EXPLANATORY NOTE

As technology increases, more and more people rely on Automated Teller Machines (ATMs) as a method for doing daily banking tasks. While many ATM's currently have braille labels indicating the functions of some buttons, most machines do not have any non-visual method for reading or relaying the sequence of messages that appear on the screen.

A law addressing this concern is not only prudent, but necessary, to ensure that all individuals have an equal opportunity to access these machines.

This bill provides the standards for our ATMs to make them more accessible to our visually impaired citizens.

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AUTOMATED TELLER MACHINES ACCESSIBLE TO THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED.
4 5 6 7	Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
8	SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act may be known as the "ATM Visually Impaired
9	Friendly Act".
10	SECTION. 2. Definitions.
11	a) BANKING INSTITUTION A network of commercial, savings, and
12	specialized banks that provide financial services, including accepting deposits and
13	providing loans and credit, money transmission and investment facilities.
14	b) VISUAL TRANSMISSION SYSTEM Shall mean the graphic
15	display of information by an automated teller machine.
16	c) AUDIO TRANSMISSION SYSTEM Shall mean a system that recites
17	with sonic clarity through a personal listening device substantially the same
18	information that is conveyed by a visual transmission system.
19	d) PERSONAL LISTENING DEVICE Shall mean earphones or other
20	similar receiver designed to transmit audio information to an individual, which
21	receiver is placed in the individual's ear or held up to the ear such that only that
22	individual can hear such audio information.
23	SECTION 3. Automated Teller Machine Requirements Every banking
24	institution shall maintain the following requirements with respect to each of the

1	automated teller machines within its dominion and control to provide equal access for all
2	individuals:
3	
4	a) Any automated teller machine installed on or after the effectivity date
5	of this Act shall transmit any message through both (i) a visual transmission
6	system, and (ii) an audio transmission system.
7	b) Any automated teller machine installed prior to the effective date of
8	this Act shall, whenever an upgrade or replacement of such automated teller
9	machine becomes necessary, be upgraded or replaced in such a manner so that
10	such automated teller machine shall transmit any message through both (i) a
11	visual transmission system, and (ii) an audio transmission system.
12	SECTION 4. Separability Clause If any provision or part thereof, is held
13	invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise
14	affected shall remain valid and subsisting.
15	SECTION 5. Repealing Clause Any law, presidential decree or issuance,
16	executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to,
17	or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended
18	accordingly.
19	SECTION 6. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
20	after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
