## **Explanatory Note**

The Information Age, globalization, rapid change, segmentation of the society - these are the challenges which considerably increase the importance of a social and cultural role of education. The society will be able to respond to these challenges only if the education system is modern and flexible enough to meet the demands of the rapidly changing society.

The Open Learning and Distance Education (OLDE) could be a suitable response to this reality. OLDE provides tools that allow increased access to education. A student availing of distance learning can attend classes while at home or in the workplace with the use of modules, e-mail, chat and video conference. However, to ensure efficiency and quality, mechanisms should be employed to monitor the academic progress of the students.

In view of the foregoing, immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

<b>SECTION 1.</b> <i>Title.</i> - This Act shall 2010".	ll be known as tl	he "Open Tertiary Education Act of
SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy It	is hereby declare	ed the policy of the State to expand
and further democratize educational opp	ortunities for ou	ir people in a more effective and

thereof, the State recognizes the open lear	ning system as a	necessary mode to widen access to
quality tertiary education even as it guarant	ees academic free	edom of higher education institutions

on what to teach and how to teach.

SEC. 3. Definition of Terms.- For purposes of this Act, the following terms are hereby defined:

"a. Open Learning System - A philosophy of learning that is highly flexible and learnercentered, that is the conditions for learning are controlled by the learner, thus enabling him to learn at the time, place and pace which satisfy his circumstances and requirements. It includes

1	Expanded Tertiary Education, Equivalency and Accreditation Program (ETEEAP), prior
2	learning, portfolio learning, non-traditional, or sorts of prior learning that could be submitted for
3	formal recognition.
4	"b. Distance Education - A System of delivering educational services to students who are
5	disadvantaged by limited time, distance, or physical disability, among others, through the use of
6	specially designed materials and methods and supported by organizational and administrative
7	structures and arrangements. It is characterized by the separation of learner and teacher, the
8	influence of an organization, the possibility of occasional meetings and face-to-face interactions,
9	the recourse to an industrialized form of education, and the use of technical media such as print,
10	radio, audio, video and computers.
11	"c. Open University - A university which makes use of the open learning system by
12	offering distance education programs at the tertiary level to students who cannot complete their
13	education using the traditional mode.
14	
15	SEC. 4. Coverage This Act shall apply to public and private higher education
16	institutions with existing open learning programs and to other institutions which shall later be
17	authorized as qualified implementers of the System.
18	
19	SEC. 5. Admission Requirements Admission to an open tertiary education shall be
20	governed by these admission requirements:
21	a. Completion of high school education evidenced by a high school certificate/transcript

b. Admission requirements by the admitting educational institution shall be instituted in

accordance with standards set by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED).

1	SEC. 6. Program Requirements There shall be defined a set of courses (Subjects)
2	and/or examinations, the completion of which shall be required for graduation from a program,
3	and which shall be equivalent to those under the formal system.
4	a. The place, pace and mode of study shall be done at the option and convenience of the
5	student, except in the case of examinations of which its context, content and conduct shall be
6	determined by the institution.
7	b. The CHED and/or the institution concerned shall develop and implement a mechanism
8	to monitor the academic progress of the students.
9	c. The programs to be offered and the curricula to be implemented under the open
10	tertiary education shall conform to the CHED's updated policies and guidelines on open learning
11	and distance education.
12	d. Completion of a program shall be evidenced by the award of the appropriate certificate
13	or diploma.
14	e. For the practice of the profession for which one has acquired the necessary academic
15	credentials in the Open Tertiary Education, the existing requirements of passing a board or
16	exams shall apply.
17	
18	SEC. 7. Mode of Delivery Open Learning System/Distance Education may be delivered
19	using the following:
20	a. Media
21	1. Print - textbooks, study guides, workbooks, course syllabi, correspondence
22	feedback, and other print formats;
23	2. Audio-Visual - radio, audio cassette tapes, slides, film, videotapes, television,
24	telephone, fax, audio-conferencing, video-conferencing;
25	3. Electronic/Computer Technology - CD-ROM, electronic mail, e-bulletin boards,

