RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC INFORMATION AND MASS MEDIA TO CONDUCT AN INVESTIGATION, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE ROLE OF MEDIA IN THE DISSEMINATION OF PUBLIC INFORMATION DURING TIMES OF CONFLICT

WHEREAS, Section 24, Article II of the 1987 Constitution provides that it is a State policy to recognize the vital role of communication and information in nation-building;

WHEREAS, the mass media, which has also been regarded as the fourth branch of government, plays an undeniable role in a healthy and functioning democracy;

WHEREAS, the present generation bears witness to various sorts of global geographic and political tension stemming from unresolved conflicts in the past, which according to an economist, 'continue to cause enormous human suffering and substantial economic and social costs';

WHEREAS, one example of such is the armed conflict between Russia and Ukraine which caused a tremendous impact on a developing nation like the Philippines, as it exacerbates long-existing issues including soaring inflation, fuel shortages, and food insecurity, among others;

WHEREAS, the Philippine government, through the Department of Foreign Affairs, has also expressed its alarm over the increasing tension between Israel and Iran, as retaliation from both nations continues to escalate despite the international pressure to call off the attacks;

WHEREAS, the escalating territorial and maritime dispute in the South China Sea which poses potential threats to the entire ASEAN region, inadvertently put the Philippines in a potential crisis situation;

WHEREAS, a survey conducted by OCTA research in the fourth guarter of 2023 revealed that 72 percent of Filipinos favor asserting territorial rights through expanded naval patrols and troop presence, a significant increase from previous polls;

WHEREAS, against this backdrop, it is crucial for Filipinos to be well informed of the consequences of our political inclination and possible courses of action should these aforementioned global conflicts escalate;

WHEREAS, in critical times like this, experience tells us that the mass media, which is considered truth-tellers, plays a vital role in affecting public perception pertinent to existing conflicts;

WHEREAS, it is imperative that the media relays accurate and timely information to the public on pressing issues, particularly on present global conflicts with the end view of raising awareness and enabling citizens to prepare and make sound decisions for themselves;

WHEREAS, no less than President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. underscored the importance of media in leading and fostering public discussion, truth and credibility, the rule of law especially in the practice of broadcasting, news reporting and information-dissemination: Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, as it is hereby resolved, To direct the Senate Committee on Public Information and Mass Media to conduct an investigation, in aid of legislation, on the role of media in the dissemination of public information during times of conflict.
