EXPLANATORY NOTE

With the passage of Republic Act No. 6975, administrative control and supervision over the country's district, city and municipal jails was transferred to the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP) under the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG).

The maintenance of all district, city and municipal jails throughout the country is now therefore lodged with the BJMP, which is presently a distinct bureau with its own uniformed and non-uniformed personnel complement.

In the light of the reforms brought about by RA 6975, it has become imperative to enact amendments to existing laws affecting the plight of our jailguards to serve as modest incentives in lifting the economic status of the men and women of the BJMP whose bravery, perseverance and devotion in overseeing the country's jails with utmost diligence and professionalism deserve the highest public esteem.

One of these laws is Republic Act No. 6963, otherwise known as "An Act granting special financial assistance and benefits to the family or beneficiary of any police or military or firemen killed or permanently incapacitated while in the performance of his duty or by reason of his office or position, and for other purposes".

Based on the title of RA 6963 alone, it is indeed apparent that our country's jailguards have been left out from the scope of the said law. As such, this bill therefore intends to amend the provisions of RA 6963 to include the BJMP personnel which will give a big boost to their welfare and morale and will make them receive the same benefits enjoyed by their counterparts in the other uniformed services of the government.

With this bill, it is hoped that the family or beneficiary of the men and women of the BJMP will be given the special financial assistance and benefits due them when they are killed or permanently incapacitated while in the performance of their duty or by reason of their office or position.

Hence, the passage of this proposed legislative measure is earnestly sought.

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AN ACT

AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6963, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "AN ACT GRANTING SPECIAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AND BENEFITS TO THE FAMILY OR BENEFICIARY OF ANY POLICE OR MILITARY PERSONNEL OR FIREMAN KILLED OR PERMANENTLY INCAPACITATED WHILE IN THE PERFORMANCE OF HIS DUTY OR BY REASON OF HIS OFFICE OR POSITION, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. – Section 1 of Republic Act No. 6963 is hereby amended to
 read as follows.

"SECTION 1. The family or beneficiary of any [police or military personnel, 3 including any fireman assisting in a police or military action] UNIFORMED AND 4 NON-UNIFORMED PERSONNEL OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE (PNP). 5 ARMED FORCES OF THE PHILIPPINES (AFP), BUREAU OF FIRE PROTECTION 6 (BFP) AND BUREAU OF JAIL MANAGEMENT AND PENOLOGY (BJMP), who is 7 killed or becomes permanently incapacitated while in the [performance] LINE of [his] 8 duty or by reason of his office or position, provided he has not committed any crime 9 or human rights violations by final judgment on such occasion, shall be entitled to 10 the special financial assistance provided for in this Act in addition to whatever 11 compensation, donation, insurance, gift, pension, grant, or any form of benefit which 12 13 said deceased or permanently incapacitated person or his family may received or be entitled to. 14

SEC. 2. - Section 2 of the law is hereby amended to read as follows:
 "SEC. 2. The term "PERSONNEL", AS USED IN THIS ACT, SHALL REFER
 TO BOTH THE UNIFORMED AND NON-UNIFORMED PERSONNEL OF THE PNP,
 AFP, BFP AND BJMP WHILE THE TERM "family" OR "BENEFICIARY", [as used in
 this Act] shall refer to the surviving legal spouse and his [legitimate] children or

parents, [or brothers and sisters, or aunts and uncles,] in that respective order:
Provided: That, if the [police or military personnel or fireman] PNP, AFP, BFP OR
BJMP PERSONNEL is a Muslim, the pertinent provisions of the Code of Muslim

- 4 Personal Law (Shari'a) shall apply.
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SEC. 3. - Section 3 of the law is hereby amended to read as follows:

6 "SEC. 3. The special financial assistance referred to in Section One hereof 7 shall be that which is equivalent to the average six (6) month's salary, including 8 allowances and bonuses, during the last twelve (12) months preceding the death 9 OR PERMANENT INCAPACITY of [the officer] ANY UNIFORMED AND NON-10 UNIFORMED PERSONNEL OF THE PNP, AFP, BFP OR BJMP which shall not be 11 considered a part of the estate of the deceased and which shall be exempt from 12 attachment, garnishment or execution and from income and other taxes.

