- AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ORGANIZATIONAL REFORMS IN THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6975, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT OF 1990". AS REPUBLIC ACT AMENDED. AND NO. 8551. OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE REFORM AND REORGANIZATION ACT OF 1998"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as
- 2 the "PNP Organizational Reforms Act".

1	SEC. 2. Section 25 of Republic Act No. 6975, as
2	amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
3	"SEC. 25. Organization. – [The PNP shall
4	be headed by a Chief who shall be assisted by
5	two (2) deputy chiefs, one (1) for operations and
6	one (1) for administration, both of whom shall
7	be appointed by the President upon
8	recommendation of the Commission from
9	among the most senior and qualified officers in
10	the service: <i>Provided</i> , however, That in no case
11	shall any officer who has retired or is retirable
12	within six (6) months from his compulsory
13	retirement age be appointed as Chief of the
14	PNP.] The PNP shall be composed of a national
15	office, AREA COMMANDS, regional offices,
16	provincial offices, district offices, CITY
17	OFFICES and city or municipal stations.
18	At the national level, the [PNP shall

1 COMMAND GROUP COMPOSED OF THE 2 OFFICES OF THE CHIEF OF THE PNP. 3 DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE **PNP** FOR 4 ADMINISTRATION, THE DEPUTY CHIEF 5 OF THE PNP FOR OPERATIONS, AND THE 6 CHIEF OF THE DIRECTORIAL STAFF. THE 7 NATIONAL OFFICE shall [house the] HAVE A 8 directorial staff, [service staff] NATIONAL 9 AND ADMINISTRATIVE **OPERATIONAL** 10 SUPPORT UNITS, and special [support units] 11 POLICE OFFICES.

16At the regional level, the PNP shall have17POLICE regional offices, including that of the18National Capital Region POLICE OFFICE19(NCRPO), which may be divided into two (2)20separate regions without prejudice to the

 SERVICES AND PERSONNEL
 PROCEDURES, AND MISCELLANEOUS
 FUNCTIONS ASSIGNED BY THE CHIEF OF
 THE PNP;

7 (B) THE DIRECTORATE FOR 8 INTELLIGENCE SHALL ASSIST AND 9 ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN 10 ATTAINING INTELLIGENCE OBJECTIVES 11 THROUGH EFFECTIVE MANAGEMENT OF 12 ALL INTELLIGENCE AND 13 COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES OF THE PNP; 14

15 (C) THE DIRECTORATE FOR 16 OPERATIONS SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE 17 THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE 18 EXERCISE OF THE COMMAND, CONTROL, 19 DIRECTION. COORDINATION, AND 20 SUPERVISION OF ALL ACTIVITIES

CONCERNING OPERATIONS,
 EMPLOYMENT, AND DEPLOYMENT OF
 THE PNP;

4 (D) THE DIRECTORATE FOR
5 LOGISTICS SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE
6 THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE
7 ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT OF
8 LOGISTICS AND ITS FUNCTIONAL AREAS;

9 THE DIRECTORATE FOR PLANS (E) 10 SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF 11 OF THE PNP IN THE AREAS OF PLANS 12 AND PROGRAMS THAT ARE BEYOND THE 13 IMMEDIATE OPERATIONAL AND 14 TACTICAL RANGE. THIS **INCLUDES** 15 ORGANIZATIONAL AND FORCE 16 DEVELOPMENT, SPECIAL STUDIES. 17 **RESEARCH AND PROJECT MANAGEMENT** 18 OF INTER-AGENCY AND INTERNATIONAL 19 AFFAIRS, LEGISLATIVE AND OTHER 20 **REQUIREMENTS THAT ARE NEEDED FOR** 1 THE EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT 2 ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATION OF 3 THE PNP;

4 (F) THE DIRECTORATE FOR
5 COMPTROLLERSHIP SHALL ASSIST AND
6 ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP ON
7 BUDGETING, ACCOUNTING, FINANCIAL
8 MANAGEMENT, AND INTERNAL
9 AUDITING MATTERS;

10 THE DIRECTORATE FOR POLICE (G) 11 COMMUNITY RELATIONS SHALL ASSIST 12 AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN 13 PLANNING. DIRECTING. COORDINATING. AND 14 SUPERVISING THE 15 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SUSTAINABLE 16 PROGRAMS FOR INSTITUTIONAL IMAGE 17 BUILDING; CITIZENS' PARTICIPATION IN 18 THE MAINTENANCE OF PUBLIC ORDER 19 INCLUDING PEACE POLICY FOR SOCIO-20 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: VALUE

