EXPLANATORY NOTE

Introduced by Senator Antonio "Sonny" F. Trillanes IV

The tourism industry has significantly contributed in our country's economic growth and development. The influx of millions of foreign travelers who wish to enjoy the natural beauty of our country contributed to the increase in tourist expenditure revenue which translates to profits for our tourism establishments such as hotels and resorts, and employment to thousands of Filipinos in the tourism industry. In 2007, the Secretary of Tourism, Sec. Durano, revealed that visitor revenue grew to an average of 20.1 percent over the last three years¹.

However, in order for us to sustain this growth and for us to encourage others who would want to explore the natural splendor of our country, we need to enhance the country's reputation as a tourist-friendly country. We must establish a thriving and responsible travel industry which provides quality services, not only to foreign travelers but to domestic travelers as well.

This bill seeks to ensure that travel agents only provide the highest quality service, one which is fair, effective, responsive and courteous by regulating their profession. The bill also seeks to protect the interest of both foreign and local travelers.

In view of the foregoing, immediate approval of this measure is earnestly sought.

AN ACT

DEFINING AND REGULATING THE TRAVEL AGENTS PROFESSION

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled.

1	Sectio	n 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "Travel Agents Act of
2	2008"

4	Sec. 2	. Declaration of Policy. It is the policy of the State to promote Philippine
5	tourism as a	n indispensable element of the national economy. Thus, the State shall
6	enhance the r	eputation of the country as a tourist-friendly country in Asia by protecting
7	the interests o	of the local and foreign travelers in the Philippines.
8		
9	Sec. 3	. Definition of Terms. – As used in this section, the term –
10	(1)	"Philippine Tourism Authority or PTA" pertains to the existing
11	implementati	on arm of the Department of Tourism.
12	(2)	"License" means a license granted under this Act.
13	(3)	"Licensee" means any person who holds a license granted to him or any
14	other person i	n its behalf.
15	(4)	"Secretary" pertains to the secretary of the Department of Tourism (DOT).

17	Sec. 4	. Application of This Act.
18	(1)	Nothing in this Act shall be construed as requiring any executor,

arrangement or under a deed of assignment, committee of the estate or person of a
 mentally ill person, or manager of the property of an incapable person, for the purpose of
 performing his functions, exercising his powers or carrying out his duties as such, to hold
 a license;

5 (2) Notwithstanding anything in subsection (1), it shall not be lawful for any 6 of the persons referred to in that subsection in whom is vested the management of the 7 business of any travel agent to carry on that business at any time after the expiration of 8 three (3) months from the date on which the management of that business was so vested, 9 unless that person holds a license;

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Sec. 5. Definition of the Functions of a Travel Agent. -

- 20 (1) Subject to this section, a person carries on the business of a travel agent if
 21 he 22 (a) sells tickets entitling an individual to travel, or otherwise arranges for a
 23 person a right of passage on any conveyance (not being a prescribed
- conveyance);
 sells to, or arranges or makes available for, a person rights of passage
 to, and hotel or other accommodation at, one or more places (being
 places within or outside the Philippines, or some of which are within
 and others of which are outside the Philippines);
 - (c) purchases for resale the right of passage on any conveyance (not being prescribed conveyance);

(d) carries out such activity as may be prescribed; or

32 (e) holds himself out as, or advertises that he is, willing to carry on any
33 activity referred to in paragraph (a), (b), (c) or (d).

1	(2) An individual does not carry on the business of a travel agent by reason
