"AN ACT

PROVIDING FOR THE CONTROL AND ELIMINATION OF RABIES, PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled: SEC. 1. Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Anti-Rabies Act of 2006". 1 2 SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is the declared policy of the State to protect 3 and promote the right to health of the people. Towards this end, a system for the 4 control, prevention of the spread, and eventual eradication of Rabies shall be provided 5 and the need for responsible Dog ownership established. 6 7 SEC. 3. Definition of Terms. - For the purpose of this Act, the following terms 8 9 shall mean: a. Bitten refers to an act by which a Dog seizes, cuts or grips with its teeth 10 so that the skin of a person has been wounded, pierced or scratched. 11 b. Concerned Officials refers to barangay officials, health workers, police 12 officers or government veterinarians. 13 c. Dog refers to a common quadruped domestic animal belonging to the 14 order carnivora (male or female), scientifically known as canis familiaris. 15 d. *Euthanasia Drug* refers to a drug used for humane killing of Dogs. 16 e. Impound refers to seize and hold in the custody of the law. 17 f. Owner refers to any person keeping, harboring or having charge, care or 18 control of a Dog including his/her representative. 19 g. Pound refers to a public enclosure for stray animals. 20

h. *Public Place* refers to any place open to the public like parks, malls, markets, streets, etc.

- i. *Rabies* refers to a fatal disease caused by a lyssa virus, transmitted mainly through the bite of an infected animal and is characterized by muscle paralysis, hydrophobia and aerophobia, and others.
- j. *Rabies Vaccination* refers to the inoculation of a Dog with a Rabies vaccine by a licensed government or private veterinarian or trained individual under the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian. The services of the said trained individual shall be limited only to Rabies Vaccination injection in Dogs and only during government mass vaccination campaigns.
- 11k. Stray Dog refers to any Dog leaving its Owner's place or premise and no12longer under the effective control of the Owner.
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I. Veterinary Neuroleptic Drugs refer to drugs that depress the function of the nervous system e.g. anesthetic, tranquilizer, sedative.

SEC. 4. National Rabies Prevention and Control Program. - It is hereby 16 mandated that there shall be a National Rabies Prevention and Control Program. The 17 program shall be a multi-agency effort in controlling and eliminating Rabies in the 18 country. Among its component activities include mass vaccination of Dogs, Impounding 19 of Stray Dogs, conduct of information and education campaign on the prevention and 20 21 control of Rabies, provision on pre-exposure treatment to high risk personnel and post exposure treatment to animal bite victims as well as the encouragement of the practice 22 of responsible Dog ownership. The program shall be implemented by the Department of 23 Agriculture (DA), Department of Health (DOH), Department of Interior and Local 24 Government (DILG) and Department of Education (DepEd), as well as Local 25 26 Government Units (LGUs) with the assistance of Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs). 27

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SEC. 5 . Responsibilities of Dog Owners. – All Dog Owners shall be required to:

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 a. Have their Dog vaccinated against Rabies at three months old and every year thereafter and maintain a registration card which shall contain all vaccinations conducted on their Dog, for accurate record purposes.

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b. Submit their Dog for mandatory registration.

c. Maintain control over their Dog and not allow it to roam the streets or any
Public Place without a leash.

d. Be a responsible Owner by providing their Dog with proper grooming,
adequate food and clean shelter.

