EXPLANATORY NOTE

It is estimated that as much as five million Filipinos in the rural sector are either unemployed or underemployed. Although the employment in the rural sector is largely seasonal, much of the unemployment and underemployment can be attributed to underutilization of agricultural lands throughout the country.

With the Rural Employment Generation Act of 2007, one million hectares if idle and underutilized lands will be converted into modern productive agricultural resources. In the process, it is expected that one million rural jobs will be created, with annual farm incomes of at least Twenty Five Thousand Pesos per hectare being generated.


Corn, cassava and high value commercial crops shall be planted throughout the country under this Act, with the Department of Agriculture serving as lead agency. Tie-ups between the private sector and government will be necessary, including collaborations between agribusiness companies and farmer-beneficiaries.

As catalyst, the Program will generate rural employment valued at 10.354 Billion Pesos and private sector investments of 10.605 Billion Pesos. More importantly, with an improvement in our country's rural employment level, it is anticipated that rural poverty will drastically be reduced.

For the above-mentioned reasons, approval of this bill is earnestly urged.

AN ACT TO ACCELERATE THE DEVELOPMENT OF IDLE AND UNDERUTILIZED AGRICULTURAL LANDS AS A MEANS TO GENERATE EMPLOYMENT

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. *Title of Act*. This Act shall be known as the "Rural 2 Employment Generation Act of 2007."

4 SECTION 2. Purpose of the Act. There is a need to accelerate the 5 development of idle and underutilized agricultural land throughout the 6 country as a means of generating rural economic activity, especially since the 7 majority of our country's poor population belongs to the rural sector. In 8 generating rural employment, it is anticipated that at least one person will 9 find employment for every hectare developed, with an increase in income of 10 Twenty Five Thousand Pesos (P25,OOO.OO) per farmer.

12 SECTION 3. Lead Agency. The Department of Agriculture ("DA") 13 shall undertake the implementation of the Rural Employment Generation 14 Program (the "Program") and shall ensure implementation of this Act and its 15 purposes, including the determination of areas to be planted.

17 SECTION 4. Activities to be Undertaken. DA shall undertake the 18 development of a total of 845,000 hectares of idle or underutilized 19 agricultural land, to be planted hybrid corn, cassava and high value 20 commercial crops ("HVCC") over a period of two years, as follows:

SECTION 5. Features of the Program. The Program shall have the

2 following features:

(a) Modern Technology Systems. The Program will consolidate existing crop areas as well as idle prime lands into farm cluster modules for mechanized and/or irrigated production of hybrid corn, cassava and HVCC;

- (b) Production Credit Support. To ensure the adoption of modern crop 7 production technologies, the Program will enhance farmers' access 8 to credit for the purchase of production inputs through innovative 9 10 credit schemes through the establishment of a seed/guarantee fund for production loans to be extended by input suppliers, end-users, 11 traders, service providers and the formal banking sector; 12
- (c) Human Resource Development. The Program shall train farmers on 13 hybrid technologies, farm mechanization, post harvest and 14 processing technologies and promote local capacity-building in 15 areas of participatory program management and implementation, 16 extension and agribusiness marketing 17 research and and 18 management.

SECTION 6. Farmer-Agribusiness Tie-ups. The DA shall facilitate arrangements between farmers and agribusiness groups in the development 21 22 of agricultural lands. Different business partnership modalities shall be established between farmer cooperatives and the private sector to provide 23 ready markets, management and technical support, in whichever form most 24 suitable for rural development, including but not limited to purchase orders, 25 service or management contracts, contract growing or processing 26 27 arrangements, lease agreements and joint venture agreements.

SECTION 7. Quality Standards and Classification Systems. 29 Quality standards and classification systems shall be developed by the DA 30 and implemented for feedgrains, vegetables, fibers, fruits and industrial 31 crops in order to ensure better prices and competitiveness of domestic 32 produce. 33

SECTION 8. Joint Government-Private Sector Committee. A 35 committee is hereby created, consisting of the Secretary of Agriculture as 36

1 Chairman, a representative of the private sector involved in agriculture as Vice Chairman, two representatives of the farmer-beneficiaries, two 2 3 representatives of agribusiness companies involved in the Program, and two officials of the DA as members, all of which shall be appointed by the 4 5 President of the Republic of the Philippines upon recommendation of the Secretary of Agriculture. The committee shall facilitate the assistance of the 6 private sector in the identification of farmer beneficiaries, credit channels 7 8 and market and service providers and shall oversee the administration, management and implementation of the Program. 9

SECTION 9. Establishment of the Agricultural Development 11 Fund. The Agricultural Development Fund (the "Fund") is hereby 12 established, in the amount of Pesos Five Billion Five Hundred Fifty One 13 Million (PhP5,551,000,000.00) for the first year and Pesos Four Billion 14 Seventy Eight Million (P4,078,000,000.00) in the second year of the Program. 15 The Fund shall be taken from the budget allocation of the DA, and will be 16 utilized for the provision of a seed/loan guarantee fund for the production 17 loans and direct government intervention in the provision of, among others, 18 farm machinery, post harvest facilities. Farm-to-market roads and human 19 resource development activities. 20

SECTION 10. Injunctions, Restraining Orders and Other 22 Interlocutory Orders. - The development of the Camarines Sur Special 23 Economic Zone and Free port is a national government priority and therefore, 24 no injunctions, restraining orders and other interlocutory orders which seek 25 to stop or interrupt any contract entered into or project undertaken by the 26 CSSEZA may be issued by any court of law or quasi-judicial body except by 27 the Supreme Court of the Philippines. 28

SECTION 11. Separability Clause. - If any provision of this Act shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions not 31 otherwise affected, shall remain in full force and effect. 32

SECTION 12. Repealing Clause. - All laws, executive orders or 34 issuances, or any parts thereof which are inconsistent herewith are hereby 35 repealed or amended accordingly. 36

SECTION 13. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect upon its
publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
