## Introduced by Senator JUAN MIGUEL F. ZUBIRI

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This bill seeks to convert the Mindanao Polytechnic State College in Cagayan de Oro City, Province of Misamis Oriental, into a State University, to be known as the Mindanao University of Science and Technology (MUST).

The main campus of the Mindanao University of Science and Technology shall be in Cagayan de Oro City and the satellite campuses of the Mindanao Polytechnic State College in Jasaan, Misamis Oriental, in Alubijid, Misamis Oriental, in Panaon, Misamis Oriental and in Oroquieta City, are hereby proposed to be integrated.

The proposed conversion of Mindanao Polytechnic State College into a State University is a timely recognition of its capability to be at par with other universities, especially in Mindanao. Its conversion will also address the demand for high level manpower in science and technology needed by the industries and businesses in Northern Mindanao as MUST is envisioned to provide such needed manpower and become instrumental in the progress and development of the region.

The MUST shall primarily provide advanced education, higher technological, professional instruction and training in the fields of arts and sciences, education, engineering and other relevant fields of study. It shall also undertake research and extension in support of the socio-economic development of Mindanao, and provide dynamic and progressive leadership in human resource development in critical skills and competencies required for global competitiveness.

Thus, approval of this bill is earnestly requested.

## Introduced by Senator JUAN MIGUEL F. ZUBIRI

## **AN ACT**

CONVERTING THE MINDANAO POLYTECHNIC STATE COLLEGE IN CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY, PROVINCE OF MISAMIS ORIENTAL INTO A STATE UNIVERSITY TO BE KNOWN AS THE MINDANAO UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (MUST), AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Conversion - The Mindanao Polytechnic State College in Cagayan de Oro City, Province of Misamis Oriental, is hereby converted into a state university, to be known as the Mindanao University of Science and Technology (MUST), integrating therewith the satellite campuses in Jasaan, Misamis Oriental, Alubijid, Misamis Oriental, Panaon, Misamis Occidental and Oroquita City, hereinafter referred to as the University. The main campus of the University shall be in Cagayan de Oro City.

**Section 2.** General Mandate - The University shall primarily provide advanced education, higher technological, professional instruction and training in the fields of arts and sciences, education, engineering and other relevant field of study. It shall also undertake research and extension in support of the socio-economic development of Mindanao, and provide progressive leadership in human resource development in critical skills and competencies required for global competitiveness.

**Section 3.** Curricular Offerings - The University shall offer undergraduate and graduate courses in the fields of arts and sciences, education, engineering, and technology and other degree courses within its areas of specialization and according to its capabilities, as the Board of Regents may deem necessary to carry out its objectives, in order to meet national and regional needs for trained manpower.

The existing high school shall be transferred to the jurisdiction and supervision of the Department of Education (DepEd): *Provided*, That the high school shall be allowed

to remain and operate within the campus of the University until the existing students shall have completed their high school education. *Provided further*, That the University may operate a reasonably sized laboratory school if it has a College of education.

**Section 4.** Administration - The University shall have the general powers of a corporation set forth in Batas Pambansa Blg. 68, as amended, otherwise known as the "Corporation Code of the Philippines." The administration of the University and the exercise of its corporate powers shall be vested exclusively in the Board of Regents and the president of the University.

**Section 5.** The Governing Board - The governing board of the University shall be the Board of Regents, hereinafter referred to as Board, which shall be composed of the following:

- (a) The chairperson of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), chairperson;
  - (b) The president of the University, vice chairperson;
- (c) The chairperson of the Committee on Education, Arts and Culture of the Senate, member:
  - (d) The chairperson of the Committee on Higher and Technical Education of the House of Representatives, member;
    - (e) The regional director of the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA), member;
    - (f) The regional director of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), member;
    - (g) The president of the federation of faculty associations of the University, member;
    - (h) The president of the federation of student councils of the University, member;
    - (i) The president of the federation of alumni associations of the University, member:
    - (j)Two (2) prominent citizens from the private sector who have distinguished themselves in their profession or fields of specialization of the University, member; and

The Board of Regents shall appoint the two prominent citizen from among a list of at least five (5) persons qualified in the Province of Misamis Oriental and City of Cagayan de Oro, as recommended by the search committee constituted by the University president, in consultation with the chairperson of CHED, based on the normal standards and qualification for the position.

