#### "RESOLUTION

CONCURRING IN THE RATIFICATION OF THE TREATY ON MUTUAL LEGAL ASSISTANCE IN CRIMINAL MATTERS BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES AND THE KINGDOM OF SPAIN"

WHEREAS, the Treaty on Mutual Legal Assistance in Criminal Matters Between the Republic of The Philippines and The Kingdom Of Spain was signed on 2 March 2004 in Manila;

**WHEREAS**, the Treaty seeks, among others, to improve the coordination and mutual legal assistance in criminal matters in general, in accordance with the Contracting Parties' national laws and regulations;

WHEREAS, under the Treaty, assistance shall be provided without regard as to whether the conduct, which is the subject of the investigation, prosecution, or proceeding in the Requesting State, would constitute an offense under the laws of the Requested State. However, when the assistance sought involves the execution of requests for searches and seizures or forfeiture of assets, restitution, and collection of fines, it shall be necessary that the conduct which is the subject of the investigation, prosecution, or proceeding in the Requesting State would constitute an offense under the laws of the Requested State;

WHEREAS, in a hearing conducted by the Committee on Foreign Relations on 8 May 2008, representatives of the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA), Department of Justice (DOJ), National Bureau of Investigation (NBI), Directory for Intelligence of the Philippine National Police (PNP); and the Integrated Bar of the Philippines (IBP) endorsed the concurrence in the ratification of the Treaty;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Constitution, Article 7, Section 21, "No treaty or international agreement shall be valid and effective unless concurred in by at least two-thirds of all the members of the Senate";

**NOW, THEREFORE,** be it resolved that the Senate of the Philippines concur as it hereby concurs in the ratification of the "Treaty On Mutual Legal Assistance In Criminal Matters Between The Republic Of The Philippines And The Kingdom of Spain".
