EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article 15, Section 1, provides:

The State recognizes the Filipino family as the foundation of the nation. Accordingly, it shall strengthen its solidarity and actively promote its total development.

Fundamental changes in the demographics and economics of family life in the country over the past 20 years have had a profound effect on children and their parents. As the number of women working outside the home and the number of two-earner families have been steadily increasing, there is a need to support community-based family resource and support programs that promote healthy child development and increase parental competency. Investment in promoting the development of family resource and support programs will reap long-term benefits for individual families and the nation as a whole.

Hence, this bill seeks to establish a national center for information and technical assistance relating to all types of family resource and support programs.

5 6	Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
7	SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "Family Resource Act of
8	2008."
9	SECTION 2. Purpose It is the purpose of this Act to
10	(A) stimulate the development and expansion of family resource and support
11	programs that are prevention-oriented;
12	(B) encourage early intervention of such programs with families to ameliorate
13	problem situations before such situations become crises; and
14	(C) assist parents in enhancing their children's development to assure that their
15	children enter school prepared and ready to learn.
16	SECTION 3. Definition As used in this Act, the phrase "family resource and
17	support programs" means community-based services that offer sustained assistance to
18	families at various stages in their development. Such services shall promote parental
19	competencies and behaviors that will lead to the healthy and positive personal development
20	of parents and children through –
21	(A) the provision of assistance to build family skills and assist parents in improving
22	their capabilities to be supportive and nurturing parents;

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1 (B) the provision of assistance to families to enable such families to use other formal 2 and informal resources and opportunities for assistance that are available within the 3 communities of such families; and

4 (C) the creation of supportive networks to enhance the childrearing capacity of 5 parents and assist in compensating for the increased social isolation and vulnerability of 6 families.

SECTION 4. Establishment of a National Center on Family Resource and Support
Programs. – The Secretary of Health shall establish, through grant or contract, a national
center for the collection and provision of programmatic information and technical assistance
that relates to all types of family resource and support programs. Such center shall –

(A) establish a clearing-house to develop and maintain a database on all types of
family resource and support programs;

(B) develop and maintain a system for disseminating information on all types of
family resource and support programs and on the state of family resource and support
program development, including information concerning the most effective model programs;

16 (C) develop and sponsor a variety o f training institutes and curricula for family
 17 resource and support program staff;

(D) identify several model programs representing the various types of family resource
 and support programs to develop technical assistance materials and activities to assist other
 agencies in establishing family resource and support programs; and

(E) develop nationwide networks of family resource and support programs for the
 purpose of sharing and disseminating information.

SECTION 5. *Evaluation*. – The Secretary of Health shall, through grants or contracts
 awarded or entered into with independent auditors, conduct evaluations and related activities,
 of family resource and support programs, including –

26 (A) evaluations of ongoing programs;

27 (B) process evaluations focusing on implementation strategies; and

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(C) the development of simple evaluation models for use by local family resource and
 support programs.

3 SECTION 6. Authorization of Appropriations. - To carry out the provisions of this
4 Act, there are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be necessary for each fiscal
5 year.

6 SECTION 7. Separability Clause. – If any provision, or part hereof is held invalid or 7 unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall 8 remain valid and subsisting.

9 SECTION 8. *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive 10 order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to or inconsistent 11 with, the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

SECTION 9. *Effectivity Clause.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