The term of office of the president of the federation of faculty associations, the president of the federation of student councils, and the president of the federation of alumni associations shall be coterminous with their respective terms of office, as set forth in their Constitutions and By-Laws.

The two (2) prominent citizens shall serve for a term of two (2) years from the date of appointment.

**Section 6.** Promulgation and Implementation of Policies - The Board shall promulgate and implement policies in accordance with the declared state policies on education and other pertinent provisions of the Constitution, specifically in education, agriculture, science and technology, as well as the policies, standards and thrusts of the CHED under Republic Act No. 7722, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Act of 1994".

**Section 7.** Powers and Duties of the Board of Regents - The Board shall have the following specific powers and duties in addition to its general power of administration and the exercise of all the powers granted to the board of directors of a corporation under existing laws:

- (a) To promulgate rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purposes and functions of the University;
- (b) To receive and appropriate all sums as may be provided, for the support of the University, in order to carry out its purposes and functions;
  - (c) To import duty-free economic, technical and cultural books and/or publications, upon certification by the CHED that such imported books and/or publication are for economic, technical, vocational, scientific, philosophical, historical or cultural purposes, in accordance with the provisions of the Tariff and Customs Code, as amended;
  - (d) To receive in trust legacies, gifts and donations of real and personal properties of all kinds and to administer and dispose of the same when necessary for the benefit of the University, and subject to the limitation, directions and instructions of the donor, if any.

Such donations shall be exempt from the donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable deductions from the gross income in the computation of the income tax of the donor, in accordance with the provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code (NIRC), as amended: *Provided*, That such donations shall not be disposed of, transferred or sold;

(e) To fix the tuition fee and other necessary school charges, such as, but not limited to matriculation fees, graduation fees and laboratory fees, as the Board may deem proper to impose, after due consultations with the involved sectors.

Such fees and charges, including government subsidies and other income generated by the University, shall constitute special trust funds and shall be deposited in any authorized government depository bank, and all interests that shall accrue therefrom shall form part of the same funds for the use of the University.

Any provision of existing laws, rules and regulation to the contrary notwithstanding, any income generated by the University from tuition fees and other charges, as well as from the operation of auxiliary services and land grants, shall be retained by the University, and may be disbursed by the Board for instruction, research, extension or other programs/projects of the University: Provided, that all fiduciary fees shall be disbursed for the specific purposes for which they are collected.

If, for reasons beyond its control, the University shall not be able to pursue any project for which the funds have been appropriated and allocated under its approved program of expenditures, the Board may authorize the use of said funds for any reasonable purpose which, in its discretion, may be necessary and 63urgent for the attainment of the objectives and goals of the University.

- (f) To adopt and implement a socialized scheme of tuition and school fees for greater access to poor but deserving students;
- 26 (g) To authorize the construction or repair of its buildings, machinery, equipment and 27 other facilities, and the purchase and acquisition of real property, including 28 necessary supplies, materials and equipment;
  - (h) To appoint, upon recommendation of the president of the University, vice presidents, deans, directors, heads of campuses, faculty members, and other officials and employees of the University;
    - (i) To fix and adjust salaries of faculty members and administrative officials and employees, subject to the provisions of the revised Compensation and Position Classification System and other pertinent budget and compensation laws governing hours of service and such other duties and conditions as it may deem proper; to grant them, at its discretion, leaves of absence under such regulations at it may promulgate, any provision of existing law to the contrary notwithstanding; and to remove them for cause on accordance with the requirements of due process of law;

