## EXPLANATORY NOTE

The government is in a continuing quest to search for fast-approaches to solve problems of bureaucratic procedures. Red tape has been the focus of complaints of many who queue in government offices. It is not surprising therefore, that a number of treatises on public administration validated the impressions imprinted in the minds of common civilians anent the inefficiency plaguing the governmental workforce as well as the leadership itself.

The problem accounts as a primary reason for the failure of bringing governmental effort closer to the people. And just like us, other countries are on the look out to experiment on innovative approaches to solve red tape. But the experiences of such countries as Germany, Japan, Indonesia, South Africa and Malaysia provide examples in addressing the said bureaucratic system through the ID System. In these countries, government transactions are easily facilitated and immediately responded to with the use of ID.

This bill seeks to establish an effective system to curb the perennial problems of red tape in the bureaucracy and to simplify the process relative to public and private transactions of citizens. It is also aimed at preserving national security by institutionalizing an effective system of monitoring the movement and activities of citizens so that investigation and prosecution of criminal acts as well as civil liabilities could be more easily facilitated.

Early approval of this bill is earnestly requested.

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## Introduced by SENATOR EDGARDO J. ANGARA

## AN ACT ESTABLISHING A NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM IN THE PHILIPPINES, CONSTITUTING FOR THE PURPOSE THE NATIONAL REGISTRATION COORDINATING COUNCIL, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Title. - This Act shall be known as "The National
 Multi-Purpose ID Card Act of 2007."

3

4 SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is hereby declared a policy of 5 the State to improve and uplift public service in the country, by promoting 6 and facilitating legitimate transactions with Government offices as well as 7 with private and business entities. For this purpose, there is a need to 8 establish an effective system to curb the perennial problem of red tape in the 9 bureaucracy and to simplify the processes relative to public and private 10 transactions.

It is likewise an imperative policy to strengthen citizenship,
immigration and national security laws.

13 The implementation of a National Identification System in this regard, 14 with full protection accorded to the right to privacy of the individuals covered 15 thereby, and with the full cooperation and active participation of various 16 basic services and social security- providing agencies and other Government 17 instrumentalities, will contribute to the attainment of the foregoing 18 declaration of policy.

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20 SECTION 3. Definition of Terms. - The following terms as used in
 21 this Act shall mean:

(a) "ID Card" - The national identification card issued by a
 participating agency in the implementation of the National

1 Identification System, the features and uses of which are as 2 indicated in this Act and as to be determined by the Council; provided, that the ID Card shall be used only by the Owner in 3 order to avail of the services defined in this Act; provided, further, 4 that the ID Card shall not be used to store data on the Owner more 5 than is necessary and material as required in this Act; 6

- 7 (b) "ID Number" - The Primary Reference Number determined by the National Statistics Office and issued to every citizen of the 8 Philippines; or the number issued by the Bureau of Immigration to 9 every foreign national who applies for an Alien Certificate of 10 Registration pursuant to Republic Act No. 562 (1950), as amended; 11
- (c) "Council" The National Registration Coordinating Council 12 constituted under this Act; 13
- (d) "NSO" The National Statistics Office created pursuant to 14 Commonwealth Act No. 591 (1940), as amended; 15
- (e) "System" The National Identification System established and 16 authorized for implementation pursuant to this Act; 17
- 18 (f) "Owner" - The only authorized holder, possessor and user of the ID Card; 19
- (g) "Data" The personal and other circumstances of the person to 20 whom was issued a National Identification Card, all of which are 21 encoded in said ID Card, and kept in the records of the 22 23 participating agencies;
- (h) "Use" The authorized functional use of the ID Card pursuant to 24 this Act and as may be hereafter prescribed by the Council; 25
- "Participating Agency" A branch, agency, subdivision or 26 (i) instrumentality of the Government of the Republic of the 27 Philippines, accredited by the Council to implement the National 28 Identification System. 29
- 30

SECTION 4. The National Identification System. - A National 31 Identification System is hereby established and instituted, to provide official 32 identification of all citizens of the Republic of the Philippines, and all foreign 33 nationals permanently residing in the Philippines, through the issuance of a 34 National Identification Card with ID Number of a permanent character, to 35 convert and consolidate all existing Government-initiated identification 36

1 systems intended for various purposes into one, integrated and multi-purpose

2 system.

3

SECTION 5. Issuance of Primary ID Number. - All citizens of the 4 5 Republic of the Philippines, upon registration of birth or upon their acquisition of Philippine citizenship, shall be issued by the NSO a Primary 6 Reference Number, which shall serve as the identification number. The 7 8 Primary Reference Number shall reflect only the basic data on the Owner of 9 the ID. Card Such Primary Reference Number issued to a citizen shall not be 10 transferable to another, and shall remain his/her number regardless of any 11 change in his/her status, residence or other personal circumstances. For this 12 purpose, the NSO shall, in the determination of the Primary Reference Number, devise a system of issuing such numbers with due regard to the 13 immutability of such number in relation to the person to whom it was issued. 14

All such citizens born before the effectivity of this Act, or who acquired
Philippine citizenship before the effectivity of this Act, shall secure their
Primary Reference Number from the NSO.

