EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article 13, Section 9 provides:

"The State shall, by law, and for the common good, undertake, in cooperation with the private sector, a continuing program of urban land reform and housing which will make available at affordable cost, decent housing and basic services to under-privileged and homeless citizens in urban centers and resettlement areas. It shall also promote adequate employment opportunities to such citizens. In the implementation of such program the State shall respect the rights of small property owners."

This bill aims to strengthen the support base of Nonprofit Organizations which are building homes for the less fortunate. It will also give minors, not only the technical construction skills that building homes may bring, but also the uplifting moral value of working for social causes.



1 2 3	AN ACT PERMITTING CERTAIN MINORS TO WORK AS VOLUNTEERS FOR NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS CONSTRUCTING AFFORDABLE HOUSING
4 5	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
6	SECTION 1. Minors aged Fourteen Through Seventeen Permitted to Work as
7	Volunteers for Nonprofit Organizations Constructing Affordable Housing; Prohibited Acts
8	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation, minors who are between the ages
9	of fourteen and seventeen shall be permitted to work as volunteers for nonprofit organizations
10	engaged in the construction of affordable housing as determined by the Secretary of Labor
11	Subject to the following provisions:
12	A. That under no circumstances shall a minor be permitted to work in a project
13	involving the construction of affordable housing that is in any way associated with a profit
14	making commercial enterprise;
15	B. That no minor shall operate, perform maintenance, clean, inspect, work in, about, or
16	in connection with any power driven machinery involved in the construction of affordable
17	housing;
18	C. That no minor shall engage in the construction of affordable housing without the
19	safety equipment required by law;
20	D. That no minor shall be permitted to work as a volunteer in the construction of
21	affordable housing except under the direct supervision of an adult;
22	E. That no minor shall be exposed to hazardous waste products or other hazardous
23	substances;

F. That no minor shall be permitted to work on any excavation, scaffolding or roofing;

1	G. That no minor shall be permitted to work;
2	(1) During School Hours;
3	(2) Before Seven O'clock in the morning;
4	(3) After Seven O'clock in the evening;
5	(4) For more than five consecutive hours without a half-hour break; and
6	(5) For more than eighteen hours per week when school is in session.
7	SECTION 2. Insurance The nonprofit organization engaged in the construction of
8	affordable housing shall secure liability insurance to provide compensation for all injuries,
9	including, but not limited to, occupational illness, sustained by minors working voluntarily in the
10	construction of affordable housing. The insurance required by this section shall have coverage
11	limits of at least One Million Pesos per Occurrence, at least One Million Pesos aggregate per
12	year and Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Pesos for Property Damage.
13	SECTION 3. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations or parts
14	thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified
15	accordingly.
16	SECTION 4. Separability Clause If, for any reason, any provision of this Act is
17	declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions hereof which are not
18	affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.
19	SECTION 5. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) days
20	following its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