e. Within twenty-four (24) hours, report immediately any Dog biting incident 1 2 to the Concerned Officials for investigation or any appropriate action and place such Dog under observation or control by the LGU where the Dog Owner 3 4 resides. 5 f. Assist the Dog bite victim immediately and shoulder the medical expenses 6 incurred and other incidental expenses relative to the victim's injuries. 7 SEC. 6. Responsibilities of Government Agencies. - The following 8 government agencies, which shall jointly implement the National Rabies Prevention and 9 10 Control Program, shall be tasked to: 11 12 A. Department of Agriculture 13 1. Improve and upgrade existing animal Rabies laboratory diagnostic 14 capabilities to ensure better services to the people. 15 16 2. Ensure the availability and adequate supply of animal anti-Rabies vaccine at all times. 17 3. Undertake free anti-Rabies Vaccination of Dogs. 18 4. Maintain and improve animal Rabies surveillance system. 19 5. Establish and maintain Rabies free zone in coordination with the LGUs. 20 21 6. Facilitate for the approval of the use of Veterinary Neuroleptic and Euthanasia Drugs by the DOH and the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency 22 23 (PDEA). 7. Strengthen the training of field personnel and the information education 24 25 and communication (IEC) activities on Rabies prevention and control and responsible Dog ownership. 26 8. Conduct research on Rabies and its control in coordination with other 27 28 agencies. 9. Encourage collaborative activities with the DOH, DepEd, DILG, NGOs and 29 other concerned sectors. 30 31 32 B. Department of Health 33 34 1. Ensure the availability and adequate supply of human anti-Rabies vaccine in animal bite treatment centers at all times and shall coordinate with other 35 implementing agencies and concerned NGOs for this purpose. 36

2. Provide post-exposure treatment at the minimum expense to individuals 1 2 Bitten by animals suspected of being rabid which will consist of the initial vaccine and immunoglobulin dose. 3 3. Provide pre-exposure treatment to high-risk personnel, e.g. laboratory 4 staff, veterinarians, animal handlers, vaccinators and other persons working with 5 Rabies virus for free. 6 4. Coordinate with the DA in the development of appropriate health 7 education strategy to inform the public on Rabies prevention and control and 8 responsible Dog ownership. 9 5. Develop and maintain a surveillance system. 10 6. Encourage collaborative activities with the DA, DepEd, DILG, NGOs and 11 other concerned sectors. 12 7. Approve the registration of Veterinary Neuroleptic and Euthanasia Drugs 13 in coordination with the PDEA. 14 15 C. Department of Education 16 17 health 1. Strengthen Rabies education program through school 18 teaching/curriculum; 19 2. Assist in the Dog mass immunization campaigns in the community. 20 3. Encourage collaborative activities with the DA, DOH, DILG, NGOs and 21 other concerned sectors. 22 23 4. Integrate proper information and education on responsible Dog ownership in the relevant subjects in the Elementary and High School levels. 24 25 SEC. 7. Responsibilities of the LGUs. - LGUs, in their respective localities, 26 27 must: 28 1. Vaccinate Dogs routinely to cover the whole Dog population. 29 2. Strictly enforce Dog Impounding activities and field control to eliminate 30 Stray Dogs. 31 3. Ensure that Dogs are leashed or confined within the premises of the 32 Owner's house or Owner's fenced surroundings. 33 4. Ensure that all Dogs are properly immunized and registered. 34 5. Allocate funds to augment the implementation of the National Rabies 35 Prevention and Control Program, particularly on the financing of supplies and 36 vaccines needed for immunization. 37

6. Ensure the enforcement of Section 6 of Republic Act No. 8485 or "The 2 Animal Welfare Act of 1998". 7. Enact additional local ordinances that will support the National Rabies 3 4 Prevention and Control Program that should include the regulation of treatment 5 locally known as "tandok." 6 8. Prohibit the slaughter and trade of Dogs for meat. 7 9. With respect to cities and first class municipalities, establish and maintain 8 a Dog Pound where Impounded Dogs shall be kept, in accordance with Section 9 9 herein, Provided, that the other municipalities, may, on their own, establish a Dog 10 Pound or opt to share the expense of establishing and maintaining a Dog Pound with other adjoining municipalities. 11 12 10. For purposes of ensuring the administrative feasibility of implementing the 13 provisions of this Act, and subject to paragraph 7 of this Section, the barangay shall collect the fines imposed under Section 11 hereof. 14 Any and all fines collected pursuant to this Act shall be used for the 15 enhancement of the National Rabies Prevention and Control Program within the 16 locality concerned, as well as the achievement of the objectives envisioned in 17 this Act. 18 19 The Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) shall ensure 20 compliance of these responsibilities by the LGUs. 21 22 23 SEC. 8. Assistance of NGOs and the Academe. - The agencies tasked to implement the anti-Rabies program shall seek the assistance and participation of NGOs 24 25 in any of the following activities: 26 1. Community mobilization. 27 2. Health education /information dissemination on Rabies and responsible 28 Dog ownership. 29 3. Mass anti-Rabies campaign. 30 4. Surveillance/reporting of Rabies cases in animals and humans. 31 5. Any other activities geared towards the prevention and complete 32 eradication of Rabies. 33 34 SEC. 9. Impounding, Field Control and Disposition of Unregistered, Stray 35 and Unvaccinated Dogs. - Unregistered, Stray or unvaccinated Dogs shall be put in 36 Dog Pounds and disposed of, taking into consideration the following guidelines: 37

