## EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article 11, Section 13, provides:

Section 13. The State recognizes the role of the youth in nationbuilding and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual and social wellbeing. It shall inculcate in the youth patriotism and nationalism, and encourage their involvement in public and civil affairs.

Service to the community is a responsibility of all Filipinos, regardless of their economic level or age. Serving other builds self-esteem and teaches teamwork, decision-making, and problem-solving.

Students, from kindergarten to college, offer a powerful and largely untapped resource for community service. The government, therefore, should encourage students to engage in productive work with visible community benefits in a natural resource or human service setting, in order to give them a mix of work experience, basic and life skills education, training, and support services.

Children who become engaged in community service early will understand better the responsibilities of citizenship and often continue to serve the community into adulthood. To this end, this bill seeks to establish a program that will expand opportunities for students to serve their communities.

| 7           | SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "Service to the   |

| 9           | SECTION 2. Purpose. – The purposes of this Act are:   |
| 10          | (A) to enable the call to service to begin in the earliest grades, to grow into                                       |
| 11          | sustained community action in secondary schools and colleges, and to become a lifelong                                |

| 13          | (B) to provide students with service opportunities;   |
| 14          | (C) to build on the existing organizational framework provided by educational   |
| 15          | agencies, schools, institutions of higher education, and community agencies;  |

| 17          | SECTION 3. Definition of Terms For purposes of this Act:  |
| 18          | (A) The term "community-based agency" means a private non-profit organization   |
| 19          | that is representative of a community or a significant segment of a community and that is                             |
| 20          | engaged in meeting human, social, educational, or environmental community needs.                                      |
| 21          | (B) The term "education institution" means elementary or secondary school,  |
| 22          | institution of higher education, or a community-based agency that provides educational                                |
| 23          | services.   |

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1 (C) The term "appropriate government agency" means a public agency that is 2 engaged in meeting human, social, educational, or environmental needs.

3 (D) The term "participant" means a student or out-of-school youth who provides
4 services pursuant to a program provided in this Act.

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(E) The term "Secretary" means the Secretary of Education.

6 (F) The term "service opportunity" means a program or project enabling students 7 to perform meaningful and constructive service in agencies, institutions, and situations 8. where the application of human talent and dedication may help to meet, human, social, 9 educational, and environmental community needs, especially those relating to poverty.

10 (G) The term "student" means an individual who is enrolled full-time or part-time
11 in an elementary or secondary school or institution of higher education.

12 SECTION 4. School and Campus Based Community Service. - The Secretary shall, in coordination with the Commission on Higher Education, National Youth 13 Commission, Department of Social Welfare and Development and other appropriate 14 government agencies and community-based agencies, establish a national program that 15 will provide opportunities for students work with visible community. Such 16 comprehensive program shall provide productive work with visible community benefits 17 18 in a natural resource or human service setting and give participants a mix of work experience basic and life skills education, training and support services. 19

20 SECTION 5. Incorporation in the Curriculum. – Such program shall be 21 incorporated into the curriculum as a separate subject and shall require students, before 22 they are allowed to graduate from elementary, high school or college, as the case may be, 23 to render community service by participating in the program.

SECTION 6. *Program Components.* – The Secretary, in carrying out the program,
 shall:

| 18 | SECTION 7. Rules and Regulations. – The Secretary shall formulate the                       |
| 19 | necessary rules and regulations in carrying out the provisions of this Act.                 |
| 20 | SECTION 8. Appropriation The national government shall appropriate such                     |
| 21 | amounts as may be necessary to carry out the provisions and objectives of this Act.         |
| 22 | SECTION 9. Separability Clause. – If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid          |
| 23 | or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law of the provision not otherwise affected shall |
| 24 | remain valid and subsisting.  |
| 25 | SECTION 10. Repealing Clause Any law, presidential decree or issuance,                      |

26 executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to

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- or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended
   accordingly.
- 3 SECTION 11. *Effectivity Clause*. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
  4 after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
