AN ACT

REQUIRING ALL GRADUATING SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE STUDENTS TO PLANT TWO (2) TREES EACH AS A CIVIC DUTY FOR ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION AND PRESERVATION, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Philippines faces significant environmental challenges, including deforestation, loss of biodiversity, and climate change. Forests are essential in maintaining ecological balance, supporting biodiversity, and regulating the climate by absorbing carbon dioxide. However, the nation's natural landscapes have been negatively harmed by deforestation and forest degradation. By mandating tree planting for graduating students, the bill directly addresses these challenges, contributing to reforestation and ecological restoration efforts.



AN ACT

REQUIRING ALL GRADUATING SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE STUDENTS TO PLANT TWO (2) TREES EACH AS A CIVIC DUTY FOR ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION AND PRESERVATION, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	ARTICLE I
2	GENERAL PROVISIONS
3	Section 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "Graduating Students for
4	Reforestation Act of 2024".
5	Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy It is the declared policy of the State to protect and
6	advance the right of the Filipino people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord
7	with the rhythm and harmony of nature. Towards this end, the State shall promote and
8	pursue reforestation programs and encourage tree plantings as a means of involving the
9	youth in public and civic affairs.
10	Sec. 3. Tree-planting as a Mandatory Requisite for Graduation - All graduating
1 1	students from senior high school, and college shall be required to plant at least two (2)
12	trees as a mandatory prerequisite for their graduation. The tree planting activity shall be
13	their first act of public service as they enter the country's labor force.
14	Sec. 4. Location The trees to be planted under this Act shall be located in suitable
15	lands and areas as determined by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources

1 (DENR) and local government units, in coordination with schools, colleges and2 universities.

3 Sec. 5. *Preference for Indigenous Species.* - The species of trees to be planted 4 should be appropriate to the location, climate and topography of the area with preference 5 for the planting of indigenous species.

6 Sec. 6. *Partner Agencies and Stakeholders.* - The Department of Education 7 (DepEd) and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) shall implement the provisions 8 of this Act, in partnership with the following agencies:

- a. Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR);
- 10 b. Department of Agriculture (DA);
- 11 c. Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG);
- 12 d. Department of Science and Technology (DOST); and
- e. National Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCP)
- 14 The responsibility of these agencies shall include:
- 15 1. Establishment of nursery and preparation of seedlings;
- 16 2. Site identification and preparation;
- 17 3. Technical support and extension service; and
- 18 4. Monitoring and evaluation.

Sec. 7. *Provision of Seedlings.* - The Community Environment and Natural Resources Office (CENRO) of the Department of Environment and Natural Resource (DENR) and the Department of Agriculture (DA), in partnership with local government units (LGUs) throughout the Philippines, shall maintain a seedling bank and will serve as ready source of seedlings to be provided to senior high schools, colleges and universities for the implementation of this Act.

Sec. 8. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* - The DepEd and CHED, in coordination with DENR and DILG, and in consultation with other agencies, shall promulgate and Issue the implementing rules and regulations (IRR) necessary to implement this Act within sixty (60) days after its approval.

1 Sec. 9. *Appropriations.* - The amount necessary to carry out the provisions of this 2 Act shall be included in the budgets of the implementing departments/agencies in the 3 annual General Appropriations Act.

Sec. 10. *Separability Clause.* - Should any provision of this Act be declared unconstitutional, the remainder thereof not otherwise affected shall remain in full force and effect

Sec. 11. *Repealing Clause.* - All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders,
proclamations or administrative regulations that are inconsistent with the provisions of
this Act are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

10 Sec. 12. *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete 11 publication in at least two newspapers of general publication.