ORIENTATION AND CONTINUING
 EDUCATION; GENDER AWARENESS AND
 DEVELOPMENT; AND AUXILIARY FORCE
 MULTIPLIER DEVELOPMENT;

5 (H) THE DIRECTORATE FOR 6 INVESTIGATION AND DETECTIVE SHALL ASSIST 7 MANAGEMENT AND 8 ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE 9 INVESTIGATION ACTIVITIES OF THE PNP:

10 THE DIRECTORATE (I) FOR TRAINING, EDUCATION, AND DOCTRINE 11 12 AND DEVELOPMENT SHALL ASSIST 13 ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE 14 FORMULATION OF POLICIES AND IN THE COORDINATION, 15 PLANNING, AND 16 SUPERVISION OF ALL MATTERS PERTAINING TO TRAINING, EDUCATION 17 18 AND DOCTRINE DEVELOPMENT;

1 (J) THE DIRECTORATE FOR 2 RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT SHALL 3 ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE 4 PNP IN THE CONDUCT OF RESEARCH 5 AND DEVELOPMENT; TEST AND 6 EVALUATION OF CLOTHING, MATERIAL, VEHICLES, AND EQUIPMENT; ISSUANCE 7 8 OF ACCREDITATION TO 9 MANUFACTURERS AND SUPPLIERS OF PNP UNIFORMS AND ACCOUTERMENTS; 10 11 FORMULATION AND IMPLEMENTATION 12 OF PNP POLICIES ON THE WEARING OF 13 PNP UNIFORMS: AND IN THE 14 IMPLEMENTATION AND 15 ADMINISTRATION OF THE PNP SELF-16 RELIANT DEVELOPMENT POSTURE PROGRAMS, WHICH ARE IMPORTANT TO 17 18 PEACE AND ORDER AND PUBLIC SAFETY: 19 AND

1 (K) THE DIRECTORATE FOR 2 INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS 3 TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT SHALL 4 ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE 5 PNP IN THE FORMULATION OF POLICY 6 AND MANAGING INFORMATION. 7 ELECTRONICS AND COMMUNICATIONS 8 TECHNOLOGY RESOURCES TO PROMOTE, 9 DEVELOP AND REGULATE INTEGRATED 10 STRATEGIC ICT SYSTEMS AND RELIABLE 11 AND EFFICIENT COMMUNICATIONS 12 INFRASTRUCTURE. IT SHALL PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN RELIABLE, SECURED, 13 INTEGRATED, AND COST-EFFICIENT 14 15 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND 16 COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES AND FACILITIES TO ALL PNP OFFICES AND 17 18 UNITS. IT SHALL LIKEWISE BE 19 RESPONSIBLE FOR THEDESIGN. 20 IMPLEMENTATION AND MAINTENANCE

1	OF THE DATABASE SYSTEM OF THE
2	ORGANIZATION AND THE DEVELOPMENT
3	OF THE ANTI-CYBERCRIME CAPABILITIES
4	OF THE PNP TO ADDRESS THE GROWING
5	INCIDENCE OF CYBERCRIME IN THE
6	COUNTRY."
7	SEC. 4. A new Section 25-B is hereby inserted in R. A.
8	No. 6975, as amended, to read as follows:
9	"SEC. 25-B. AREA POLICE COMMANDS
10	(APC). – IN ORDER TO ENHANCE THE
11	CONTROL OF THE CHIEF OF THE PNP,
12	AREA POLICE COMMANDS SHALL BE
13	ESTABLISHED IN CLUSTERED POLICE
14	REGIONAL OFFICES. THE APC SHALL
15	ORCHESTRATE, SUPERVISE, AND
16	CONTROL THE CONDUCT OF
17	INTER-REGIONAL OPERATIONS AGAINST
18	INSURGENCY, TERRORISM, AND OTHER
19	INTERNAL SECURITY THREATS.
20	FURTHER, THE APC SHALL LIKEWISE

1 CONDUCT SEARCH, RESCUE, AND RELIEF 2 OPERATIONS IN TIMES OF CALAMITIES 3 AND OTHER EMERGENCY SITUATIONS 4 WITHIN THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS OF 5 JURISDICTION. FINALLY, THE APC SHALL 6 SUPPORT THE POLICE REGIONAL 7 OFFICES IN THE CONDUCT OF 8 INTER-REGIONAL ANTI-CRIMINALITY 9 OPERATIONS AND INVESTIGATION.

