

EXPLANATORY NOTE

In July 1994, the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippine Congress passed the "Anti-Sexual Harassment Act of 1995" declaring acts of sexual harassment against women and men unlawful in the workplace, in schools and training institutions. In Section 7 of the said Act, it stipulates that any person who violates the provision of this Act shall be penalized by imprisonment of not less one (1) month nor more than six (6) months, or a fine of not less than Ten thousand pesos (P10,000.00) or more than Twenty thousand pesos (P20,000.00), or both at the discretion of the court.

The Anti-Sexual Harassment Law has initially received positive response and gave a glimpse of hope to prevent discrimination in the workplace, particularly among the women in the formal labor sector. However, after almost 12 years of implementation, cases of sexual harassment, especially in workplaces still persist. Apparently, the existing penalty is not enough to curb the incidence of sexual harassment. There is a pressing need to increase the level of penalty to further deter the future perpetrators to rethink their motives before committing the act.<sup>1</sup>

AN ACT  
AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT 7877, ALSO KNOWN AS THE ANTI-SEXUAL  
HARASSMENT ACT, AS AMENDED, SECTION 7 ON THE PENALTIES

*Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in  
Congress assembled:*

SECTION 1. Republic Act 7877, also known as the Anti-Sexual Harassment Act,  
Section 7 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 7. *Penalties* – Any person who violates the provision of this act shall,  
upon conviction, be penalized by imprisonment of not less than SIX (6) months nor more  
than SIX (6) years, or a fine of not less than FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (Php  
50,000.00) or more than SEVENTY THOUSAND PESOS (Php 70,000.00), or both such  
fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court.

SECTION 2. *Repealing Clause.* - Any law, presidential decree or issuance,  
executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to,  
or inconsistent with, the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended  
accordingly.

SECTION 3. *Effectivity Clause.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days  
after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