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19 SECTION 6. Issuance of Subsidiary ID Numbers. - The 20 participating agencies in the System may issue subsidiary numbers to the 21 Primary ID Number issued under Section 5 hereof, with due regard to the 22 requirements of such agencies and under such conditions as the Council shall 23 prescribe.

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SECTION 7. Citizens of Other Countries. - Citizens of other countries permanently residing in the Philippines shall likewise be assigned an ID Number and issued an ID Card at reasonable cost in the manner prescribed by the Bureau of Immigration; provided, that the assignment of an ID Number and issuance of the corresponding ID Card shall be done not later than the date of issuance of the Alien Certificate of Registration issued pursuant to Republic Act No. 562 (1950), as amended.

An accredited official of a recognized international organization, or of a foreign government with whom the Republic of the Philippines has established diplomatic relations, and members of his/her family and official staff, who are not citizens of the Philippines, shall not be required to secure an ID Number or the ID Card contemplated under this Act.

SECTION 8. Issuance of the ID Card. - All persons qualified under 1 2 Section 4 and Section 5, respectively, hereof shall be issued by any of the participating agencies a National Identification Card not earlier than at the 3 age of sixteen (16) years, free of charge and in the manner prescribed by the 4 Council; provided, that in case a participating agency requires the issuance of 5 an ID Card for those transacting business with it who may be younger than 6 sixteen (16) years old, such agency shall do so under such conditions as the 7 8 Council shall prescribe.

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SECTION 9. Features of the ID Card. - The National Identification Card shall be made of a tamper-proof security material. It shall have on its 11 face the ID Number, the imprinted photograph, name, birth date, date of 12 issue, signature of the Owner, and such other material and necessary data as 13 may be required by the Council and the participating agencies. 14

The Council shall likewise establish the standards in the use of 15 biometric technology and in computer application designs of the System. 16

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SECTION 10. Validity of the ID Card. - The ID Card shall be valid 18 effective upon its issuance by the participating agency, and for as long as the 19 20 material of which it is made permits its usage, unless sooner cancelled upon the death of the Owner, or surrendered by the Owner, or revoked, cancelled 21 or recalled by the participating agency for good cause shown. 22

The ID Card may be replaced during its validity period, upon written 23 application by the owner of the ID Card, to reflect the changed circumstances 24 25 of the Owner.

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SECTION 11. Issuance of Replacement Card. - A new ID Card 27 which replaces a lost, worn-out or destroyed card, or upon written application 28 29 by the Owner, shall be issued by a participating agency in the manner to be prescribed by the Council. 30

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SECTION 12. Safeguards. - The Council and the participating 32 agencies shall take appropriate and necessary measures to ensure that the 33 34 privacy, confidentiality, integrity and accuracy of an individual's personal 35 data are protected from unwarranted and unauthorized access. Such safeguards shall, as a minimum, include the following: 36

1 (a) The Council and the participating agencies shall limit the number 2 of persons who can have access to the data on the ID Card; (b) The ID Card will be protected by advanced security features and 3 cryptographic technology; 4 (c) The Council shall ensure that only minimal, material and necessary 5 data to the Owner and to the participating agency issuing the ID 6 Card shall be recorded and stored in the ID Card; 7 (d) There will be a stringent system of access control, including 8 passwords or personal identification numbers; different levels of 9 access; and, audit trails; 10 (e) The Owner of the ID Card shall be provided with the means to 11 access, print and interpret the data on his/her card and the 12 application of such data; 13 (f) Any correction of relevant data stored in the ID Card shall be 14 effected only upon a written request by the Owner of the ID Card, 15 under such conditions as the participating agency issuing the ID 16 Card shall prescribe; and 17 (g) All data included in the database shall be kept and treated as 18 strictly confidential, and shall not be accessed or disclosed except 19 upon written authorization of the Owner and in accordance with 20 the requirements of Section 22 and Section 23, respectively, of this 21 22 Act. 23 SECTION 13. Non-transferability. - The ID number issued 24 pursuant to this Act is unique to the Owner of the ID Card. Both the ID 25

pursuant to this Act is unique to the Owner of the ID Card. Both the ID Number and the ID Card are non-transferable, and shall not be assigned to any other individual even after the death of its owner. For this purpose, the participating agency shall devise a system of retiring ID numbers no longer in use on account of death of the owners or for other reasons.