10 FOR THIS PURPOSE, THE APCs SHALL HAVE ADMINISTRATIVE 11 AND 12 OPERATIONAL CONTROL OVER THE EXISTING REGIONAL MOBILE FORCE 13 14 BATTALIONS WITHIN THEIR RESPECTIVE 15 AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY SUBJECT TO 16 THE EXERCISE OF THE POWER OF 17 DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY OF THE 18 CHIEF OF THE PNP.

19 INITIALLY, FIVE (5) APCs SHALL BE20 ACTIVATED NAMELY:

11	SEC. 5. A new Section 25-C is hereby inserted in R. A.
12	No. 6975, as amended, to read as follows:
13	"Sec. 25-C. SPECIAL POLICE OFFICES.
14	– THE PNP SHALL BE SUPPORTED BY
15	SPECIAL POLICE OFFICES WHICH SHALL
16	CONTINUE TO PERFORM THEIR SPECIFIC
17	FUNCTIONS AS FOLLOWS:
18	(A) PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE
19	ACADEMY. – HEADED BY A DIRECTOR

1 GENERAL, THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL 2 POLICE ACADEMY SHALL SERVE AS THE 3 PREMIER INSTITUTION FOR POLICE 4 EDUCATION, AND THE PRIMARY SOURCE 5 FOR COMMISSIONSHIP OF POLICE LIEUTENANTS. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE 6 7 ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND 8 CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK 9 OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL. THE 10 DIRECTOR SHALL SUPERVISE THE 11 ACADEMICS GROUP AND TACTICS GROUP 12 WHICH SHALL BE HEADED BY A DEAN OF 13 ACADEMICS AND COMMANDANT OF CADETS, RESPECTIVELY, BOTH WITH 14 15 THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER 16 GENERAL.

17 THE ACADEMY SHALL MAINTAIN
18 AND ENHANCE ITS TRAINING AND
19 ACADEMIC STANDARDS IN THE
20 PERFORMANCE OF ITS FUNCTIONS OF

1 INSTRUCTION, RESEARCH AND EXTENSION, PUBLIC SAFETY, SOCIAL 2 3 DEFENSE, AND INTERNAL SECURITY. IT 4 SHALL RECOMMEND ITS PLANS, 5 POLICIES, PROGRAMS, CURRICULA, AND 6 STANDARDS OF TEACHING AND TRAINING TO THE CHIEF OF THE PNP 7 FOR APPROVAL OF THE COMMISSION. 8 9 RELATIVE THERETO, IT SHALL ENJOY 10 AUTONOMY TO BUILD INFRASTRUCTURE, 11 ACQUIRE NECESSARY EQUIPMENT. 12 PROVIDE FOR THE NECESSARY PERSONNEL COMPLEMENT. ESTABLISH 13 14 ITS CORPS OF PROFESSORS AND INSTRUCTORS, AND RECOMMEND ITS 15 16 ANNUAL BUDGET TO THE CHIEF OF THE 17 PNP.

18 THERE SHALL BE A CORPS OF
19 PROFESSORS AND INSTRUCTORS IN THE
20 PNPA. THE PNP AND THE COMMISSION,

1 CONSULTATION WITH THE IN CIVIL 2 SERVICE COMMISSION AND OTHER 3 RELEVANT AGENCIES SHALL CREATE. 4 DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A SYSTEM OF 5 FACULTY, PLACEMENT, PROMOTION AND 6 DEVELOPMENT IN VIEW OF EDUCATING. 7 TRAINING, AND PREPARING THE FUTURE POLICE COMMISSIONED OFFICERS WITH 8 9 THE HIGHEST STANDARD OF PERSONAL 10 INTEGRITY AND PROFESSIONAL 11 COMPETENCE. UNIFORMED AND NON-12 UNIFORMED PERSONNEL MAY BE 13 APPOINTED TO THE CORPS OF 14 PROFESSORS AND INSTRUCTORS UPON 15 THEIR APPLICATION OR UPON THE 16 DIRECTION OF THE CHIEF OF THE PNP. LIKEWISE, CIVILIAN PROFESSORS MAY 17 18 BE ADMITTED TO THE CORPS OF 19 PROFESSORS AND INSTRUCTORS:

PROVIDED, THAT THE SALARIES, GRANTS

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1 HUMAN RESOURCE AND BENEFITS. 2 DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS. OTHER 3 INCENTIVES, AND TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF WORK OF THE CORPS OF 4 5 PROFESSORS AND INSTRUCTORS SHALL 6 BE PROVIDED FOR IN THE GUIDELINES 7 PROMULGATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH 8 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT.

