AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR RESEARCH ON POSTPARTUM SYNDROME

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act may be cited as the "Postpartum 1 2 Syndrome Research Act of 2008"

- SEC. 2. Definition of Terms. For the purposes of this Act, the term 4 "Postpartum Syndrome" shall refer to the complex combination of physical, 5 emotional, and behavioral changes that occur in a mother after giving birth, which 6 7 may be classified as postpartum blues, postpartum depression or postpartum psychosis. 8
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SEC. 3. Research on Postpartum Syndrome. -

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(A) In General - The Secretary of Health (hereinafter referred to as the 12 "Secretary"), acting through the Director of the National Center for Mental Health 13 (hereinafter referred to as the "Center"), shall expand and intensify research and 14 related activities of the Center with respect to postpartum syndromes. 15

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(B) Coordination With Other Centers and Other Health Care Professional 17 Organizations - The Director of the Center shall coordinate the activities under 18 subsection (A) with similar activities conducted by other national research 19 centers and agencies of the Department of Health and other health care 20 professional organizations to the extent that such centers, agencies and 21 organizations have responsibilities that are related to postpartum conditions. 22

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24 (C) Programs for Postpartum Conditions- In carrying out subsection (A), the Director of the Center, in coordination with health care professional 25 organizations, shall conduct or support research to expand the understanding of 26

1 the causes of, and to find a cure for, postpartum conditions. The activities shall include conducting and supporting the following: 2 3 1) basic research concerning the etiology and causes of the conditions; 4 2) epidemiological studies to address the frequency and natural history of 5 the conditions: 6 3) development of improved diagnostic techniques; 7 4) clinical research for the development and evaluation of new 8 treatments, including new biological agents; 9 5) information and education programs, such as, but not limited to, 10 promotion and prevention of postpartum syndrome, for health care 11 12 professionals and the public; and 6) implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the programs or activities 13 14 being conducted. 15 SEC. 4. Appropriations. - The amount necessary to carry out the 16 provisions of this Act shall be included in the budget of concerned government 17 agencies in the General Appropriations Act of the year following its enactment 18 19 into law and thereafter. 20 SEC. 5. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, executive orders, 21 administrative orders or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act 22 are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly. 23 24 SEC. 6. Separability Clause. - If any provision of this Act is held invalid or 25 unconstitutional, other provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full 26 force and effect. 27 28 SEC. 7. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days 29 following its complete publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) 30 newspapers of general circulation. 31 32 33 Approved, 34 35

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
