He opined that this should not be the case because the issuance of protocol plates is pursuant to an executive order. He requested the Secretariat to look into the matter.

On another matter, Senator Arroyo inquired why the clock on the right side of the chair of the Senate President in the session hall has not been working for over a year and why the timer below the clock at the far end of the hall has not been working either.

The Chair instructed the Secretariat to inquire into the matter of the protocol plates and to have the clock and timer in the session hall fixed.