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SEC. 4. – Section 4 of the law is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the cashier from whom the deceased or 14 permanently incapacitated [police or military personnel or fireman] PERSONNEL OF 15 THE PNP, AFP, BFP OR BJMP used to receive his salary, within three (3) days 16 from receipt of a written certification from the station or unit commander of the fact 17 of death OR PERMANENT INCAPACITY and the circumstances thereof to deliver to 18 19 the beneficiaries such special financial assistance as stated in Section Three hereof. In case of permanent [disability] INCAPACITY, a certification by the proper medical 20 officer designated by the CHIEF OF THE PNP, OR THE Chief of Staff of the [Armed 21 22 Forces of the Philippine] AFP, or the [Director General of the Integrated National 23 Police] CHIEF OF THE BFP, OR THE CHIEF OF THE BJMP, as the case my be, is necessary for the payment of the aforesaid SPECIAL financial assistance. After said 24 payment, a report with the formal certificate of death or permanent incapacity shall 25 be RESPECTIVELY submitted to the [Secretary of National Defense or the Director 26 General of the Integrated National Police] CHIEF OF THE PNP, OR THE CHIEF OF 27 STAFF OF THE AFP, OR THE CHIEF OF THE BFP, OR THE CHIEF OF THE 28 BJMP. 29

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SEC. 5. – Section 5 of the law is hereby amended to read as follows:

31 "SEC. 5. In order to assure the payment of the special financial assistance 32 referred to in this Act, without any need of any appropriation act or ordinance, the payment shall come from the expected salary, allowances and bonusES of the 33 deceased or permanently incapacitated [police or military] personnel [or fireman] OF 34 35 THE PNP, AFP, BFP OR BJMP for the next six (6) months after his death or 36 PERMANENT incapacity: Provided, That the position left vacant by the deceased or permanently incapacitated [police or military personnel or fireman] PERSONNEL OF 37 THE PNP, AFP, BFP OR BJMP on account of his death or PERMANENT incapacity 38

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shall not be filled during that period of six (6) months: Provided, further, That if the 1 public welfare and interest so demand, as determined by the [municipal of city 2 mayor or provincial governor] CHIEF OF THE PNP, in case of a [police] PNP 3 personnel [or fireman, or by the Secretary of National Defense], OR THE CHIEF OF 4 STAFF OF THE AFP, in case of a military personnel, OR THE CHIEF OF THE BFP, 5 IN CASE OF A FIRE PERSONNEL, OR THE CHIEF OF THE BJMP, IN CASE OF A 6 JAIL PERSONNEL the position left vacant by the deceased [personnel,] or 7 permanently incapacitated personnel may be filled without waiting for the expiration 8 of the six (6) months period earlier mentioned, in which case, the funds out of which 9 10 the special financial assistance already received by the family of the deceased or permanently incapacitated personnel shall be replenish out of the emergency 11 savings of the [municipality, city or province, or the department,] CONCERNED 12 BUREAUS upon the direction in writing by [the municipal or city mayor or 13 **`14** department secretary,] THEIR RESPECTIVE CHIEFS to their respective treasurers or cashiers [:Provided, finally, That, in the event of such emergency, no emergency 15 savings as provided herein exist, the regional commander or the provincial 16 commander, as the case may be, may draw augmentation personnel from any 17 municipality in the province or region to fill up the vacancy until such time that the 18 municipality where the vacancy occurred can fill up such vacancy with regular 19 personnel]. 20

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SEC. 6. - Section 6 of the law is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 6. If any [police or military] personnel [or fireman] of the PNP, AFP, BFP OR BJMP is injured or wounded [or in any manner suffers any injury] in the performance of his official duties, the hospitalization expenses of such [police or military] personnel [or fireman] shall be shouldered by the office where he belongs, chargeable against the salary savings of such office without the need of any appropriation act or ordinance.

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SEC. 7. – Section 7 of the law is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 7. The surviving spouse of the deceased or permanently incapacitated [police or military] personnel [or fireman] OF THE PNP, AFP, BFP OR BJMP shall be given priority in employment in a government or agency or office where her qualifications are fitted: Provided, That if the spouse is already employed or not employable or if she waives her employment privilege, then an employable son or daughter shall be granted the said privilege.

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SEC. 8. – Section 11 of the law is hereby amended to read as follows:

36 "SEC. 11. Any person who unduly delays, refuses or in any manner prevents
 37 the payment of the special financial assistance [defined] AS PROVIDED in this Act

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to the person or persons entitled thereto shall be dismissed from office if found guilty

2 in an appropriate administrative case.

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SEC. 9. – Section 12 of the law is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 12. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prejudice and diminish
whatever benefits a [member of the military establishment or the Integrated National
Police] PERSONNEL OF THE PNP, AFP, BFP AND BJMP is entitled to receive
under existing laws."

8 SEC. 10. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – The Department of the 9 Interior and Local Government (DILG), the Department of National Defense (DND) 10 and the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM), in coordination with the 11 concerned bureaus and other agencies, shall promulgate and implement rules and 12 regulations within ninety days following the approval of this Act.

SEC. 11. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations
 which are contrary to or inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified
 accordingly.

16 SEC. 12. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect 15 days after its complete 17 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