9 THE STUDENT BODY OF THE PNPA 10 SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE CADET CORPS 11 OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE 12 (CCPNP). THE PNPA SHALL CONDUCT THE ADMISSION PROGRAM AND SELECTION 13 14 CADETS: PROVIDED, THAT OF THE REQUIREMENTS 15 ADMISSION AND 16 QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION TO 17 THE CADETSHIP PROGRAM AS WELL AS 18 THE ANNUAL QUOTA THEREOF SHALL BE 19 RECOMMENDED BY THE CHIEF OF THE

PNP FOR APPROVAL OF THE
 COMMISSION.

3 (B) STRATEGY MANAGEMENT 4 CENTER – HEADED BY A POLICE 5 BRIGADIER GENERAL. THE CENTER SHALL SERVE AS THE CENTRAL FACILITY 6 7 OF THE ORGANIZATION IN 8 COORDINATING AND INTEGRATING ALL 9 STRATEGY MANAGEMENT PROCESSES. 10 SUSTAINING ITS STRATEGY EXECUTION 11 AND MANAGEMENT, AND INSTILLING IN 12 THE ORGANIZATION A CULTURE OF STRATEGIC FOCUS. 13

14 (C) HUMAN RIGHTS AFFAIRS 15 OFFICE – HEADED BY A POLICE 16 BRIGADIER GENERAL. THE OFFICE 17 SHALL SERVE AS A MANAGEMENT 18 FACILITY THAT WILL OVERSEE THE 19 IMPLEMENTATION OF PNP GUIDELINES 20 AND POLICIES ON HUMAN RIGHTS LAWS.

1 (D) PEACE PROCESS AND 2 DEVELOPMENT CENTER - HEADED BY A 3 POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE 4 CENTER SHALL BE THE OFFICE 5 PRIMARILY RESPONSIBLE IN THE MONITORING OF THE DEVELOPMENT 6 7 AND IMPLEMENTATION OF PEACE 8 AGREEMENTS AND PERTINENT LAWS.

9 (E) COMMAND CENTER – HEADED 10 BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL. THE 11 CENTER SHALL BE THE MAIN 12 MONITORING FACILITY OF THE PNP OF ALL EVENTS AFFECTING THE PEACE AND 13 14 ORDER SITUATION NATIONWIDE. IT SERVE AS 15 SHALL THE MAIN 16 COORDINATING CENTER FOR ALL 17 OPERATING AND SUPPORT UNITS IN 18 PURSUANCE OF PNP LAW ENFORCEMENT, INTERNAL SECURITY, 19 20 SPECIAL OPERATIONS, AND

RECORDS/STATISTICS COMPILATION
 FUNCTIONS.

3 (F) PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICE -4 HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER 5 GENERAL. THE OFFICE SHALL SUPERVISE. EVALUATE. AND MONITOR 6 7 THE PROVISION OF RELEVANT 8 INFORMATION ON ONGOING PNP 9 PROGRAMS, PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES 10 TO ENHANCE THE UNDERSTANDING OF 11 THE GENERAL PUBLIC AND ULTIMATELY 12 GAIN COMMUNITY SUPPORT AND ACTIVE 13 PARTICIPATION.

14 (G) LIAISON OFFICE FOR THE 15 **OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT – HEADED BY** 16 A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE 17 OFFICE SHALL SERVE AS AN EXTENSION 18 OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHIEF OF THE 19 PNP TO ASSIST THE PRESIDENT AND THE 20 EXECUTIVE SECRETARY ON THE 1 DIFFERENT ASPECTS OF LAW 2 ENFORCEMENT AND ACT AS THE MAIN 3 FOCAL POINT COORDINATION OF 4 BETWEEN THE PNP AND THE OFFICE OF 5 THE PRESIDENT.

6 (H) LIAISON OFFICE FOR THE 7 DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND 8 LOCAL GOVERNMENT (DILG) – HEADED 9 BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE 10 OFFICE SHALL ASSIST THE SECRETARY 11 IN HIS CAPACITY AS THE EX-OFFICIO 12 CHAIRPERSON OF THE COMMISSION.

13 (I) LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS CENTER – 14 HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER 15 GENERAL, THE CENTER SHALL ACT AS 16 THE PERMANENT PNP REPRESENTATIVE 17 DURING CONGRESSIONAL HEARINGS 18 AND DELIBERATIONS AS WELL AS 19 UNDERTAKE NECESSARY ACTIONS TO 20 PURSUE THE PASSAGE OF PNP PRIORITY
