AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11696, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "MARAWI SIEGE VICTIMS COMPENSATION ACT OF 2022"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 11696 or the "Marawi Siege Victims 1 Compensation Act of 2022" is hereby amended to read as follows: 2 "Sec. 3. 9	Sec. 2. Section 11 of Republic Act No. 11696 or the "Marawi Siege Victims
10	Compensation Act of 2022" is hereby amended to read as follows:
11	"Sec. 11. Secretariat of the Board. – The Board shall be assisted by a Secretariat
12	[which shall come from the existing personnel of the Department of Human
13	Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD), without prejudice to the hiring
14	of additional personnel as determined by the Board to accommodate the
15	volume of required work]. The following shall be the function of the Secretariat:
16	(a) Receive, evaluate, process and investigate applications for claims
17	under this Act;
18	(b) Recommend to the Board the approval of applications for claims;
19	(c) Assist the Board to technical functions; and
20	(d) Perform other duties that shall be assigned by the Board.
21	The Chairperson of the Board shall appoint a Board Secretary who shall head
22	the Secretariat for the duration of the existence of the Board. The Board
23	Secretary shall have a technical staff composed of legal and administrative
24	personnel wherein the staff plantilla positions and salaries shall be determined
25	in the implementing rules and regulations. When necessary, the Board may hire
26	additional personnel [consistent with issuances of the Civil Service Commission]

IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS, RULES AND

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REGULATIONS."

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Sec. 3. Section 15 of Republic Act No. 11696 or the "Marawi Siege Victims Compensation Act of 2022" is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 15. Determination of Monetary Compensation. -

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(a) The Board shall determine the monetary compensation and award of the lawful owner(s)[, whichever is the lower amount of either the fair market value of the residential, cultural, commercial structures, or other real properties or the value of its total area per storey equivalent to an amount to be determined in the implementing rules and regulations of this Act | BASED ON THE VALUE OF THE TOTAL AREA PER STOREY OF THE RESIDENTIAL, CULTURAL, **COMMERCIAL STRUCTURES, OR OTHER REAL PROPERTIES** EQUIVALENT TO REPLACEMENT OR REPAIR COST AS IN THE IMPLEMENTING **RULES AND** DETERMINED **REGULATIONS (IRR) OF THIS ACT**. In case of claims for loss or destruction of personal properties, the claimant shall present competent evidence of the loss or destruction, ownership, as well as the fair market value of the personal properties. IN ABSENCE OF SUBSTANTIAL PROOF OF FAIR MARKET VALUE FROM THE OWNER, STANDARD VALUATION AS DETERMINED IN THE IRR SHALL BE USED AS BASIS OF THE VALUE OF SUCH PERSONAL PROPERTY.

(b) xxx."

Sec. 5. Extension of Period of Filing Claims. – Claims for compensation by the additional barangays included in the OAA under this Act shall be filed with the Board within one (1) year from the effectivity of this Act: *Provided,* That failure to file an application within the same period shall be deemed a waiver of the right to file the same: *Provided, Further,* That the Board shall publish in two (2) newspapers of general circulation the period of commencement and termination of applications by property owners.

Sec. 6. Retroactive Effect. – The new basis for the monetary compensation and
award shall have retroactive effect for all those claimants who already received their
awards from the Monetary Compensation Board prior to the effectivity of this Act.

- Sec. 7. *Sunset Clause*. The Board shall complete its work within three (3) years from the effectivity of the IRR. After such period, it shall become *functus officio*.
- Sec. 8. *Separability Clause*. If any portion or provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provisions not affected thereby shall remain in force and effect.
 - Sec. 9. *Repealing Clause.* Section 22 of Republic Act No. 11696 is hereby repealed. All laws, decrees, orders, rules, and regulations and executive orders contrary to or inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
 - Sec. 10. *Effectivity.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
