sec. 2. The DOT, in coordination with the Tourism Infrastructure and Enterprise Zone Authority and other concerned agencies of the government, shall prepare a tourism development plan providing for the development, maintenance, improvement and restoration of tourist sites, where appropriate, in conformity with set standards, including the construction of hotels, resorts, restaurants, recreational facilities and other appropriate facilities and infrastructure: Provided, That said development plan shall ensure the preservation of the ecological balance and natural beauty of the area.

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Sec. 3. The DOT shall take immediate steps to implement the development plan and incorporate the same in the Department's overall tourism development program for the ensuing calendar year.

	Sec. 4. Upon the promulgation of this Act, the DPWH, in coordination with th									th the
DOT,	shall	implement	the	construction	and	improvement	of	roads	and	other
infrastructure necessary in the development of the Province of Southern Leyte, and										
incorporate the same in the Department's infrastructure program.										

Sec. 5. The Secretary of the DOT and the Secretary of the DPWH shall include in their respective Department's program the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act and from internally generated funds of the DOT.

Sec. 6. Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the DOT shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the proper implementation of this Act.

Sec. 7. *Repealing Clause*. - All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act shall be deemed repealed or modified accordingly.

Sec. 8. *Effectivity Clause.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in any newspaper of general circulation.