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31 SECTION 14. Limitation on Data to be Stored. - The right to 32 privacy of the Owner of the ID Card is paramount, and shall be respected by 33 the Council and the participating agencies in the implementation of the 34 System. For this purpose, only such data personal to the Owner of the ID 35 Card and which are material and necessary to carry out the functional uses of the ID Card as enumerated in Section 14 hereof shall be stored in the ID
 Card.

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4 SECTION 15. Functional Uses of the Card. - The National 5 Identification Card shall serve as the only official identification of the person 6 to whom it is issued and shall be valid and accepted for all legal intents and 7 purposes, which shall include, but hall not be limited to, the following:

- 8 (a) Availment of SSS and GSIS benefits;
  9 (b) Application for driver's license, passport, ma
- 9 (b) Application for driver's license, passport, marriage license, and 10 business permits;
- 11 (c) Issuance of death certificate;
- (d) Application for clearances, licenses and permits from investigative
  and police agencies;
- 14 (e) Availment of services in health and medical institutions;
- 15 (f) Application for employment;
- (g) Availment of benefits under Republic Act No. 7432 ("The Senior
  Citizens Law");
- (h) Pre-requisite for registration as a voter, and for the exercise of the
  right to vote;
- 20 (i) Payment of taxes, fees and other charges;
- 21 (j) Opening of bank accounts;
- 22 (k) Encashment of checks;
- 23 (1) Applications for loans, credit cards, and utilities;
- 24 (m) Purchase of stocks;
- 25 (n) Insurance claims;
- 26 (o) Receipts of payments, checks, valuables, etcetera; and
- 27 (p) Claiming mail matters.

Other functional uses of the ID Card shall be determined by theCouncil.

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31 SECTION 16. Absence of ID Card. - Failure of any person to present 32 his/her ID Card when transacting business with the Government or with 33 private entities requiring the use and presentation of the ID Card shall not 34 be a ground to deny or limit him/her of the basic Government and private 35 services as long as he/she is qualified under existing laws.

1 SECTION 17. National Registration Coordinating Council. - The 2 National Registration Coordinating Council is hereby constituted, which 3 shall be a collegial body, consisting of permanent representatives of various 4 government agencies with direct involvement in the development and 5 implementation of the System, to be appointed by their respective heads, including, but not limited to the Commission on Elections, the Department of 6 7 Foreign Affairs, the Department of Interior and Local Government, the Department of National Defense, the Bureau of Immigration, the National 8 9 Statistics Office, the Land Transportation Office, the Bureau of Internal Revenue, the Social Security System, the Government Service Insurance 10 11 System, and the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation.

12 The Council shall be assisted by a Secretariat, headed by an officer in 13 the NSO not lower in rank than a Director III, and with all the participating 14 agencies in the System represented therein.

15 The Administrator of the NSO shall serve as permanent chairman of16 the Council.

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18 SECTION 18. Powers and Functions of the Council. - The Council
 19 shall exercise the following powers and functions:

- 20 (a) To issue, adopt and prescribe implementing rules and regulations
  21 for the effective implementation of this Act;
- (b) To design the ID Card to be issued by the participating agencies,
  incorporating therein the basic features of the ID Card and the
  safeguards for its issuance and uses as indicated in this Act;
- (c) To adopt all measures to maintain the privacy and security of all
  personal information maintained or kept by the participating
  agencies and all private entities or institutions with existing
  databases or registries of individuals, to prevent their unauthorized
  disclosure and ensure the confidentiality and proper management
  of these personal data;
- 31 (d) To adopt rules and regulations for the registration of persons,
  32 entities or institutions handling registries or databases of personal
  33 data of individuals, and determine which personal information
  34 being obtained, kept or maintained should be deemed confidential;
- (e) Without prejudice to Section 19 hereof, to entertain, initiate, motu
   proprio or at the instance of the Owner of the ID Card, and endorse

1	to the Department of Justice any complaint for the criminal
2	prosecution of persons for any violation of the provisions of this Act;
3	(f) To adopt all measures to ensure the security, integrity and
4	authenticity of all ID Cards issued under the System;
5	(g) To conduct or hold extensive public information campaign on the
6	System in coordination with the Philippine Information Agency;
7	(h) To submit to Congress a written report of its operations and
8	activities within sixty (60) days after the opening of every regular
9	session; and
10	(i) To perform such other functions necessary to effectively implement
11	the provisions of this Act.
12	
13	SECTION 19. Assistance The Council shall call upon all branches,
14	agencies, subdivisions and instrumentalities of Government to assist and
15	cooperate with the Council in the effective implementation of the provisions
16	of this Act.
17	
18	SECTION 20. Enforcement by the Participating Agencies All
19	participating agencies shall have the power and authority to effectively
20	enforce the provisions of this Act.
21	In addition to their powers under their respective charters and under
22	the Code of 1987 (Executive Order No. 292), the participating agencies shall
23	have the power to issue cease and desist orders to prevent fraud or injury to
24	individuals whose rights to privacy may be violated with the collection and
25	use of personal data or information about him/her pursuant to the
26	implementation of this Act.
27	
28	SECTION 21. Prohibited Acts; Penalties The penalty of
29	imprisonment from six (6) months and one (1) day to six (6) years shall be
30	imposed upon any offender found guilty of the following acts or omissions:
31	(a) The willful submission, or causing to be submitted, of a fictitious
32	name and other false data in the application form for a National
33	Identification Card;
34	(b) The unauthorized printing, preparation or issuance of a National
35	Identification Card;

