EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article XIII, Section 12, provides: "The State shall establish and maintain an effective food and drug regulatory system and undertake appropriate health manpower development and research, responsive to the country's health needs and problems."

This bill requires that food products treated with an additive, colorant, or any other method to enhance its appearance or flavor include a clear, conspicuous, and easily readable label on the packaging or menu stating so, and advising the consumer to check the ingredients to determine its possible detrimental effect. Additives such as sodium nitrate, monosodium glutamate and colorants are sometimes used so that the food served will last longer and taste better. Although the ingredients are necessary for consumer items sold in groceries, the practice of including ingredients in the menu or packaging served in food establishments is not observed.

16	have come in contact with the food through its preparation such as nuts, animal fat, or				
17	other similar substances.				
18	SECTION 4. Penalty for non-observance.—The	business license of the food			
19	establishment shall be revoked for failure to comply w	ith the immediately preceding			
20	section.				

1 SECTION 5. Separability Clause. - If any part or provision of this Act is held 2 invalid or unconstitutional, the other parts or provisions thereof shall remain valid and 3 effective.

4 SECTION 6. *Repealing Clause.* - All laws, decrees, orders, proclamations, 5 rules and regulations or parts thereof, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are 6 hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

7 SECTION 7. *Effectivity Clause.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
8 from its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
