

RESOLUTION

COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE MEMBERS OF THE PHILIPPINE TEAM FOR THEIR EXEMPLARY PERFORMANCE IN THE 19TH ASIAN GAMES HELD IN HANGZHOU, CHINA

1 WHEREAS, Article XIV, Section 19 of the Philippine Constitution further 2 mandates that "the State shall promote physical education and encourage 3 sports programs, league competitions, and amateur sports, including training 4 for international competitions, to foster self-discipline, teamwork and 5 excellence for the development of a healthy and alert citizenry.";

6 WHEREAS, the Philippine Senate, on several occasions, paid tribute to 7 outstanding Filipinos for their remarkable contribution, which gained them 8 international recognition, thereby bringing glory and honor to our country;

9 WHEREAS, the Asian Games is a continental multi-sport event held once 10 every four years among athletes from all over Asia;

11 WHEREAS, the country concluded its participation in the 19th Asian 12 Games by achieving a commendable feat of securing a total of 18 medals, which 13 are broken down as follows: 4 gold medals; 2 silver medals; and 12 bronze 14 medals;

WHEREAS, the national basketball team, "Gilas Pilipinas", captured the country's first men's basketball gold medal since 1962. This achievement was marked by their stunning victory over host China in the semifinals, followed by an impressive triumph against Jordan in the finals;

WHEREAS, Ernest John Obiena successfully secured the country's first gold medal in the 19th Asian Games. He emerged as the sole athlete to clear the 5.75m mark, thereby earning the gold medal, and establishing a new Asian Games record of 5.90m;

23 WHEREAS, Margarita 'Meggie' Ochoa, and Annie Ramirez won 2 gold 24 medals in the women's 48kgs, and 57kgs Jiu-Jitsu competitions, respectively. 25 Their win has not only brought honor and glory to our nation, but also has also 1 become an inspiration to the youth and for the promotion of women 2 empowerment;