world-wide web, E-learning or online delivery of education; and

1	4. Face-to-face sessions.
2	b. Autonomous open learning/distance education institutions or independent open
3	learning/distance education departments of a conventional or traditional institute, college or
4	university;
5	c. Consortium model consisting of open learning/distance education departments of
6	different institutions.
7	
8	SEC. 8. Support to Distance Education Programs Higher education institutions with
9	open learning programs shall be provided support based on the following criteria to be
10	determined by the CHED:
11	a. Qualified faculty with experience and/or training in distance education;
12	b. Relevant curricular programs;
13	c. Appropriate educational materials;
14	d. Suitable student support services and delivery system; and
15	e. Linkages with other appropriate institutions as study centers.
16	,
17	SEC. 9. Support to Students Any student enrolled under this Act shall be given access
18	to all privileges, opportunities and entitlements that a student similarly situated under the
19	traditional system may have access to, including but not necessarily limited to, availment of
20	scholarships, grants and loans from the government or government-administered funding
21	sources. Specifically, higher education institutions shall be tasked to perform the following
22	support services:
23	a. Maintain faculty-student dialogue in strategic sites and/or establish learning centers or
24	linkages with other HEIs to insure greater access to the clientele for admission, tutorial,
25	counseling, testing and evaluation activities;

b. Provide clear admission policies and procedures for applicants;

1	c. Provide for an efficient and reliable communication system and media support
2	including equipment and facilities;
3	d. Show evidence of regular monitoring of learners' progress; and
4	e. Provide liberty and learning resources for the students.
5	
	CEC 10 Data of the Commission on History Education (CHED). The CHED 1
6	SEC. 10. Role of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) The CHED has the
7	authority to identify the higher educational institutions which shall be allowed to offer open
8	learning/distance education programs and be given allocation for the continued implementation
9	of these programs. As such, it shall:
10	a. Promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of
11	the System;
12	b. Propose approaches to improve the quality of distance education in the country and
13	formulate a quality control mechanism for distance education in the country and formulate a
14	quality control mechanism for distance education;
15	c. Monitor and evaluate existing open learning programs;
16	d. Review and approve proposals for new open learning programs from educational
17	institutions; and
18	e. Recommend to the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) the budget for
19	open learning programs of qualified higher education institutions based on the CHED monitoring
20	and evaluation results.
21	
22	SEC. 11. Role of Broadcast Stations and Telecommunications Network Broadcast
23	stations and telecommunications networks are encouraged to provide assistance and cooperation
24	in support of the open learning system or in the delivery of distance education, which may

include but not necessarily limited to, the transmission of materials for formal and non-formal

courses to learners not only in the Philippines but also outside the country.

1	SEC. 12. Tax Incentives Private entities such as broadcast stations and
2	telecommunications networks and others which shall provide appropriate materials, time and
3	services to the system shall be given corresponding tax credits in accordance with existing rules
4	and regulations.
5	
6	SEC. 13. Appropriations.~ The amount necessary to carry out the initial implementation
7	of this Act shall be charged to the appropriations of the Commission on Higher Education under
8	the current General Appropriation Act. Thereafter, the funds necessary for the continuous
9	implementation of this Act in the ensuing years shall be included in the annual appropriations of
10	CHED in the General Appropriations Act.
11	
12	SEC. 14. Implementing Rules and Regulations The Commission on higher Education
13	(CHED), in consultation with relevant stakeholders in higher education, is hereby mandated to
14	formulate the rules and regulations to implement this Act within a period of ninety (90) days
15	from the effectivity thereof.
16	
17	SEC. 15. Separability Clause If any provision of this Act or any part thereof be
18	declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions, far as they are separable from the
19	invalid ones, shall remain in force and effect.
20	
21	SEC. 16. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations or parts
22	thereof specifically inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
23	
24	SEC. 17. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in
25	the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