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1 1. Unregistered, Stray or unvaccinated Dogs shall be Impounded and kept in 2 the LGU's designated Dog Pound. 2. Impounded Dogs not claimed after three days from the Dog Pound shall 3 4 be placed for adoption to qualified persons, with the assistance of an animal welfare NGO, when feasible, or otherwise disposed of in any manner authorized, 5 subject to the pertinent provisions of Republic Act No. 8485, otherwise known as 6 the "Animal Welfare Act of 1998." 7 8 3. A fee shall be paid by Owners of Impounded Dogs to the LGU concerned, 9 pursuant to Section 7 hereof. 10 SEC. 10. Dog Population Control. - In furtherance of the policy of this Act to 11 12 eradicate Rabies, there is the need to control the Dog population and minimize the 13 number of unwanted Stray Dogs. As such, it is hereby mandated: 14 1. That the DA, DOH, DILG, DepEd, LGUs, with the assistance of NGOs, 15 shall undertake an educational and promotional campaign on responsible Dog 16 Ownership, including the option of spaying or neutering their Dogs. 17 2. That the LGUs shall provide an incentive system whereby Owners of Dogs 18 which have been spayed or neutered will be given a subsidized or discounted pet 19 20 registration fee. 3. That Dogs which have been Impounded three times shall only be released 21 after having been spayed or neutered, at the expense of the Dogs' Owner. 22 23 SEC.11. Penalties. -24 25 1. Dog Owners who fail or refuse to have their Dog registered and 26 immunized against Rabies shall be punished by a fine of Two Thousand Pesos 27 (P2,000.00). 28 2. Dog Owners who refuse to have their Dog vaccinated against Rabies 29 shall be liable to pay for the vaccination of both the Dog and the individuals Bitten 30 31 by their Dog. 3. Dog Owners who refuse to have their Dog put under observation after said 32 Dog has Bitten an individual shall be meted a fine of Ten Thousand Pesos 33 (P10,000.00). 34 4. Dog Owners who refuse to have their Dog put under observation and do 35 not shoulder the medical expenses of the person Bitten by their Dog shall be 36 meted a fine of Twenty-Five Thousand Pesos (P25,000.00). 37

- 1 5. Dog Owners who refuse to put leash on their Dogs when they are brought 2 outside the house shall be meted a fine of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) for 3 each incident.
 - 6. An Impounded Dog shall be released to its Owner upon payment of a fine of not less than Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) but not more than One Thousand Pesos (P1,000).
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8 **SEC. 12.** *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. - The DA, in coordination with 9 the DOH, DILG, DepEd, and NGOs shall issue the necessary rules and regulations for 10 the effective implementation of this Act.

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SEC. 13. *Appropriations*. - The amount of One Hundred Million Pesos (P100,000,000.00) necessary to implement the provisions of this Act shall be initially charged against the appropriations of the DOH, DA, DILG and DepEd under the General Appropriations Act. For the LGUs, the requirements shall be taken from their Internal Revenue Allotment and other local funds. Thereafter, such sums as may be necessary for its continued implementation shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Acts.

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SEC. 14. Separability Clause. - In case any provision of this Act is declared
 unconstitutional, the other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

23 SEC. 15. *Effectivity*. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 24 publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general 25 circulation, whichever comes earlier.