- (j) To approve the curricula, instructional programs and rules of discipline drawn by the
   Administrative and academic Councils herein provided;
- 3 (k) To set policies on admission and graduation of students;
- (I) To award honorary degrees upon persons in recognition of their outstanding contribution in the fields of education, public service, arts, science and technology, agriculture or in any field of specialization within the academic competence of the University; and to authorize the awarding of certificates of completion of non-degree and non-traditional courses;
- 9 (m) To establish and absorb non-chartered tertiary institutions within the Provinces of
  10 Misamis Oriental and Misamis Occidental as branches and centers in coordination
  11 with the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), and in consultation with the
  12 Department of Budget and Management (DBM), and to offer therein programs of
  13 courses, to promote and carry out equal access to education opportunities as
  14 mandated by the Constitution;
- 15 (n) To establish research and extension centers of the University where such will promote the development of the latter;
- 17 (o) To establish chairs in the University and to provide fellowships for qualified faculty 18 members and scholarships to deserving students;
- (p) To delegate any of its powers and duties provided for hereinabove to the president
   and/or other officials of the University as it may deem appropriate, so as to expedite
   the administration of the affairs of the University;
- 22 (q) To authorize an external management audit of the University, to be financed by the 23 CHED, subject to COA rules and regulations; and to institute reforms, including 24 academic and structural changes, on the basis of the audit results and 25 recommendations;
- 26 (r) To collaborate with other governing boards of the state colleges and universities 27 within the Provinces of Misamis Oriental and Misamis Occidental of Region 10, 28 under the supervision of the CHED and in consultation with the DBM, and work 29 towards the restructuring of the University to become more efficient, relevant, 30 productive and competitive;
- 31 (s) To enter into joint ventures with business and industry for the profitable development 32 and management of the economic assets of the University, the proceeds from which 33 shall be used for the development and strengthening of the University;
- 34 (t) To develop consortia and other economic forms of linkages with local government 35 units, institutions and agencies, both public and private, local and foreign, in the 36 furtherance of the purpose and objectives of the University;
- 37 (u) To develop academic arrangements for institutional capability building with 38 appropriate institutions and agencies, public and private, local and foreign, and to

appoint experts/specialists as consultants, part time or visiting or exchange professor, scholars, or researchers, as the case may be;

- (v) To set up the adoption of modern and innovative modes of transmitting knowledge such as the use of information technology, the dual system, open learning, or distance education and community laboratory for the promotion of greater access to education:
- 7 (w) To establish policy guidelines and procedures for participative decision-making and transparency within the University;
  - (x) To privatize, where most advantageous to the University, management of non-academic services such as health, food, building or grounds or property maintenance and such other similar activities; and
    - (y) To extend the term of the president of the University beyond the age of retirement but not later that the age of seventy (70), whose performance has been unanimously rated by the governing board as outstanding based on the guidelines, qualifications and/or standards set by the Board, after unanimous recommendation by the search committee.

**Section 8.** *Meetings of the Board* - The Board shall regularly convene at least once every quarter. However, the chairperson of the Board may, upon three (3) days prior written notice, call special meetings whenever necessary.

A quorum of the Board shall consist of majority of all its members holding office at the time of the meeting: *Provided*, That the chairperson of the Board or the president of the University is among those present in the meeting.

In the absence of the chairperson of the CHED, a commissioner of the CHED, duly designated by him/her, shall represent him/her in the meeting with all the rights and responsibilities of a regular member: *Provided, however*, That during the meeting, the president of the University as vice-chairperson shall be the presiding officer: *Provided, further,* That this *proviso* notwithstanding, the chairperson of the CHED is hereby authorized to designate a CHED commissioner as the regular chair of the Board of Regents, in which case said CHED commissioner shall act as the presiding officer.

In case the chairpersons of the Congressional Committees in Education shall not be able to attend the Board meeting, they may duly designate their respective representatives to attend the said meeting, who shall have the same rights and responsibilities as a regular member of the Board.

The members of the Board shall not receive any salary but shall be entitled to reimbursements for actual and necessary expenses incurred, either for their attendance in the meetings of the Board or in connection with other official business authorized by resolution of the Board, subject to existing laws and regulations.

**Section 9.** The University President - The University shall be headed by a president, who shall render full time service. He/She shall be appointed by the Board, subject to the guidelines, qualifications and/or standards set by the Board, upon recommendation of a duly constituted search committee. He/she shall have a term of four (4) years and shall be eligible for reappointment for another term: Provided, That in order to effect a smooth transition to a state university, the incumbent president of the Mindanao Polytechnic State College shall serve as the first president of the University.

In case of vacancy in the office of the president by reason of death, compulsory retirement, resignation, removal for cause or incapacity of the president to perform the functions of his/her office, the Board shall designate an officer-in-charge of the University within six months from date of vacancy, pending the appointment of a new president.

In case of vacancy in the office of the president as mentioned in the immediately preceding paragraph, his/her successor or the officer-in-charge shall hold office for the unexpired term only.

The powers and duties of the president of the University, in addition to those specifically provided in this Act shall be those usually pertaining to the office of the president of similar universities, and those delegated by the Board.

The salary of the president of the University shall be in accordance with the Revised Compensation and Position Classification System and shall be comparable to that being received by the presidents of similar educational institutions.