- (c) The falsification, mutilation, alteration of, or tampering with, the
   National Identification Card;

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- (d) The unauthorized use of a National Identification Card by any person other than the one to whom the card was issued; and
- (e) The possession of a fake, falsified or altered National Identification Card.

8 SECTION 22. *Refusal to Accept.* - Any person who shall willfully 9 and unjustifiably refuse to accept, acknowledge and/ or recognize the 10 National Identification Card as the only official identification of the Owner 11 thereof shall be liable to a penalty of a fine of not more than Twenty 12 Thousand Pesos

(Php20,000.00), at the discretion of the Court, for the first offense. Any
subsequent violation shall be punishable by a fine of not less than Fifty
Thousand Pesos (Php50,000.00) but not more than One Hundred Thousand
Pesos (Php100,000.00), at the discretion of the Court.

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SECTION 23. Confidentiality. - Without prejudice under existing 18 laws applicable to the participating agencies, the records, reports and 19 20 documents duly accomplished and submitted to a participating agency by the Owner of the ID Card, and any such records, reports and documents encoded 21 in the database of the participating agency and/or reflected in the ID Card, 22 shall be kept and treated as strictly confidential. They shall not be divulged 23 without the written consent of the Owner or pursuant to a lawful Court order 24 upon a prior endorsement by the participating agency, and shall be presumed 25 correct as to the data and other matters stated therein, unless the necessary 26 corrections to such records, reports and documents have been properly made 27 28 upon written authorization by the Owner.

29

30 SECTION 24. Disclosure. - Any person who shall willfully use or 31 disclose data or information furnished by the Owner of the ID Card, without 32 written authorization from the latter, or except by a lawful Court order upon 33 a prior endorsement by the participating agency, or as may be authorized by 34 law, shall be liable to a penalty of a fine of not more than Fifty Thousand 35 Pesos (Php50,000.00) or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or 36 both, at the discretion of the Court.

1 SECTION 25. Congressional Oversight Committee. - There is 2 hereby created for purposes of the implementation of this Act a congressional 3 oversight committee composed of five (5) members from the Senate designated by the Senate President and five (5) members from the House of 4 5 Representatives designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; Provided, That of the five (5) members to be designated by each house of 6 7 Congress, three (3) of them shall come from the majority and the remaining 8 two (2) from the minority.

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10 SECTION 26. Appropriation. - The amount of Twenty Million Pesos 11 (Php20,000,000.00) is hereby appropriated out of funds of the National 12 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, as operating funds of the Council and 13 for it to undertake the information campaign required under this Act. 14 Thereafter, such funds sufficient to fully carry out the purposes of this Act 15 shall be appropriated for the Council and every participating agency every 16 fiscal year in the General Appropriations Act.

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18 SECTION 27. Transitory Provisions. - Within three (3) months from 19 its full constitution and activation, the Council shall adopt a staggered 20 program of implementation of the System as to coverage, with due regard to 21 the existing identification projects of participating agencies, to realize 22 economies of scale.

The Council shall, within the same period, coordinate with other Government agencies that issue similar identification numbers for varied purposes, in order to integrate all such systems in the National Identification System.

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28 SECTION 28. Information Campaign. - Within six (6) months from 29 the effectivity of this Act, the Council shall undertake an extensive campaign 30 program to explain the implementation of the National Identification System 31 to all citizens and resident aliens in the country.

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33 SECTION 29. Implementing Rules. - The Council shall, not later 34 than sixty (60) days from its full constitution, promulgate the Implementing 35 Rules of this Act. Such Rules shall be effective fifteen (15) days from their 36 publication in a newspaper of general circulation. 1 SECTION 30. *Repealing Clause.* - All laws, presidential decrees, 2 orders, rules or regulations or parts thereof which are inconsistent with this 3 Act are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.

- 5 SECTION 31. *Effectivity Clause.* This Act shall take effect fifteen 6 (15) days after its complete publication in two (2) newspapers of general 7 circulation.
