#### "AN ACT

STRENGTHENING AND EXPANDING THE COVERAGE OF THE SPECIAL PROGRAM FOR EMPLOYMENT OF STUDENTS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE PROVISIONS OF R. A. 7323, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE SPECIAL PROGRAM FOR EMPLOYMENT OF STUDENTS".

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of R. A. 7323, otherwise known as the "Special

Program for Employment of Students (SPES)" is hereby amended to read as 2 follows: 3 SECTION 1. Any provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding, 4 any person or entity employing at least [fifty (50)] FIFTEEN (15) 5 persons may during summer and/or Christmas vacations employ poor 6 but deserving students fifteen (15) years of age but not more than 7 twenty-five (25) years old, paying them a salary or wage not lower than 8 the minimum wage FOR PRIVATE EMPLOYERS AND THE 9 APPLICABLE HIRING RATE FOR THE NATIONAL AND LOCAL 10 11 GOVERNMENT **AGENCIES:** PROVIDED, THAT STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE SECONDARY LEVEL SHALL ONLY BE 12 EMPLOYED DURING THE SUMMER AND/OR CHRISTMAS 13 14 VACATIONS; **PROVIDED** FURTHER, THAT THE **STUDENTS** 

TECHNOLOGICAL EDUCATION MAY BE EMPLOYED AT ANY TIME OF THE YEAR; PROVIDED FINALLY, THAT STUDENTS EMPLOYED IN ACTIVITIES RELATED TO THEIR COURSE SHALL EARN EQUIVALENT ACADEMIC CREDITS AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY APPROPRIATE GOVERNMENT AGENCIES [provided by law and other applicable labor rules and regulations].

For purposes of this Act, poor but deserving students refer to those whose parents combined incomes, together with their income, if any, do not exceed [Thirty-six thousand pesos (P36, 000.00) per annum] THE ANNUAL APPLICABLE REGIONAL POVERTY THERSHOLD LINE FOR A FAMILY OF SIX FOR THE PRECEDING YEAR AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE NATIONAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (NEDA). Employment [should be at the Labor Exchange Center of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE)] FACILITATION SERVICES FOR APPLICANTS TO THE PROGRAM SHALL BE DONE BY THE PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT SERVICE OFFICE (PESO).

**SEC. 2.** Section 3 of the same law is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 3. The Secretary of Labor and Employment, the Secretary of Education [Culture and Sports], THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION and the Secretary of Finance shall issue the corresponding rules and regulations to carry out the purposes of this Act.

The Secretary of Labor and Employment shall be the Project Director of this program.

**SEC. 3.** Section 4 of the same law is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 4. Any person or entity who **REFUSES OR DISHONORS AN EDUCATIONAL VOUCHER, OR** makes any fraudulent or fictitious claim

- under this Act, regardless of whether payment has been made, shall upon
- 2 conviction be punished with imprisonment of not less than six (6) months and
- 3 not more than one (1) year and a fine of not less than Ten thousand pesos
- 4 (P10,000.00), without prejudice to their prosecution and punishment for any
- 5 other offense punishable under the Revised Penal Code or any other penal
- 6 statute.
- 7 In case of partnership or corporations, the managing partner, general
- 8 manager, or chief executive officer, as the case may be, shall be criminally
- 9 liable.
- 10 **SEC. 4.** Section 5 of the same law is hereby amended to read as follows:
- Section 5. The amount necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act is
- hereby authorized to be appropriated in the General Appropriations Act for
- 13 1992 and the subsequent annual General Appropriations Act; **PROVIDED**,
- 14 THAT THE APPROPRIATION, FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS ACT, SHALL
- 15 NOT BE REDUCED BY CONGRESS BELOW THE AMOUNT
- 16 APPROPRIATED FOR THE PREVIOUS YEAR AND, AFTER APPROVAL,
- 17 SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY AND REGULARLY RELEASED; PROVIDED
- 18 FURTHER, THAT THE APPROPRIATION HEREIN SHALL BE INCREASED
- 19 BY AT LEAST TWENTY (20%) PER CENTUM ANNUALLY".
- 20 SEC. 5. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Act or an
- 21 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, the
- 22 other provisions of this Act, and the application of such provision to other
- 23 person or circumstances, shall not be affected thereby.
- SEC. 6. Repealing Clause- All existing laws, orders, rules and
- 25 regulations or part thereof deemed inconsistent with the provision of this Act
- are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

- SEC. 1. Effectivity- This Act shall take effect after its publication in the
- 2 Official Gazette or in at least two (2) national newspapers of general
- 3 circulation.
- 4 Approved