Within six (6) months before the expiration of the term of office of the incumbent president of the University, the Board shall constitute the Search Committee for the Presidency (SCP).

The president of the University shall be assisted by vice-presidents, who shall be appointed by the board upon recommendation of the president.

**Section 10.** The Administrative Council - There shall be an Administrative Council consisting of the president of the University as chairperson, vice-presidents, deans, directors, and other officials of equal rank as members, whose duty is to review and recommend to the Board the policies governing the administration, management and development of the University.

**Section 11.** The Academic Council - There shall be an Academic Council with the president of the University as chairperson and all members of the academic staff with the rank of not lower than assistant professor as members.

The Academic Council shall have the power to review and recommend the curricular offerings and rules of the discipline of the University, subject to the approval of

the Board of Regents. It shall fix the requirements for the admission of students, as well as for their graduation and conferment of degrees, subject to review and/or approval of the Board of Regents through the president of the University. It shall have the disciplinary power over students of the University and shall formulate academic policies and rules and regulations on discipline, subject to the approval of the Board of Regents.

**Section 12**. The Secretary of the University - The Board shall appoint a secretary, who shall serve as such for both the Board and the University and shall keep all records and proceedings of the Board. He/She shall serve upon each member of the Board the appropriate notice of the Board's meetings.

**Section 13.** The Treasurer of the University - The Treasurer of the Photographic shall be the ex officio treasurer of the University.

**Section 14.** Faculty - No political beliefs, gender preference, cultural or community affiliation or ethnic origin, and religious opinion or affiliation shall be a matter of inquiry in the appointment of faculty members of the University: *Provided*, That said appointment shall be subject to the guidelines, qualifications and/or standards set by the Board. *Provided further*, That no member of the faculty shall teach for or against any particular church or religious sect.

**Section 15.** Scholarship Program/Admission - The University shall provide a scholarship program and other affirmative action programs to assist poor but deserving students who qualify for admission to the University.

No student shall be denied admission to the University by reason of sex, religion, cultural or community affiliation or ethnic origin.

**Section 16.** Academic Freedom and Institutional Autonomy - The University shall enjoy academic freedom and institutional autonomy, pursuant to paragraph 2, Section 5 of Article XIV of the Constitution.

Section 17. Authority to Loan or Transfer Apparatus/Equipment/Supplies and Detail of Personnel - The heads of the bureaus and offices of the national government are hereby authorized to loan or transfer, upon the request of the President of the University, such apparatus, equipment or supplies as may be needed by the University, and to detail employees for duty therein when, in the judgment of the head of bureau or office, such apparatus, equipment, supplies or services of such employees can be spared without serious detriment to public service.

The employees so detail shall perform such duties as required of them by the president of the University, and the time so employed shall be counted as part of their regular services.

**Section 18.** Assets, Liabilities and Personnel - All assets, fixed and movable, personnel and records of the Mindanao Polytechnic State College as well as liabilities or obligations, are hereby transferred to the University: *Provided, however*, That the positions, rights and security of tenure of faculty members and personnel therein employed under existing laws prior to the conversion into a University shall be respected.

All parcels of land belonging to the Government and occupied by the Mindanao Polytechnic State College in the main campus and satellite/external campuses, including the 292 hectares of land in Lourdes, Alubijid, Misamis Oriental awarded by the government to Mindanao Polytechnic State College through Presidential Proclamation No. 739, are hereby transferred and declared to be property of the Mindanao University of Science and Technology, and shall be titled under that name: *Provided*, that should the University cease to exist or be abolished or should such parcels of land aforementioned be no longer needed by the University, the same shall revert to the original owner/s.

**Section 19.** Appropriations - The amount necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be charged against the current year's appropriations of the Mindanao Polytechnic State College, except the sums needed to continue the operations of the existing high school. Thereafter, such sums as may be necessary for the continued operation and maintenance of the Mindanao University of Science and Technology shall Be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

Section 20. Development Plan, Management Audit, Organizations/ Administrative / Academic Structure - Within the period of one hundred twenty (120) days after the approval of this Act, the University shall accomplish the following:

- (a) Submit a five (5) year development plan, including its corresponding program budget to the CHED, for corresponding recommendation to DBM;
- (b) Undergo a management audit in cooperation with CHED; and
- (c) Accordingly set up its organizational, administrative as well as academic structure, including the appointment of the University key officials.
