REQUEST OF SENATOR PIMENTEL

At this juncture, Senator Pimentel noted that the report he submitted to the Secretariat regarding the seminar on federalism he attended in Fribourg University in Geneva was referred to the Committee on Local Government. He suggested that the report be simply archived considering that he did not ask for any action on the report because it was merely a communication for the information of all the senators.

Acting on Senator Pimentel's request, the Chair sent the Senator's report to the Archives.

SECOND ADDITIONAL REFERENCE OF BUSINESS

The Secretary of the Senate read Proposed Senate Resolution No. 50, which the Chair referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations, entitled

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE SECRETARY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS TO INQUIRE WITH THE HOUSE OF COUNCILORS OF JAPAN (THE DIET OF JAPAN) THE STATUS OF THE LEGISLATION PROMOTING THE RESOLUTION OF ISSUES CON-CERNING VICTIMS OF WARTIME SEXUAL COERCION.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF THE PRESENCE OF GUESTS

At this juncture, Senator Pangilinan acknowledged the presence of Mayor Sylvia Adame, Vice-Mayor Danilo Gibincan, and other elected officials of the Municipality of Dimiao, Province of Bohol.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF SENATOR ROXAS

Availing himself of the privilege hour, Senator Roxas brought to the attention of the Body the hearing undertaken by the Committee on Oversight and Government Reforms of the U.S. House of Representatives, chaired by Representative Henry Waxman of California, on allegations of waste, fraud and abuse at the new American embassy in Iraq.

He stated that in that committee hearing, Mr. Rory Mayberry, a contractor of First Kuwaiti Trading and Contracting Company (FKTCC), one of the companies contracted to build the U.S. Embassy in Iraq, testified that he accompanied 51 Filipinos to Baghdad who thought that they were going to Dubai since their contracts stipulated so, only to be told later of their true destination. He added that Mr. Mayberry had also testified that these Filipinos worked under terrible conditions without proper gears like gloves, safety harnesses and shoes.

Senator Roxas stated that in the course of his research on the matter, he came across a statement from the U.S. State Department denying the mistreatment of foreign workers during the construction of the U.S. Embassy in Iraq; and another statement from Ambassador Ricardo Endaya that in 2004, when he was charge d'affaires in Baghdad, he investigated complaints of overseas Filipino workers (OFWs) against the FKTCC regarding salary, overtime pay and accommodations.

Senator Roxas pointed out that Philippine passports precisely bear the notation "Not Valid for Travel to Iraq" to safeguard OFWs, bearing in mind the experience of Angelo dela Cruz. Therefore, he stressed, bringing those Filipino workers to Baghdad was a clear violation of said policy.

Senator Roxas said that he brought the matter to the attention of the Members so that the Senate could inquire into the status of the 51 Filipinos who joined about 10,000 other OFWs who have slipped back into Iraq to seek employment. He expressed concern for the OFWs who are being tricked by unscrupulous contractors and whose safety was being jeopardized simply because they could not find work in the Philippines.

Senator Roxas said that he has filed a resolution asking the appropriate agencies of government to look into the matter, the result of which he would report to the Body. As regards the resolution, he expressed hope that the it would be referred to the appropriate committee as soon as it is organized.

QUESTION OF PRIVILEGE OF SENATOR PIMENTEL

Rising to a question of personal and collective privilege, as Minority Leader, Senator Pimentel stated that the solid eight opposition senators stand for principled cooperation with all agencies of government and they would not be obstructionists in the Senate. Nonetheless, he said, the opposition senators would continue to denounce corruption and extrajudicial killings, and espouse that the rule of law be upheld.

In this regard, Senator Pimentel took note of the use of vehicles and equipment of the Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA) to widen the roads in Bacoor, Cavite which is not part of Metro Manila, allegedly upon orders of the President of the Philippines, to ease the traffic in the area. In this instance, he said, while the intention was good, the President misused her power anew. He stated that it was time the Senate stood up to the President and say that it would not tolerate such abuse.

He clarified that he was not picking a fight with the MMDA chairman who, he believed, has done a lot of good for Metro Manila in the course of which he sometimes clashed with local officials. Nonetheless, he maintained that not even the President can order a government agency like the MMDA to do things outside of its area of jurisdiction. He expressed hope that the proper Senate committee would look into the matter.

On another matter, Senator Pimentel expressed his appreciation that Senator Angara has made a report on his trip to Spain. However, he expressed concern that Senator Angara entered into a parliamentary cooperation agreement with Spain in the name of the Senate. In view of this development, he believed it was time the Body took note that any senator acting for and in behalf of the Senate must coperly authorized to do so. He expressed hope c Senator Angara had been duly authorized to iter into the agreement.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

Upon motion of Senator Pangilinan, the session was suspended.

At 4:42 p.m., the session was resumed.

REMARKS OF SENATOR ANGARA

Senator Angara expressed appreciation to Senator Pimentel for praising the Senate delegation's report. Even the Spaniards, he said, hailed the cooperation agreement as a landmark, the first of its kind signed by the Senate of Spain. He assured the Body that he had been authorized by the Senate President to negotiate, conclude, and execute the agreement.

The Senate President confirmed that he did authorize Senator Angara.

REFERRAL OF QUESTION OF PRIVILEGE TO COMMITTEE

Upon motion of Senator Pangilinan, there being no objection, the Chair referred Senator Pimentel's question of privilege, with respect to the MMDA, to the Committee on Local Government.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

Upon motion of Senator Pangilinan, the session was suspended.
