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## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Introduced by Senator Antonio "Sonny" F. Trillanes IV

This bill seeks to provide, consistent with the mandate imposed by the Constitution under Article XIV, guarantee and protection to Filipino children who are bona fide residents of the town or city where the school is located in their access to educational facilities and services.

It is guaranteed by no less than the fundamental law under Section 1 of Article XIV on Education that "The State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all."

Moreover, Section 4(1) of the said Article recognizes the complementary roles of public and private institutions in the educational system and mandates that the State shall exercise reasonable supervision and regulation of all educational institutions.

Section 5(1) of the said Article, furthermore, stresses the significance of taking into account the regional and sectoral needs and conditions and the encouragement by the State of local planning in developing educational policies and programs, as well as in ensuring access to quality education in the local level.

In view of the foregoing, approval of the bill is strongly recommended.

## AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE DEMOCRATIZATION OF PUBLIC SCHOOL EDUCATION

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Public School Democratization Law of 2008".

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- SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. In order to strengthen the mandate of the Constitution concerning education under Article XIV, it is hereby declared the policy of the State to afford full protection to and assure access to quality education for Filipino children who are bona fide residents of a particular province or city where the school is located.
- Pursuant to the foregoing state policy, this Act shall consolidate and institutionalize existing government efforts in effecting meaningful programs on education.
- SEC. 3. *Prohibited Act.* It is hereby declared unlawful for any public school official, principal, faculty, or employee to refuse admission of any student in a primary or secondary public school, for whatever reasons, in a community where the said student is a *bona* fide resident as certified by the Barangay Captain.

SEC. 5. Penal Clause. – Any public school official, principal, faculty, or employee who violates any provision of this Act, or the rules and regulations thereof shall, after undergoing administrative due process, be punished with one (1) month suspension from service and fined with five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) for the first offense, dismissal from service and temporary disqualification to hold public office for a period of six (6) months for the second offense; and dismissal from service and perpetual disqualification to hold public office for the third offense.

SEC. 6. Appropriations. - The amount necessary for the implementation of this

Act shall be taken from the funds of the Department of Education and shall be included in the

annual General Appropriations Act.

SEC. 7. Repeating Clause. - All laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, and other issuances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with this Act, are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 8. Separability Clause. - If for any reason any section or provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions thereof, shall not be affected thereby.

2 SEC. 9. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect upon its complete publication in at

3 least two (2) national newspapers of general circulation.
